Significant Activity – June 26-27

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic Disturbance 1: Low (near 0%)
- Eastern Pacific Hurricane Dora, Disturbance 1: Low (near 0%)
- Central Pacific No tropical cyclones expected next 48 hours
- Western Pacific No activity affecting U.S. interests

Significant Weather:

- Severe thunderstorms possible Northern and Central Plains
- Elevated/Critical Fire Weather CA, NV, AZ, NM, UT, CO, WY, NE and SD
- Isolated dry thunderstorms UT, CO, WY, NE and SD
- Red Flag Warnings: CA, AZ, UT, and CO
- Space Weather Past 24 hours: none observed; next 24 hours: none predicted

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity



Disturbance 1 (As of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Tropical wave over Africa is forecast to emerge into the far eastern Atlantic Ocean on Wed
- Some development is possible later this week before conditions become unfavorable for development over the weekend
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)



Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



Hurricane Dora (Advisory #10 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 285 miles S of southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 12 mph
- This general motion expected today and Wed with turn W expected by Thu
- Maximum sustained winds 80 mph
- Weakening expected next couple of days
- Could become a remnant low by Thu
- No threat to U.S. or U.S. territories

Disturbance 1 (As of 8:00 a.m. EDT)


- Expected to form later this week a few hundred miles south of southern coast of Mexican

- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)






Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific






National Weather Forecast








Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3






Precipitation Forecast / Flash Flood Risk






Fire Weather Outlook








Hazards Outlook – June 29-July 3




