Significant Activity – June 30-July 3



Significant Events: None

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic Disturbance 1: High (70%)
- Eastern Pacific Disturbance 1: Medium (50%); Disturbance 2: Medium (60%)
- Central Pacific No tropical cyclones expected next 48 hours
- Western Pacific No activity affecting U.S. interests

Significant Weather:

- Severe thunderstorms possible for portions of the Central and Southern Plains
- Flash flooding possible for portions of Southern Plains, Lower Mississippi and Tennessee valleys
- Elevated Fire Weather for portions of MT
- Red Flag Warnings for portions of WA
- Space Weather Past 24 hours: None observed; Next 24 hours: Minor; geomagnetic storms reaching G1 level likely

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity



Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 650 miles WSW of the Cape Verde Islands
- Moving WNW 10 mph
- Environmental conditions conducive for development
- A tropical depression could form later this week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%)



Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



<u>Disturbance 1</u> (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 600 miles S of the southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Moving WNW away from the coast
- Gradual development possible during the next several days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (30%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Med (50%)


Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located SSW of the Gulf of Tehuantepec
- Moving W at 10 mph
- Conditions favorable for development later this week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Med (60%)



Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3









Precipitation Forecast / Flash Flood Risk
















6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability




