




Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3









Tornado Outlook: Day 1

Probability of one inch diameter hail or larger within 25 miles of a point







10% or greater probability of two inch diameter hail or larger

Precipitation Forecast / Flash Flood Risk







- Major Disaster Declaration was approved on May 26, 2017 for the state of Oklahoma
