  - Next 24 hours: Minor – Geomagnetic storms reaching G1 level expected

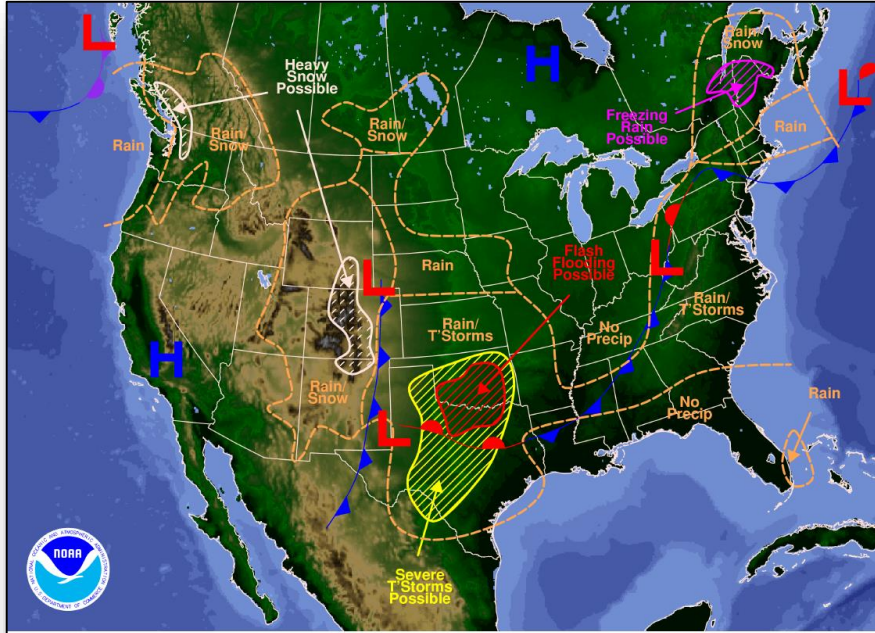

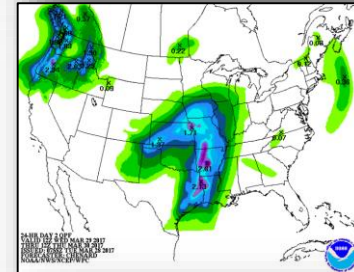




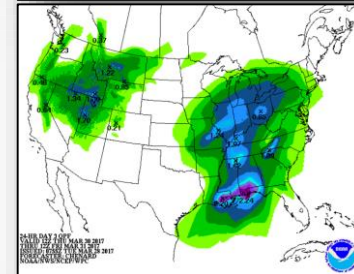
# Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3

