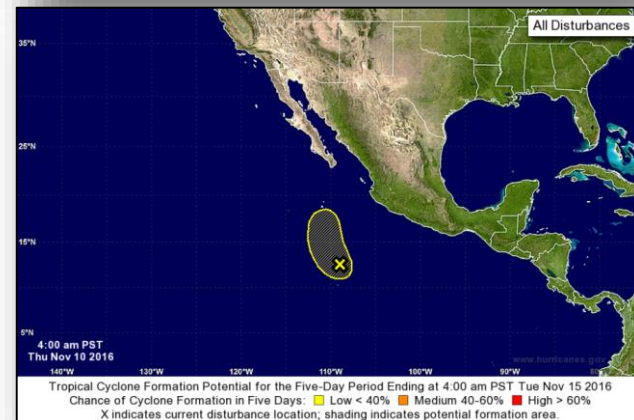
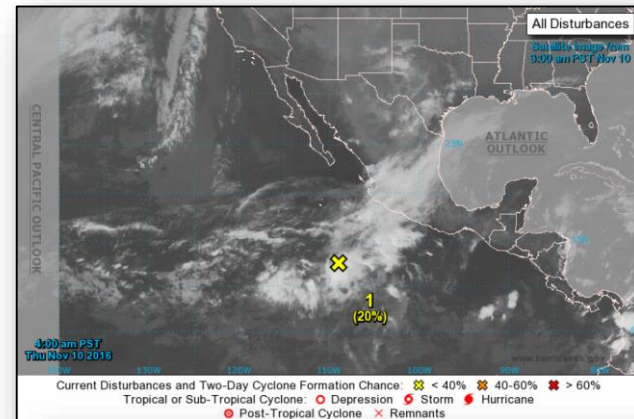

## Disturbance 1

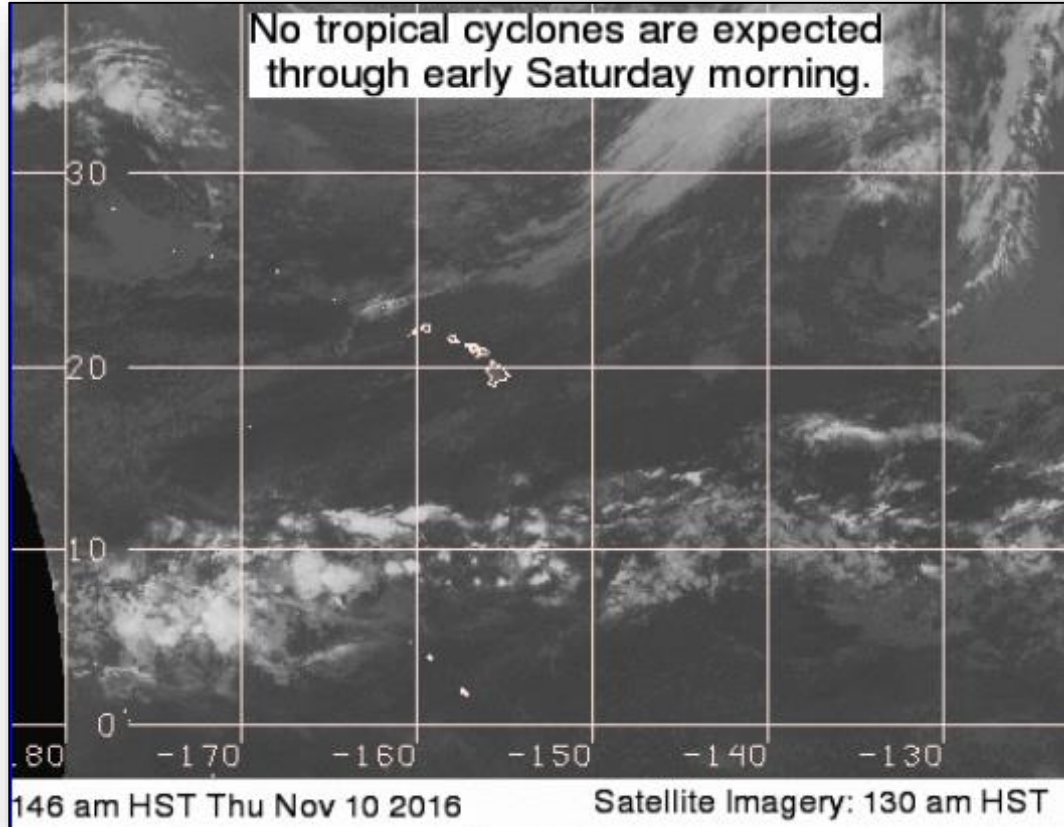
- Located 500 miles SSW of Manzanillo, Mexico

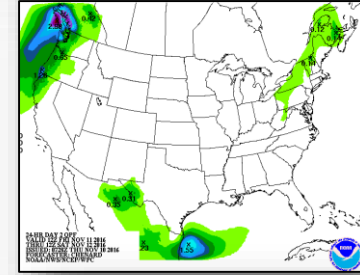
# Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3



