Tropical Activity: No activity affecting U.S. interests






Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3






Hazards Outlook – March 19-23






Three Month Outlook – April - June






Temperature Probability




Precipitation Probability

Drought Monitor and Seasonal Outlook








NOAA 2017 U.S. Spring Flood Outlook



Highlights:

- Northern ND has the greatest risk for major flooding this Spring – including the Souris, Devils Lake and northern reaches of Red River Basins
- Moderate flooding possible over southern ID in Snake River Basin
- Western U.S. Outlook
 - Still too early to determine final Spring flood potential due to snowmelt
 - Due to substantial snowpack, it is very likely that parts of the western U.S. will experience snowmelt flooding






