

National Weather Forecast








Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3










Precipitation Forecast / Flash Flood Risk








National Preparedness Level 3: Description: Two (2) or more Geographic Areas are experiencing wildland or prescribed fire activities requiring a major commitment of National Resources. Additional resources are being ordered and mobilized through NICC. Type 1 and 2 Incident Management Teams are committed in two (2) or more Geographic Areas and crew commitment nationally is at 50%.
