### Significant Activity – Apr 4-5



**Significant Events:** Severe Weather – Southern Plains to Southeast

#### **Significant Weather:**

- Severe thunderstorms & Flash flooding possible Southeast to Ohio Valley and Mid-Atlantic
- Heavy snow possible MI
- Space Weather:
  - Past 24 hours: Minor Geomagnetic storms reaching G1 level occurred
  - Next 24 hours: None predicted

#### **Tropical Activity:**

Western Pacific - Invest 93P: High chance of development

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

#### **Declaration Activity:**

Major Disaster Declaration Request - Resighini Rancheria Tribe (CA)

### Monitoring



#### <u>Severe Weather – Middle Mississippi Valley (Missouri)</u>

Preliminary reports of 1 tornado, 25 wind, and 56 hail reports on Tuesday

#### Impacts:

City of Goodman (pop 1,233) in McDonald County, received moderate to substantial damage (elementary school, 2 fire stations, several homes damaged); 1 injury, no fatalities; unconfirmed tornado touchdown

- Neosho Airport in Neosho reported damage to roofs, outbuildings and planes
- \*4k customers without power in MO

#### Response

- MO EOC was at Monitoring but returned to Normal Operations
- Region VII RWC at Watch/Steady State; RRCC not activated
- No requests for FEMA assistance


- · AL EOC at Partial Activation; Governor declared a State of Emergency

#### Federal Preparations

- Region IV RWC at Enhanced Watch (24/7); RRCC not activated; LNO deployed to GA

- NWC at Watch / Steady State; Enhanced Watch rostered






### Severe Weather Outlook: Days 2-3









### Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3










### Significant River Flood Outlook





### Hazards Outlook – April 7-11








