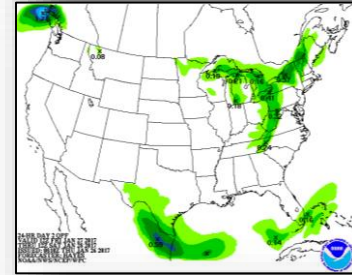
# Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3



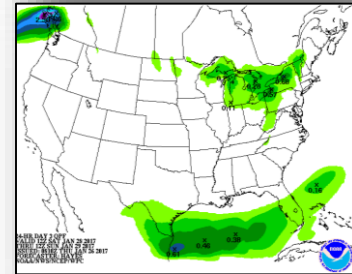

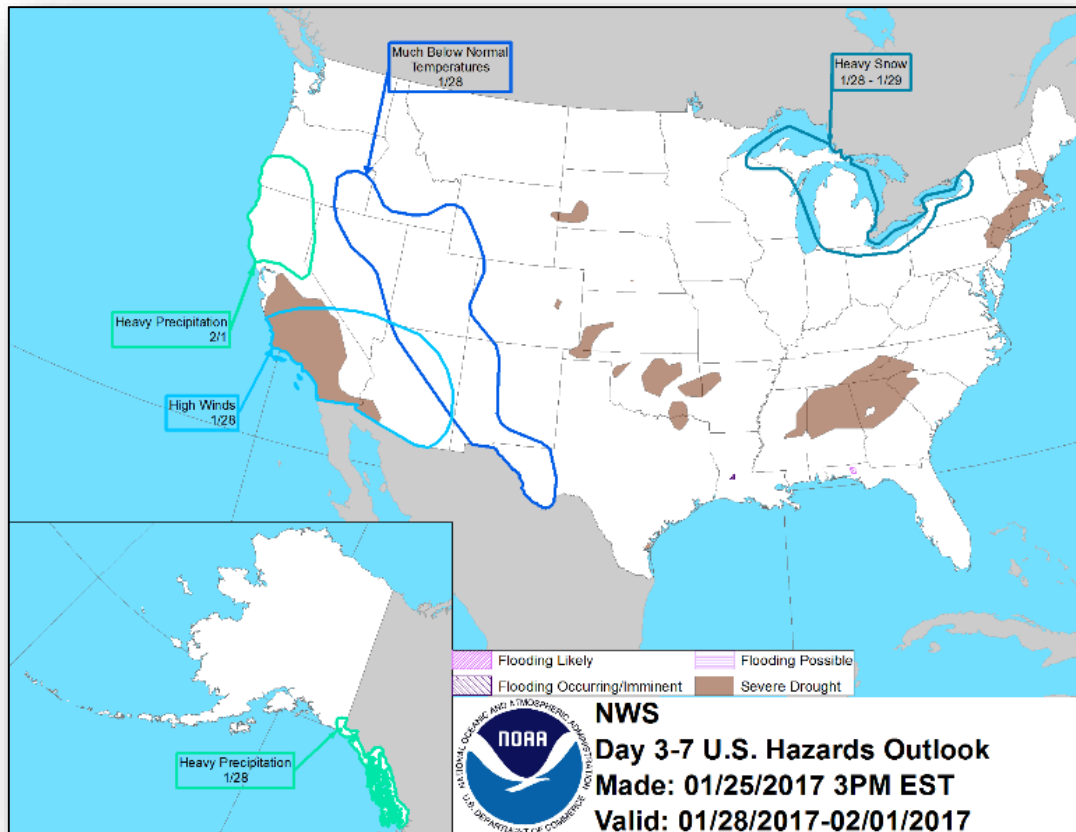

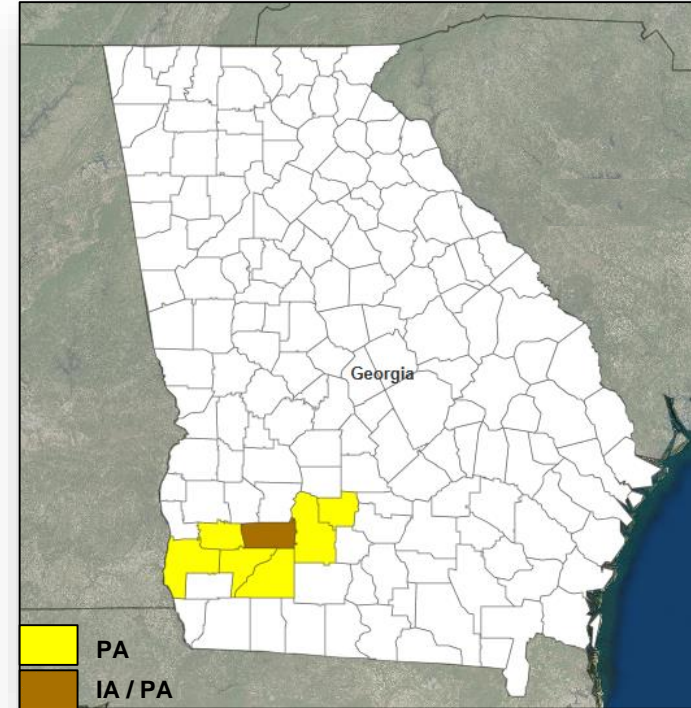

- FCO is Kevin L. Hannes

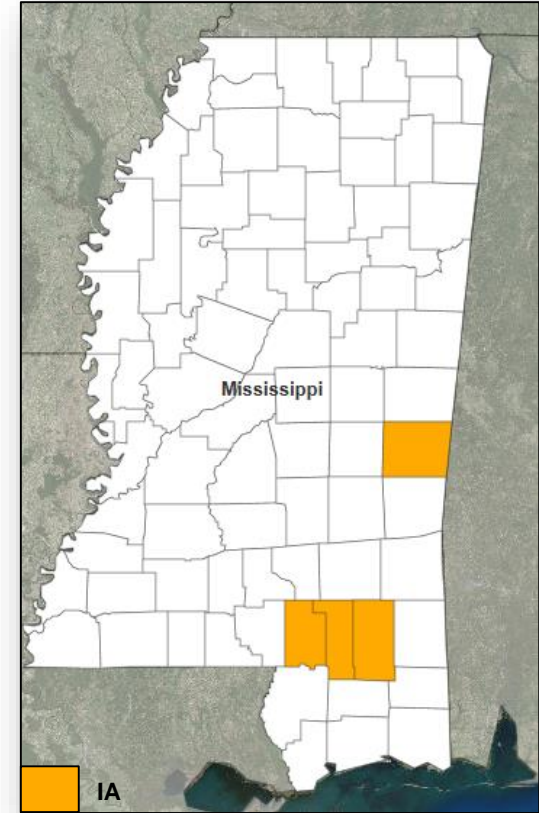

- FCO is Joe M. Girot

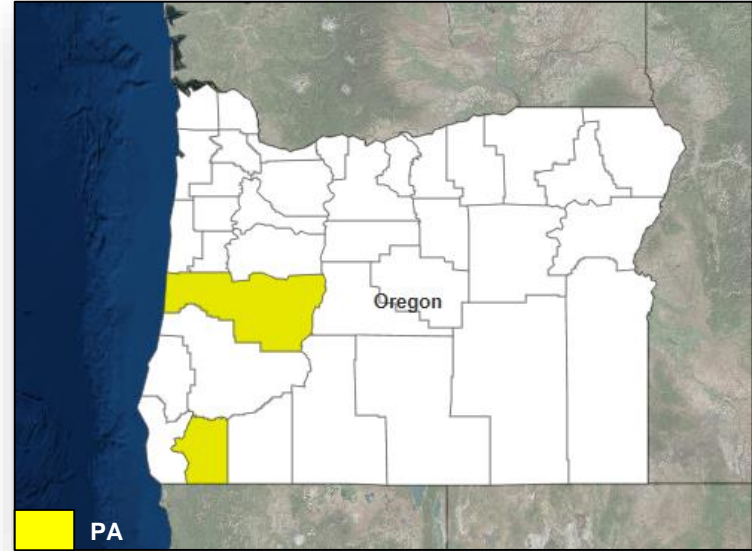

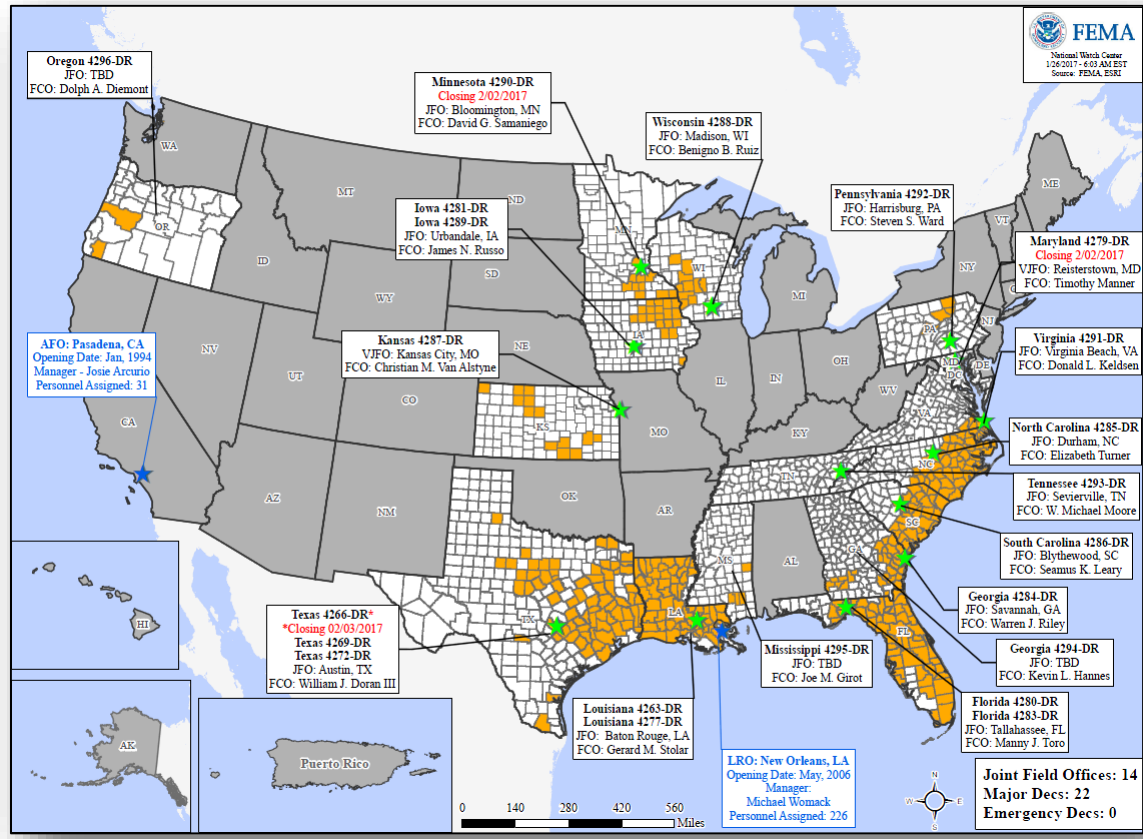

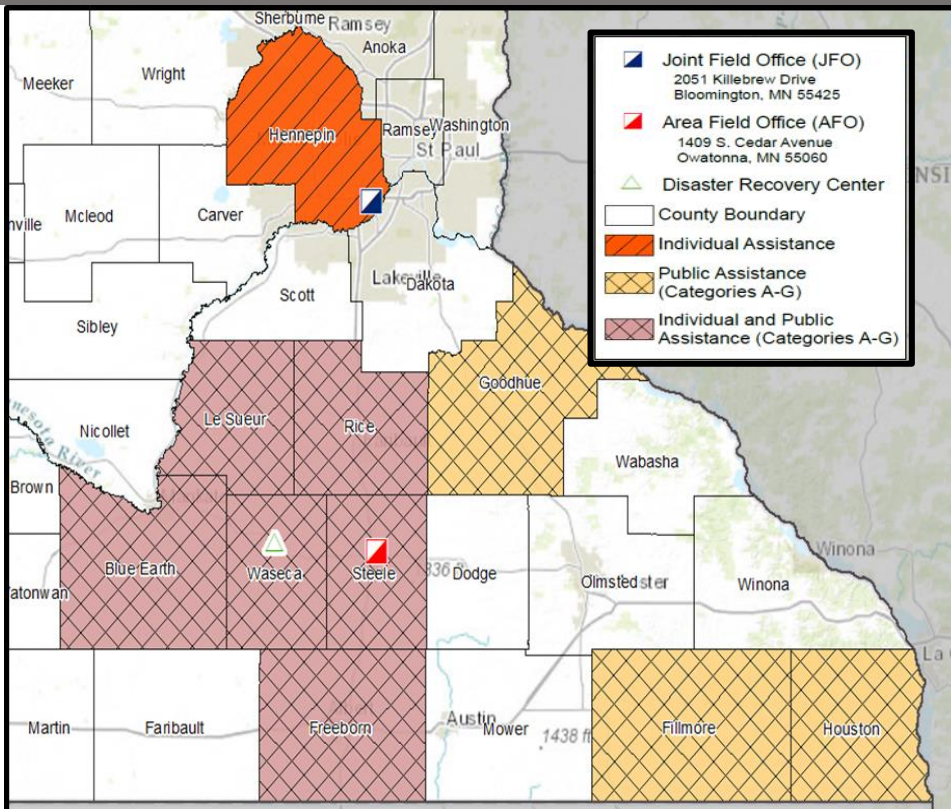

## Overview



FEMA-4290-DR-MN	
Date	Event
09/21-09/22 2016	Minnesota received more than 10 inches of rain with Waseca County receiving over 14 inches in a 24-hour period.
