Significant Events: None

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic – No tropical cyclones expected next 48 hours
- Eastern Pacific – Tropical Storm Eugene; Tropical Disturbance Six-E
- Central Pacific – No tropical cyclones expected next 48 hours
- Western Pacific – No activity affecting U.S. interests

Significant Weather:

- Severe Thunderstorms – Central Plains to Great Lakes
- Flash Flooding Possible – Central Plains, Upper/Middle Mississippi valleys, and Great Lakes
- Space Weather – Past 24 hours: none observed; Next 24 hours: none predicted

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

Declaration Activity: Major Disaster Declaration Request – Wyoming

Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



Tropical Storm Eugene (Advisory #19 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 505 miles SW Punta Eugenia, Mexico
- Expected to become a remnant low today
- Producing life-threatening surf and rip currents in southern California through tonight

Tropical Depression Six-E (Advisory #2 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 750 miles S of Baja California, Mexico
- Maximum sustained winds are 35 mph
- Strengthening during next 48 hours; projected to become a tropical storm today

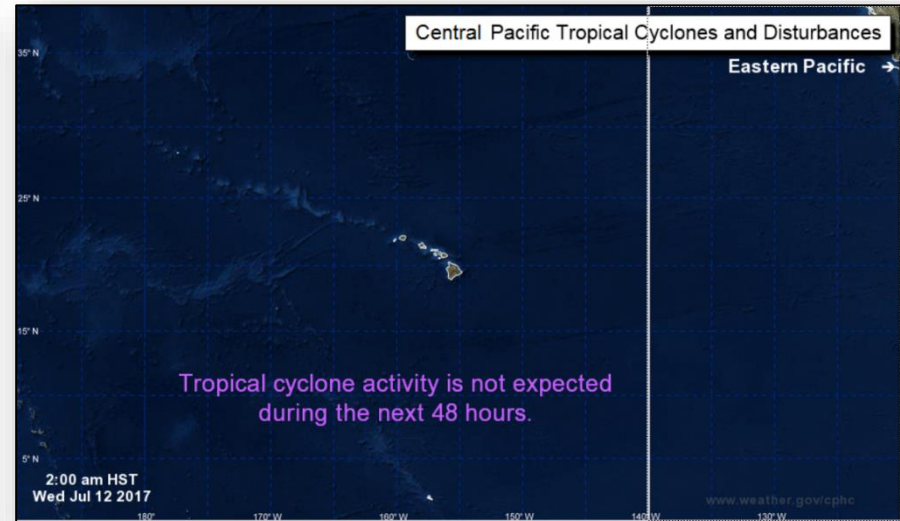
Based on current advisory, there is no threat to U.S. interests



Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific

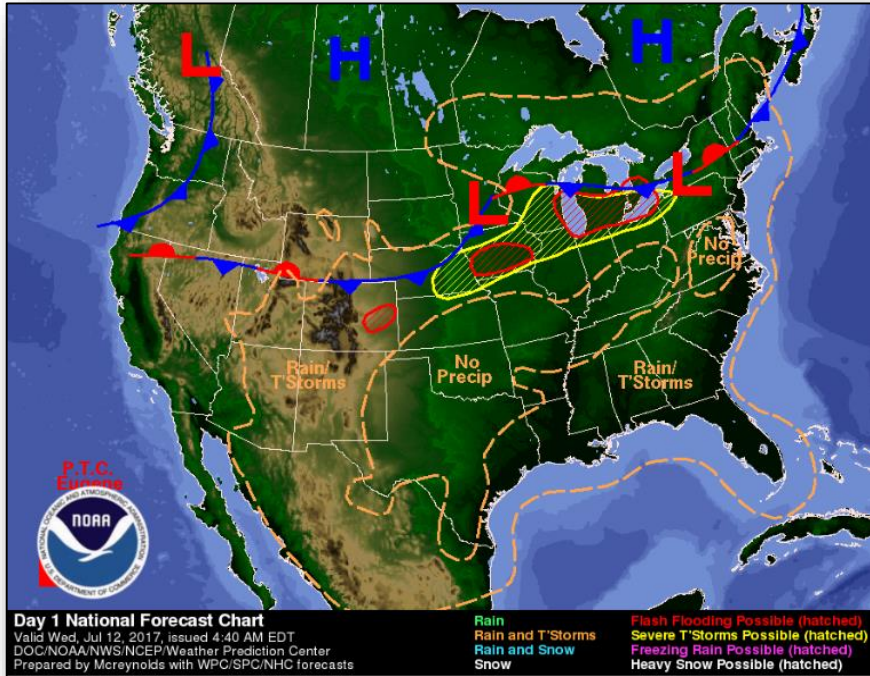


48 Hour Outlook

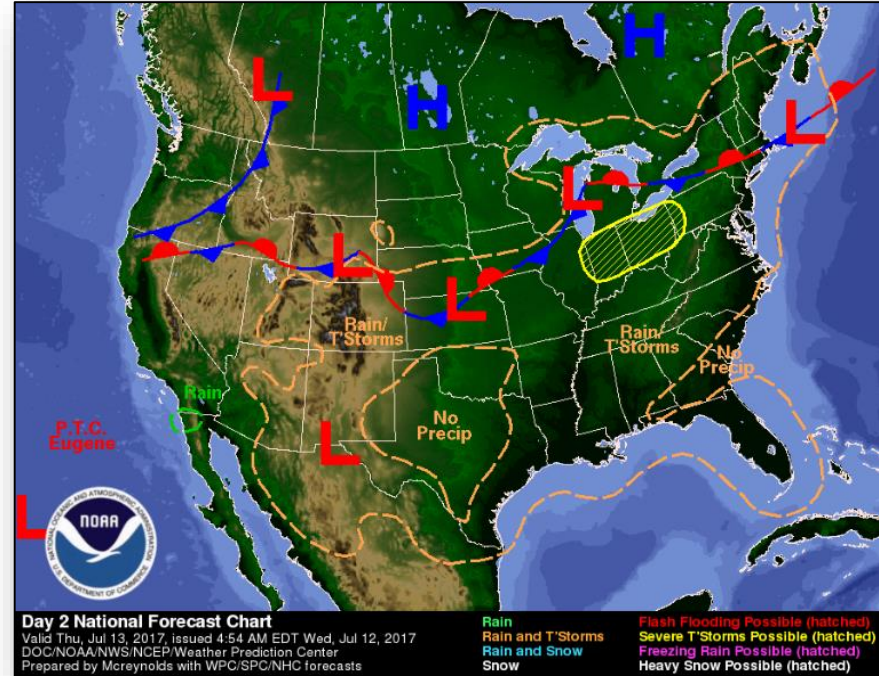

Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3



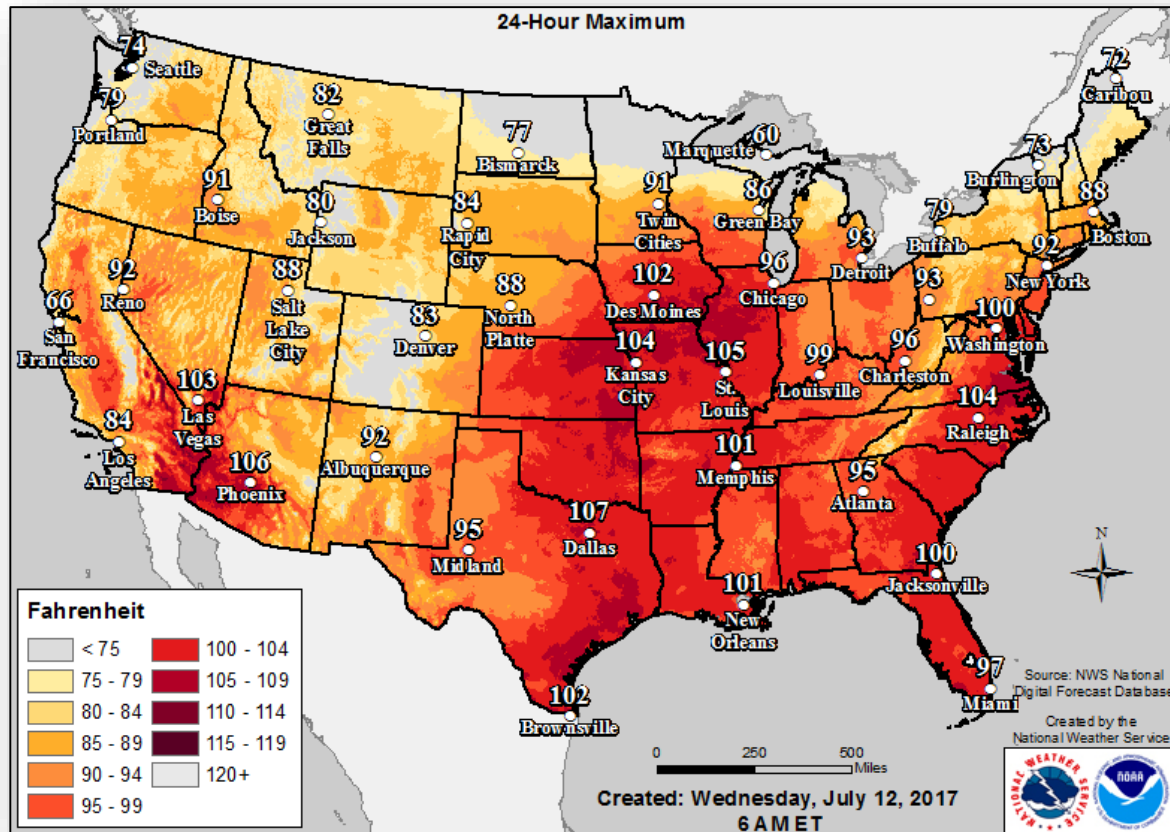
Precipitation Forecast / Flash Flood Risk



