Significant Activity – Feb 13-14



Significant Events:

Oroville Dam Emergency Spillway Erosion – CA

Significant Weather:

- Freezing rain possible Northern Intermountain
- Severe thunderstorms possible Southern Plains to Lower Mississippi Valley
- Heavy snow Great Lakes
- Snow Upper Mississippi Valley to Northeast
- Rain and snow Southwest, Southern Plains, Tennessee Valley to Southern/Central Appalachians and Great Lakes
- Rain Pacific Northwest to northern CA and Northern Intermountain; Southern Plains to Mid-Atlantic
- Space Weather: No significant activity

Tropical Activity: No activity affecting U.S. interests

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

Oroville Dam Spillway Erosion – CA



Situation

Potential failure of the auxiliary spillway in the Oroville Dam has resulted in emergency evacuations downstream. Current water level as of 7am EST, 890.21 ft (-8.32 feet in last 24 hours)

Impacts

- Mandatory evacuations in effect for 190k residents: 39k in Butte County, 76k in Yuba County, and 65k in Sutter County
- Three tribes are in impacted area; at least 70 tribal members have been evacuated
- 20 shelters open with 3,680 occupants (ARC Midnight shelter count as of 5:25 am EST)
- No injuries or fatalities reported

State/Local Response

- · Emergency Declaration requested
- CA SEOC at Full Activation; Governor declared State of Emergency
- Three CA Task Force Swift Water Teams activated



- National IMAT-East 1 on alert
- FEMA NRCC at Level II, 24/7, with all LNOs and ESFs 3, 6, 7 & 8






National Weather Forecast








Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3






Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3











Western U.S. River Forecasts








Latest Observed: 8.85 Ft Crest: 9.92 Ft (Feb 13)


Forecast Snowfall – Days 1-3



 - Hazard Mitigation statewide






Declaration Request

 - Hazard Mitigation statewide








- Governor requested an Emergency Declaration on February 13, 2017






States with Currently Occupied Units