- FCO is Rosalyn L. Cole



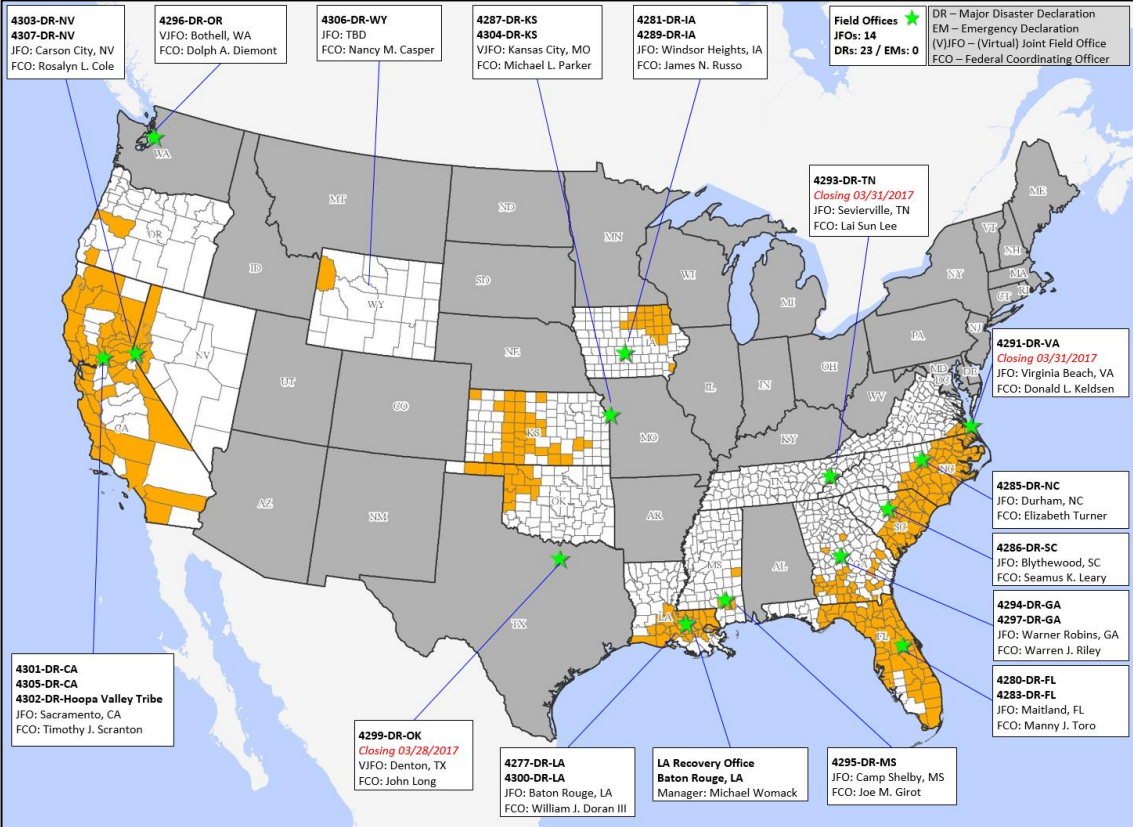

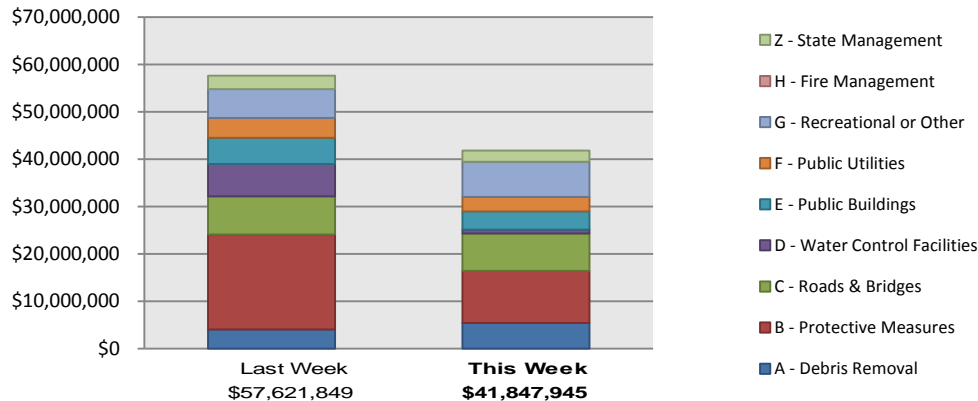