09/23-09/24 2016	The vast amount of water in a short period of time overwhelmed roadways, storm drains, sanitary sewers, lift stations, wells and residential sump pumps. The water flowed into hundreds of homes, businesses and public facilities.
10/11-10/14 2016	Joint Preliminary Damage Assessments (PDAs) were conducted
11/02/2016	President approved a Major Disaster Declaration providing Public Assistance (PA), Categories A-G, for 9 counties and the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program statewide.
11/03/2016	Individual Assistance (IA) was denied for all 4 requested counties.
11/16/2016	Subsequent Preliminary Damage Assessments (PDAs) were conducted and the State submitted an appeal for IA for 7 counties.
11/29/2016	The State's appeal was approved providing IA for 7 counties

## Lines of Effort

- Encouraged registration for disaster aid with a robust messaging campaign
- Mobilized 35 Disaster Survivor Assistance specialists to affected neighborhoods and 75 Individual Assistance specialists to staff Disaster Recovery Centers and the Joint Field Office.
- Activated Disaster Recovery Centers in 6 designated counties; staff also included the Small Business Administration (SBA)
- Conducted face-to-face outreach to 3,886 survivors for on-the-spot registrations and application status updates

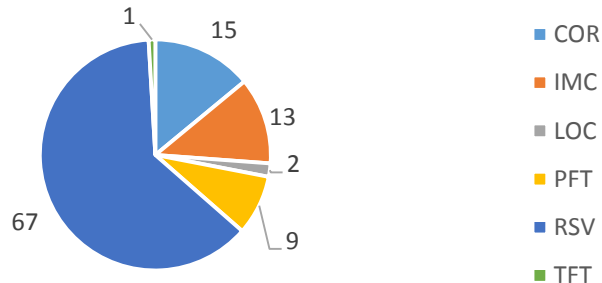