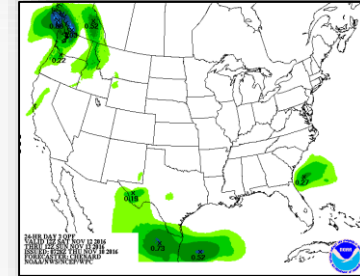

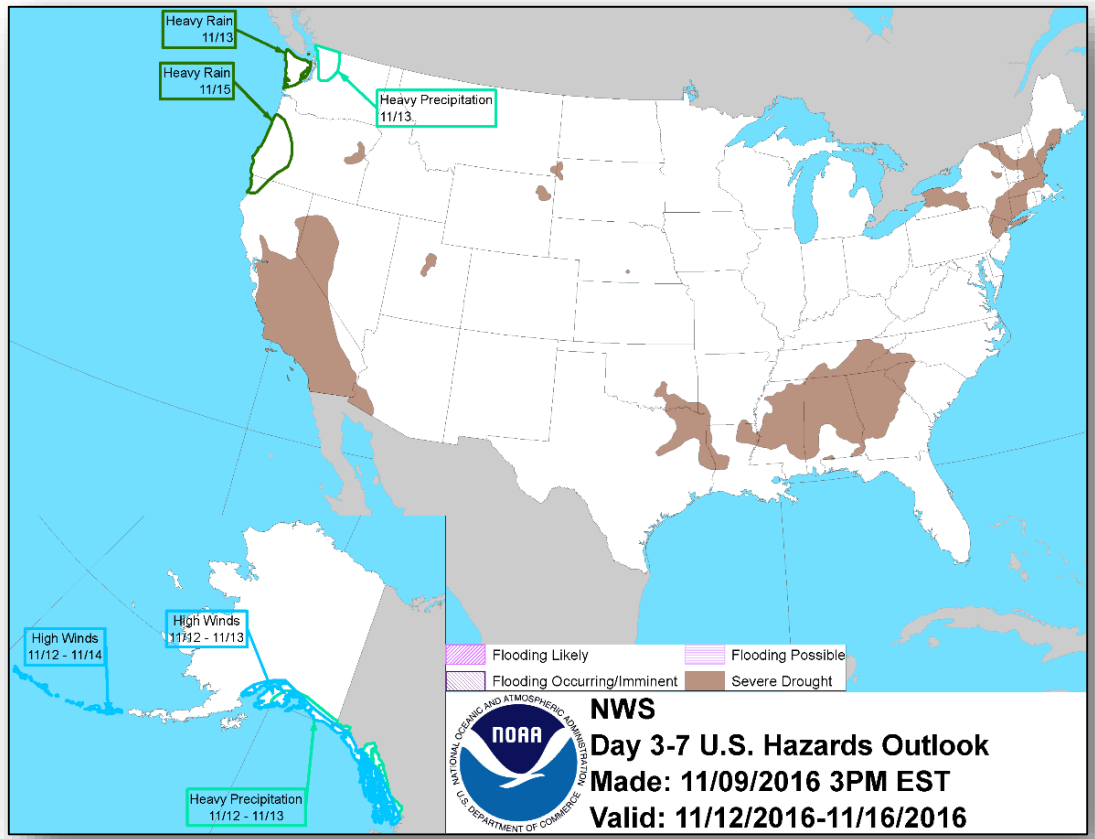

- Fire began November 5, 2016 and is burning on state and private land near Signal Mountain, TN (pop. 8,464), 15 miles north of Chattanooga, TN

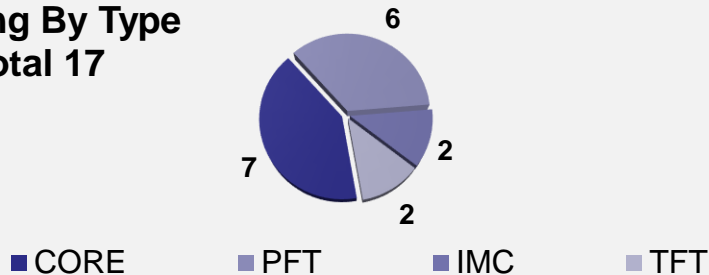

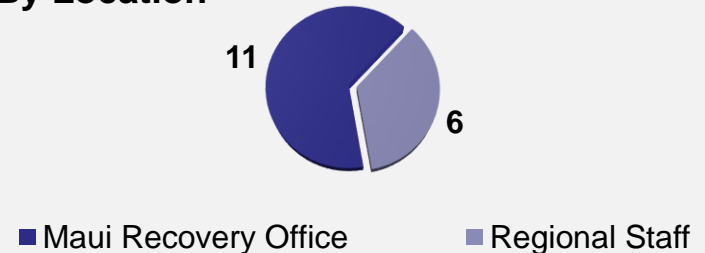
### Staffing By Program Area
