Significant Events: None

Significant Weather:

- Freezing Rain Great Lakes, Central Appalachians, northern Mid-Atlantic, and Northeast
- Heavy Snow CA, OR, NV, CO, Great lakes, and Northeast
- Snow CA to the Central Plains, Upper Mississippi Valleys, Great Lakes, and Northeast
- Rain and Thunderstorms Southeast, Mid-Atlantic, and Northeast
- Rain and Snow Portions of CA, Great Lakes
- Space Weather Past 24 hours None; Next 24 hours Minor G1 likely

Tropical Activity Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

Declaration Activity: None

Severe Weather - Southeast

Situation:

- Severe weather with straight-line winds and tornadoes occurred Monday through early Tuesday across east TX and the central Gulf Coast States
- Preliminary reports of 13 tornadoes (MS 3; AL 3; and GA 7)

Impacts:

- 4 unconfirmed fatalities in Rehobeth, AL (FEMA Region IV, Local Media)
- Widespread reports of downed trees and power lines
- Numerous homes, businesses, and property damaged across TX, LA, MS and GA – further assessments will continue after sunrise
- Several road closures in MS due to flooding and debris
- Minimal power outages remain (peak outages 120k) (FEMA Region IV, DOE Eagle-I as of 3:00 a.m.)




FEMA Response:

- No requests for FEMA assistance








National Weather Forecast








Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3










Forecast Snowfall – Days 1-3












States with Currently Occupied Units