National Heat Index Forecast



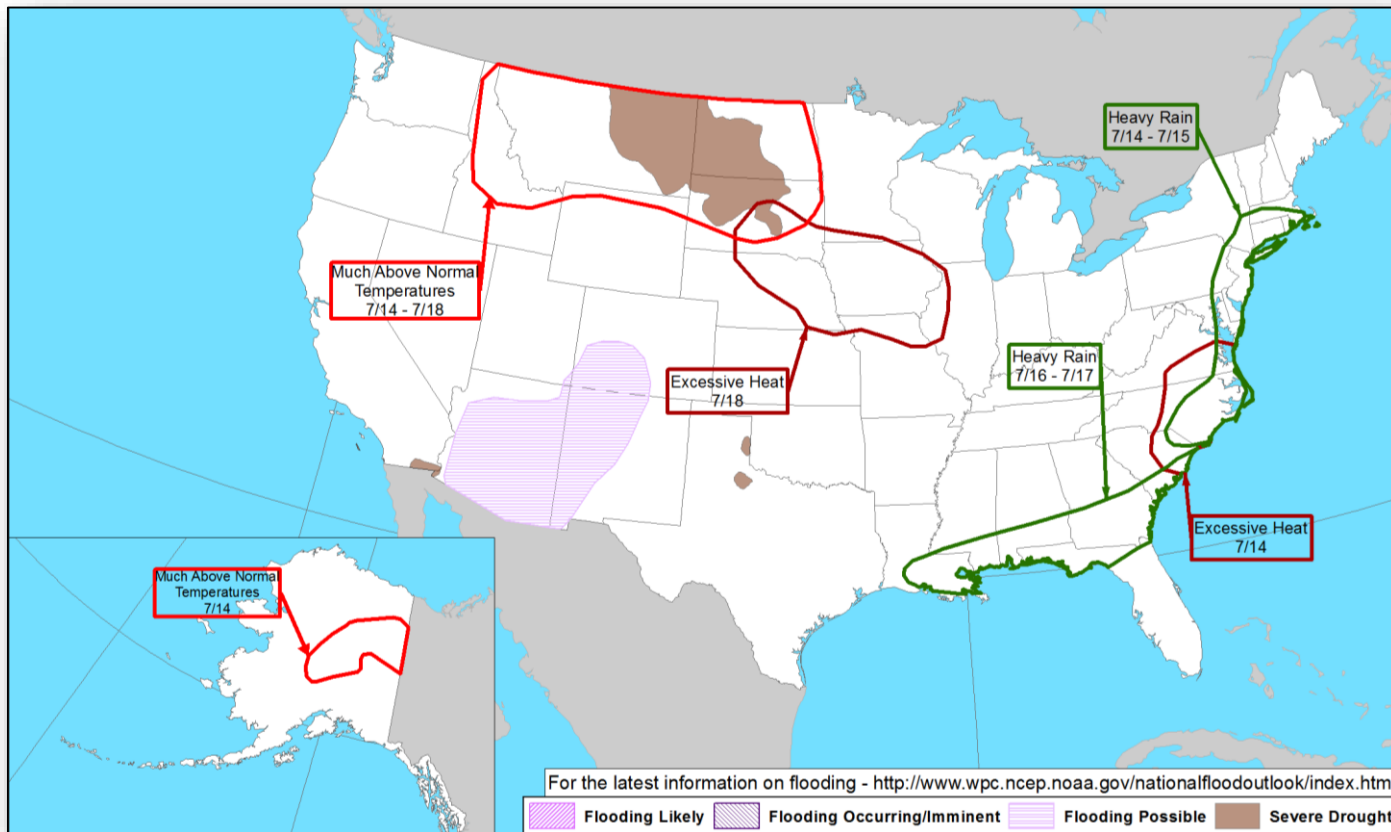

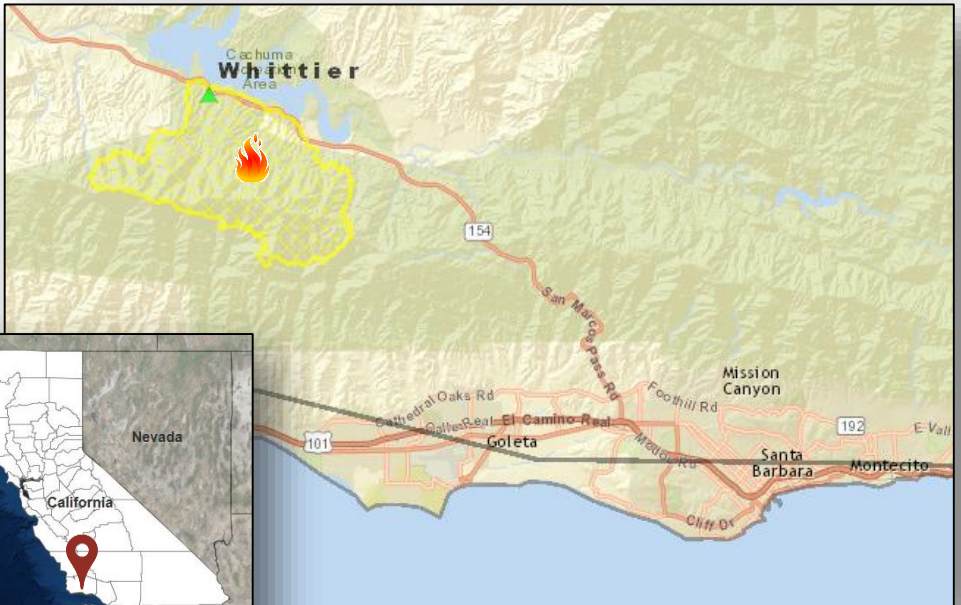

Current Situation

- Fire began July 8, 2017 and is burning 8.5 miles northwest of Santa Barbara (pop. 92k)
- 220kV transmission lines serving Santa Barbara are threatened; potential for rolling blackouts
