- Space Weather Past 24 hours none; next 24 hours none












#### Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3








#### Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3






#### Flash Flood Potential






#### Precipitation Forecast - Hawaii

  - o Evacuations lifted






#### Major Disaster Declaration Approved - PA

- FCO is Steven S. Ward




