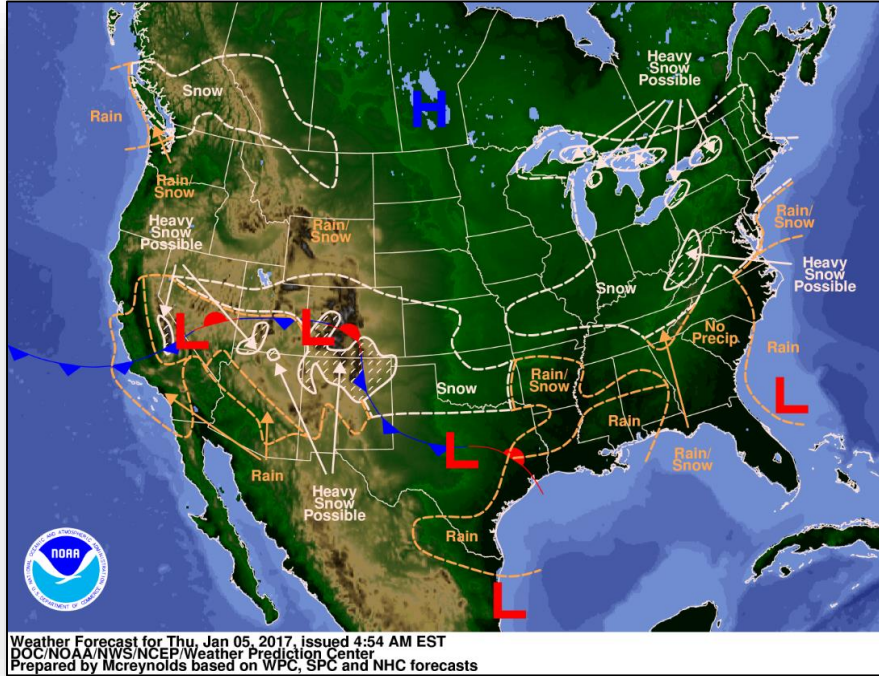
- Heavy Snow – Sierras, Central Great Plains, Central/Southern Rockies, Great Lakes, and Southern Appalachians

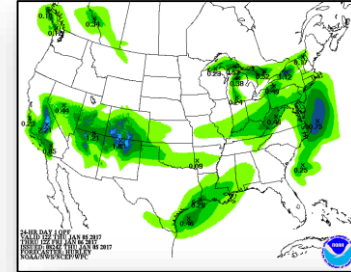
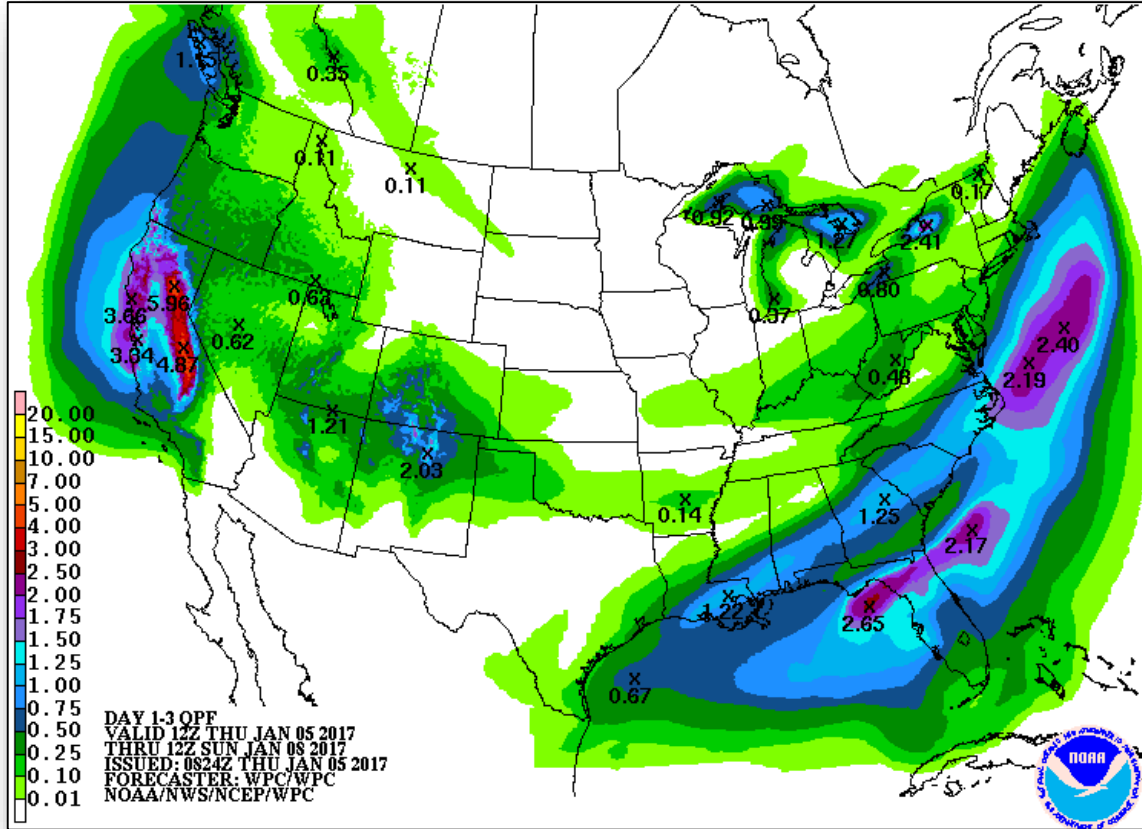
# Forecast Snowfall – Days 1-3



