Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




Tropical Storm Dora (Advisory #2 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located about 165 miles SSW of Acapulco, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 12 mph, parallel to the coast of Mexico
- Maximum sustained Winds 40 mph
- Forecast to intensify over the next 48 hours
- No threat to US or US Territories



Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific











Precipitation Forecast / Flash Flood Risk











Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3









Fire Weather Outlook










6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability




