








Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3








Forecast Snowfall – Days 1-3


- Encouraged registration for disaster aid with a robust messaging campaign
- Mobilized 35 Disaster Survivor Assistance specialists to affected neighborhoods and 75 Individual Assistance specialists to staff Disaster Recovery Centers and the Joint Field Office.
- Activated Disaster Recovery Centers in 6 designated counties; staff also included the Small Business Administration (SBA)
- Conducted face-to-face outreach to 3,886 survivors for on-the-spot registrations and application status updates





Highlights

- Inspectors were deployed to the field within 24 hours of the declaration; the first inspection was completed on 12/01/2016
- The first survivor check was dispersed one day after the 11/29/2016 disaster declaration
- The average Housing Assistance award is \$3,804
- Call-out Program overturned 129 cases
- Staffing challenges
- The JFO will transition to a Processing Center on 02/02/2017
