Significant Events: Nor'easter Northeastern U.S. – March 13-15 - FINAL

- Freezing rain possible Upper Mississippi Valley to Great Lakes
- Snow Central Appalachians to Great Lakes and Northeast
- Rain and snow Northern Intermountain to Northern Plains; Upper Mississippi Valley to Ohio Valley and Great Lakes
- Rain and thunderstorms Southern Plains to Ohio Valley
- Rain Pacific Northwest; northern CA; Northern Plains
- Critical/Elevated Fire Weather NM, TX, Co, NE, KS & WY
- Red Flag Warnings CO, KS & NE
- Space Weather Past 24 hours: none; next 24 hours: none

Current Situation:

The surface low pressure system has moved into Canada

Impacts:

- Transportation:
 - Public transportation (rail and bus) are returning to normal but some systems are operating on a limited or modified schedule
 - Most airports are open but 51 flights cancelled and 114 flights delayed today (Flight Aware as of 6:45 am EDT)
- Power outages: Less than 8k customers without power across Regions I, II, & III



- No unmet needs or requests for FEMA assistance


Response:

 - NY State, NYC, & NJ EOCs returned to Normal Operations
- FEMA Region III RRCC not activated; RWC at Watch/Steady State
 - MD EOC returned to Normal Operations

National Weather Forecast








Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3










River Flood Forecasts - Idaho





Fire Weather Outlook





Hazards Outlook – March 18-22