### Disaster Funds Allocated



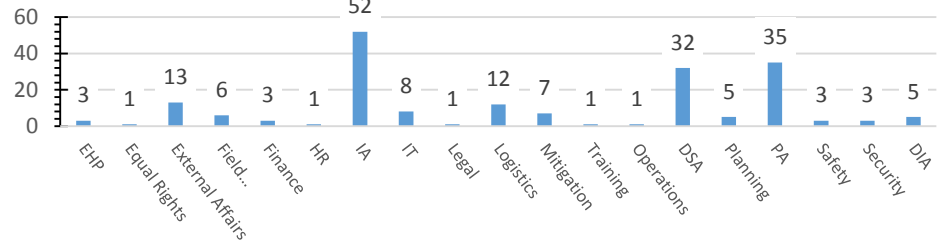
### Staffing Pattern

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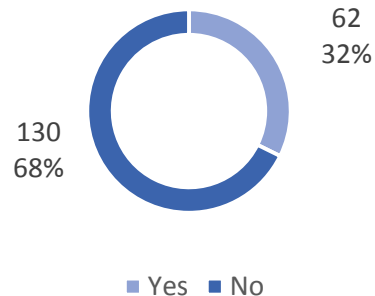
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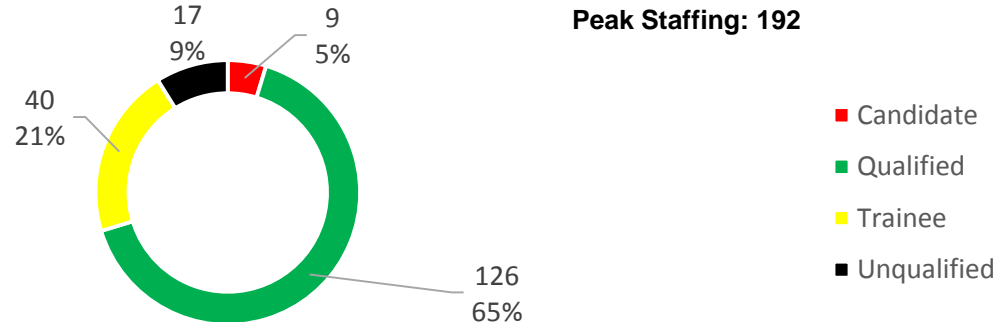

## Highlights

- Inspectors were deployed to the field within 24 hours of the declaration; the first inspection was completed on 12/01/2016
- The first survivor check was dispersed one day after the 11/29/2016 disaster declaration
- The average Housing Assistance award is \$3,804
- Call-out Program overturned 129 cases
- Staffing challenges
- The JFO will transition to a Processing Center on 02/02/2017
