Significant Activity – June 9-12



Significant Events: None

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic No tropical cyclone activity expected during the next 48 hours
- Eastern Pacific Tropical Depression Three-E
- · Central Pacific No tropical cyclones expected during the next 48 hours
- Western Pacific No activity affecting U.S. interests during the next 48 hours

Significant Weather:

- Severe thunderstorms and flash flooding possible Northern Rockies, Northern/Central Plains & Upper Mississippi Valley to the Great Lakes
- Critical/Elevated fire weather areas –Great Basin and Southwest into Southern/Central Rockies
- Red Flag Warnings AZ, NV, UT, CO, and NM
- Space Weather:
 - o Past 24 hours: Minor; geomagnetic storms reaching G1 level occurred
 - Next 24 hours: None predicted

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity



Current Situation

- Fire began June 7, 2017; burning in Cochise County, AZ, 55 miles southeast of Tucson
- Threatening 50 homes in the communities of Dragoon, Dragoon Ranches, Sunsites, Pearce, Cochise, Cochise Stronghold, Willcox, and Benzon, AZ (affected pop. 10,500)
- Mandatory evacuations in effect





Severe Weather Outlook – Day 1








Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3

Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




<u>Tropical Depression Three-E</u> (Advisory 3 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 60 miles S of Salina Cruz, Mexico
- Moving NW at 3 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Some strengthening expected; forecast to become tropical storm before landfall
- Tropical storm warnings in effect for Pacific coast of SE Mexico




Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific













6-10 Day Temperature Probability





6-10 Day Precipitation Probability


