Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic Tropical Depression Four
- Eastern Pacific Disturbance 1: High (90%)
- Central Pacific No tropical cyclones expected next 48 hours
- Western Pacific No activity affecting U.S. interests

Significant Weather:

- Severe Thunderstorms possible from Ohio Valley to the Great Lakes
- Elevated Fire Weather conditions for portions of CA, OR, & WA; Isolated dry thunderstorms in CA, Great Basin and Intermountain region
- Red Flag Warnings for portions of OR, CA, NV, and UT
- Space Weather Past 24 hours: None; Next 24 hours: None


Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



<u>Tropical Depression Four</u> (Advisory #6, as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 835 miles E of the Lesser Antilles
- Maximum Sustained Winds 30 mph
- Moving WNW at 22 mph
- Little change in strength forecast during the next 24 hours
- Expected to degenerate to a Remnant Low by Saturday

Based on current warnings, there is no threat to the U.S.



Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 800 miles S of Baja California
- Moving WNW at 10 mph
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (90%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (90%)


48 Hour Outlook




5 Day Outlook




Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3






Precipitation Forecast / Flash Flood Risk











U.S. Drought Monitor