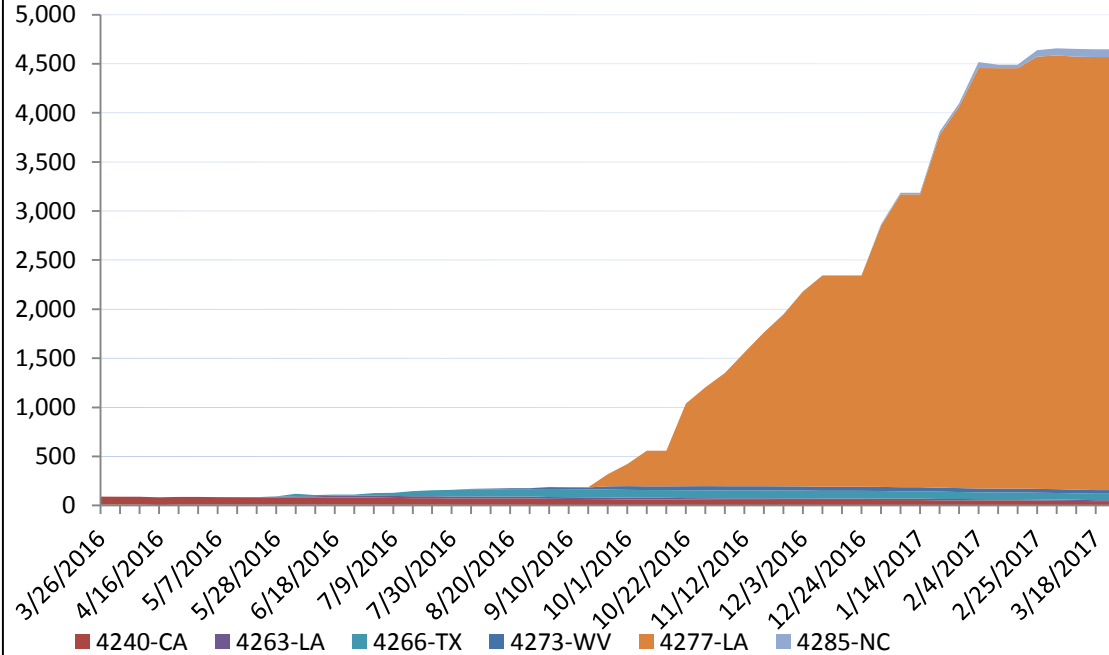

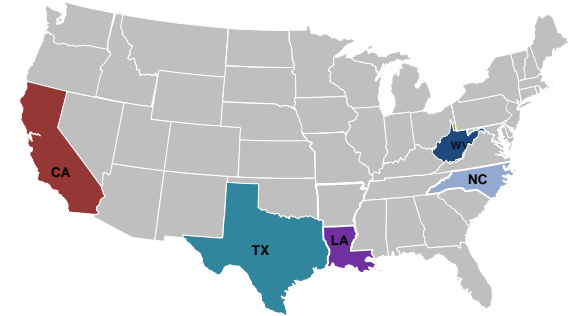

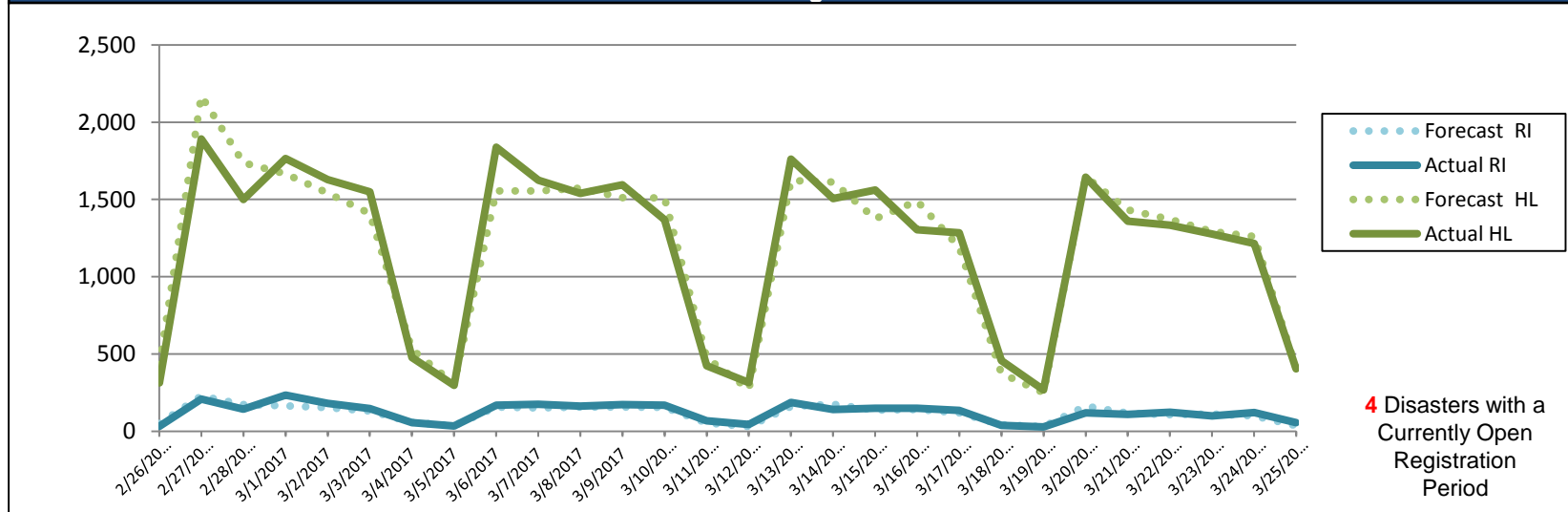
