


Severe Weather Outlook






Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3











Fire Weather Outlook





Hazards Outlook – May 15-19











Hurricane Preparedness Week – Saturday



Complete Your Written Plan

- The time to prepare for a hurricane is before the season begins, when you have the time and are not under pressure
- If you wait until a hurricane is on your doorstep, the odds are that you will be under duress and will make the wrong decisions; take the time now to write down your hurricane plan
- Know where you will ride out the storm and get your supplies now; you don't want to be standing in long lines when a
 hurricane warning is issued; those supplies that you need will probably be sold out by the time you reach the front of the line
- Being prepared, before a hurricane threatens, makes you resilient to the hurricane impacts of wind and water; it will make the difference between you being a hurricane victim and a hurricane survivor



 - Hazard Mitigation for entire state






Declaration Request


