





Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3






Forecast Ice – Days 1-3





Hazards Outlook – Feb 4-8









- Major Disaster Declaration approved February 1, 2017 for the State of South Dakota, Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe and Oglala Sioux Tribe

FINANCE AND STAFFING (As of 1/31/2017)






