Significant Activity – Jan 24-25



Significant Events: Severe Weather – Southeast

Significant Weather:

- Freezing rain possible Northeast
- Heavy snow possible WI and Great Lakes
- Red Flag Warnings / Critical Fire Weather Texas
- Space Weather Past 24 hours none; next 24 hours none

Tropical Activity Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

Major Disaster Declaration Request – Mississippi & Georgia

Severe Weather – Southeast (FINAL)



Current Situation:

The risk for organized severe weather has diminished across the Southeast

Impacts:

- Confirmed fatalities / Injuries: GA 15 / 200; MS 4 / 56; FL 1 / 0
- Shelters open / Occupants: GA 2 / 81; MS 1 / 52*
- Power outages are minimal**
- Preliminary reports indicate 999 homes damaged or destroyed in MS; majority of damages in cities of Hattiesburg & Petal
 - o 200 destroyed; 799 damaged (211 major, 187 minor, 401 affected)

State/Local Response:

- GA EOC at Full Activation; State of Emergency declared on Jan 22
- MS EOC at Partial Activation; State of Emergency declared on Jan 21
- Requests for Major Disaster Declaration (Expedited) for GA & MS
- Joint PDAs requested for GA & MS
- US&R Deployed: GSAR TF-2, 6 & 8 in GA; MS S&R operations concluded on Sunday, January 22

Federal Response:


- FEMA NWC at Watch/Steady State
- National IMAT West deployed to Region IV
- FEMA Region IV RWC at Enhanced Watch (day shift)
 - LNOs deployed to GA and MS EOCs
- MERS Thomasville will deploy to Hattiesburg, MS today



National Weather Forecast












Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3










Forecast Snowfall – Days 1-3






Fire Weather Outlook





- Precipitating event was Severe Storms, Tornadoes, Straight-Line Winds and Flooding January 20-21, 2017






Major Disaster Declaration Request – GA




Georgia
