### Significant Activity – June 22-23



**Significant Events:** Tropical Depression Cindy

#### **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic No tropical cyclones expected during the next 48 hours
- Eastern Pacific Disturbance 1: Medium (50%)
- Central Pacific No tropical cyclones expected during the next 48 hours
- Western Pacific No activity affecting U.S. interests during the next 48 hours

#### Significant Weather:

- Severe thunderstorms possible Tennessee and Ohio valleys to Southern/Central Appalachians
- Flash flooding possible Lower Mississippi Valley to Mid-Atlantic
- Rain and thunderstorms Southern/Central Plains to Northeast and Southeast
- Elevated Fire Weather: CA
- Red Flag Warnings: CA & OR
- Space Weather:
  - Past 24 hours: None observed
  - Next 24 hours: None predicted

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

**Declaration Activity:** Amendment No. 1 to FEMA-4313-DR-ID

### **Tropical Depression Cindy**

#### **Situation**

Tropical Depression Cindy is centered over the Lower Mississippi Valley and is expected to continue moving northeast over the next couple days

#### **Impacts**

- · No significant widespread damage or impacts reported
- 1 confirmed fatality in AL; 3 injuries in AL, 5 in MS
- Shelters: LA -1 shelter open with no occupants; MS 2 shelters open with 58 occupants; AL 1 shelter open with 7 occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Count)
- Minimal power outages


#### **State/Local Response**

- AL EOCs at Partial Activation; Governor declared states of emergency
- LA EOC at Monitoring; Governor declared state of emergency
- KY EOC at Monitoring; TX EOC returned to Normal Operations

#### **FEMA Response**

- · FEMA Headquarters
  - o NWC at Steady State; NRCC and Enhanced Watch rostered
  - o Food and water prepositioned at Camp Beauregard ISB; MERS providing support
- Region IV
  - RWC at Steady State; Enhanced Watch rostered
  - o Preliminary Damage Assessment Teams rostered
- Region VI
  - RRCC at Level III (day shift only)
  - o IMAT-2 deployed to LA EOC
  - LNOs demobilized from TX and LA EOCs








### Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

### Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




#### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located a few hundred miles SSW of Gulf of Tehuantepec
- Moving slowly WNW parallel to coast of Mexico
- · Conditions appear conducive for development
- Likely to become tropical depression by early next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (50%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%)




#### Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific






48 Hour Outlook




5 Day Outlook

#### National Weather Forecast








#### Precipitation Forecast / Flash Flood Risk









#### Significant River Flood Outlook






### Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3













