Significant Activity – Nov 15 -16



Significant Events:

Wildfires - North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia & Tennessee

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic Disturbance 1 (Invest 90L) Low (30%)
- Eastern Pacific Tropical cyclone activity not expected next 48 hours
- Central Pacific No tropical cyclones expected through early Friday morning
- Western Pacific No activity affecting U.S. territories

Significant Weather:

- Snow Northern Intermountain, Northern Rockies and Central Great Basin
- Heavy snow possible Northern and Central Rockies
- Rain and snow Northern Intermountain to Central Great Basin, Central Rockies and Northern Plains
- Rain southern CA; Great Lakes to Northeast; Central Appalachians
- Rain and thunderstorms Pacific Northwest to northern CA
- Red Flag Warnings CO, WY, KS, TX, OK, NM
- Critical/Elevated Fire Weather areas CA, NV, AZ, UT, NM, CO, WY, TX, OK & KS
- Space Weather Past 24 hours: none observed; next 24 hours: non predicted




Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (30%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (80%)









Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific






Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific








Fire Weather Outlook








Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3










Forecast Snowfall


