 - Next 24 hours: Minor predicted; geomagnetic storms reaching G1 level likely



Severe Weather Outlook









Precipitation Forecast / Flash Flood Risk









Significant River Flood Outlook






Precipitation Forecast – Days 4-5






Fire Weather Outlook