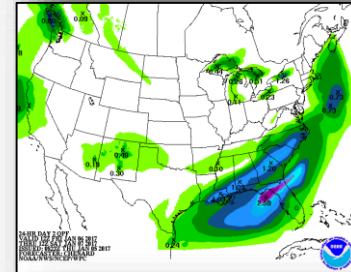
# Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3



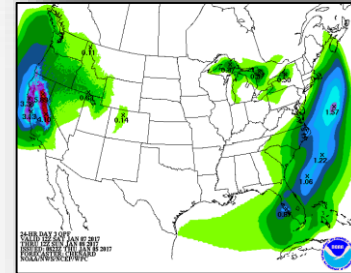

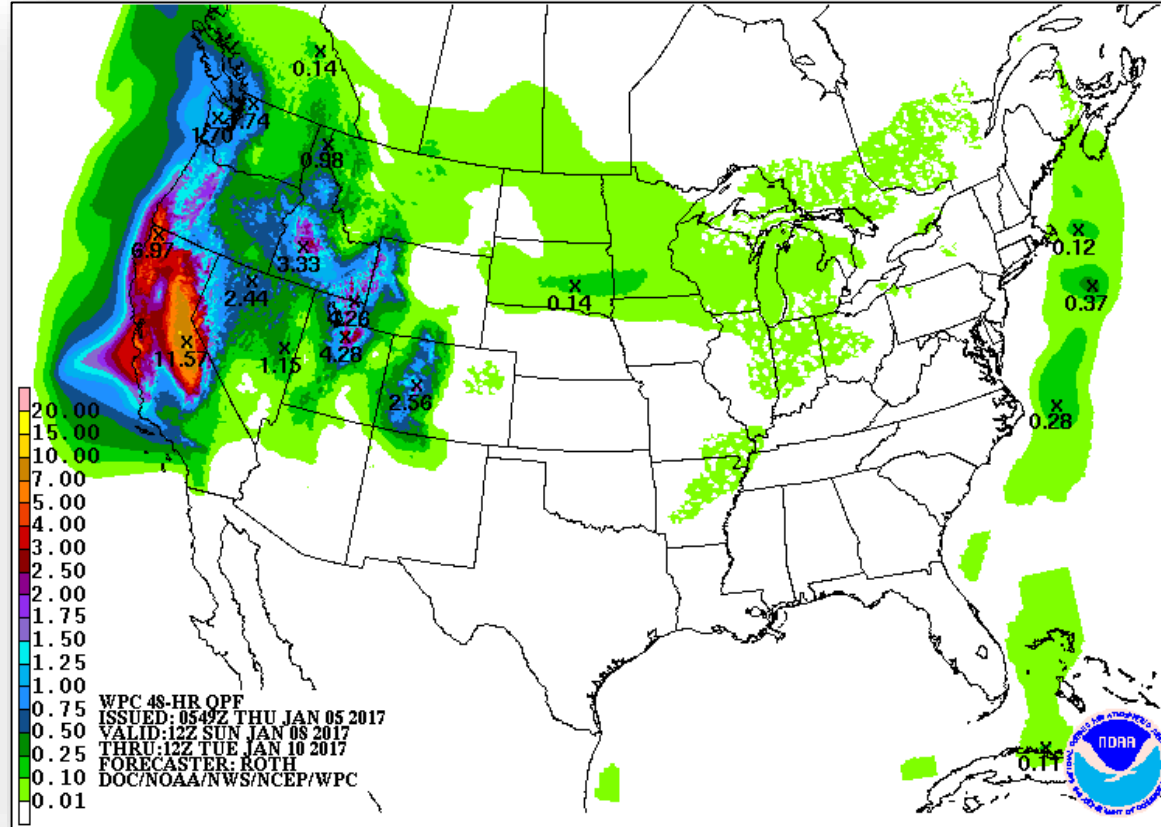

# Precipitation Forecast – Days 4-5



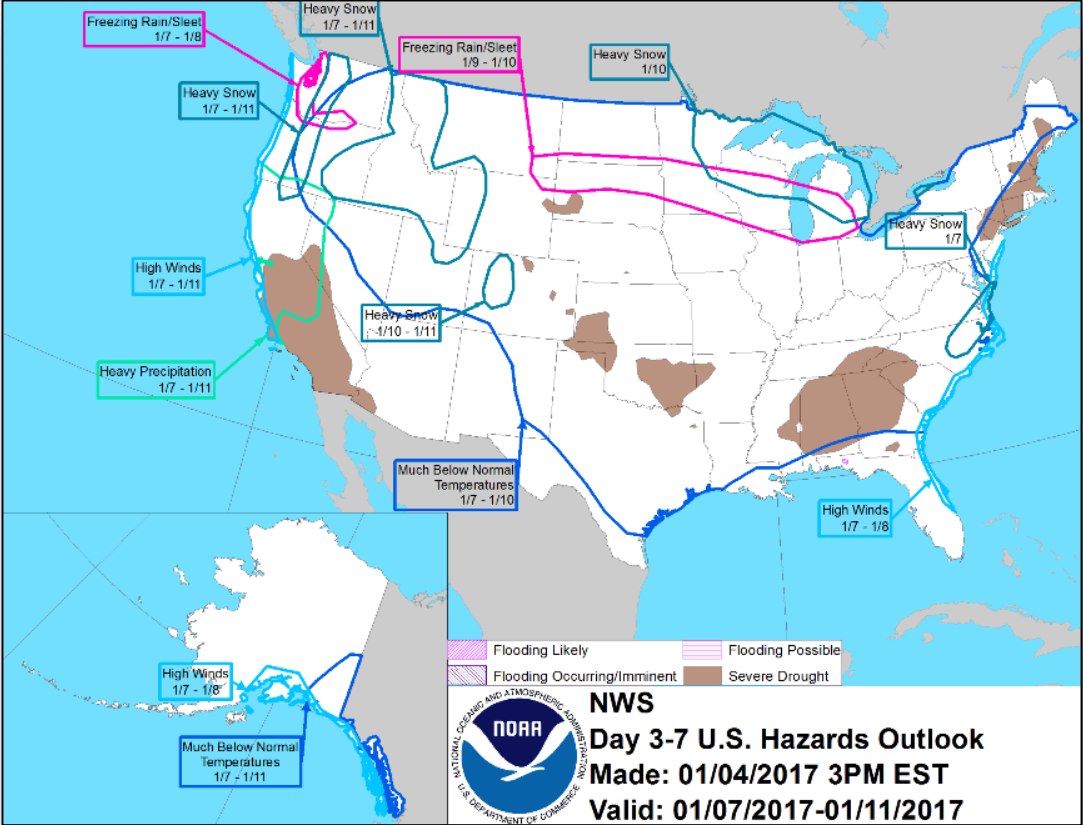

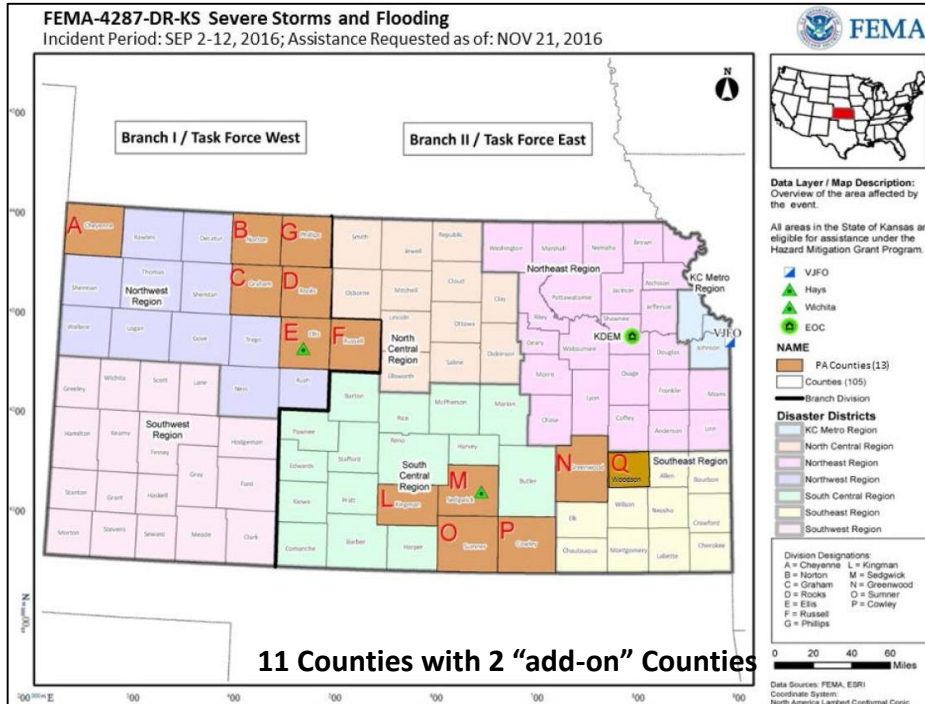

### Operations

- Virtual JFO established October 21, day after declaration.
- Conducted Joint KDEM and FEMA Public Assistance training 11/1-2/2016 prior to deploying teams.
- FEMA Public Assistance attended KDEM led Applicant Briefings to demonstrate unity of effort; this aided some impacted counties by holding Kick Off Meetings immediately afterwards.
- Two additional counties designated for Public Assistance in November; PDAs conducted expeditiously in collaborations with the State and local authorities.
- Outstanding support from Victoria Roth of OCC providing PDAT training on 12/06 in Wichita and 12/08 in Hays; added training on “How to Use Media Coverage to Support Public Assistance Projects” provided by Region VII External Affairs representative, Barb Sturner.