- Mandatory evacuations: approximately 800 people
- 2 shelters open, 17 occupants (ARC Shelter Count as of 4:30 a.m. EDT)

- CA EOC at Normal Operations
- FEMA Region IX RWC at Steady State
- No request for FEMA assistance

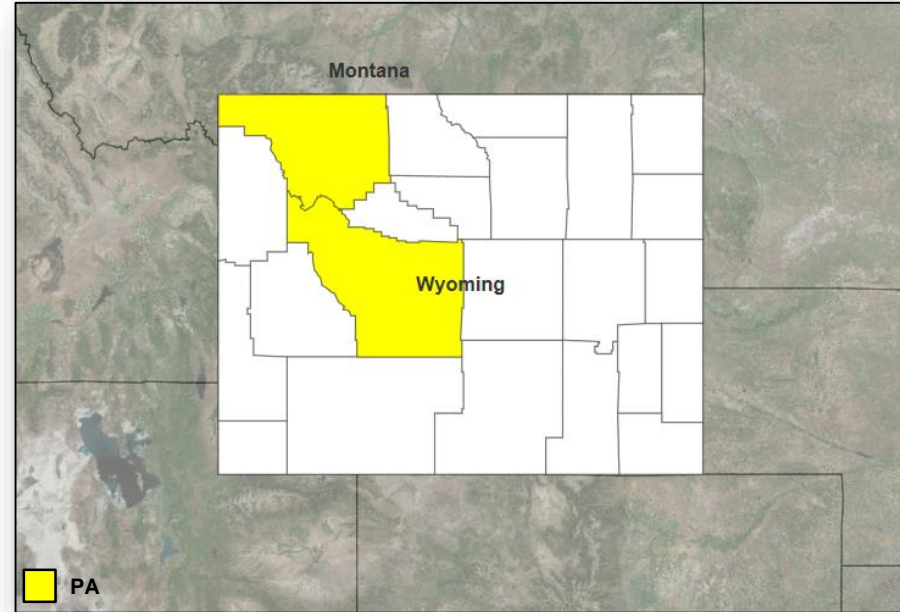

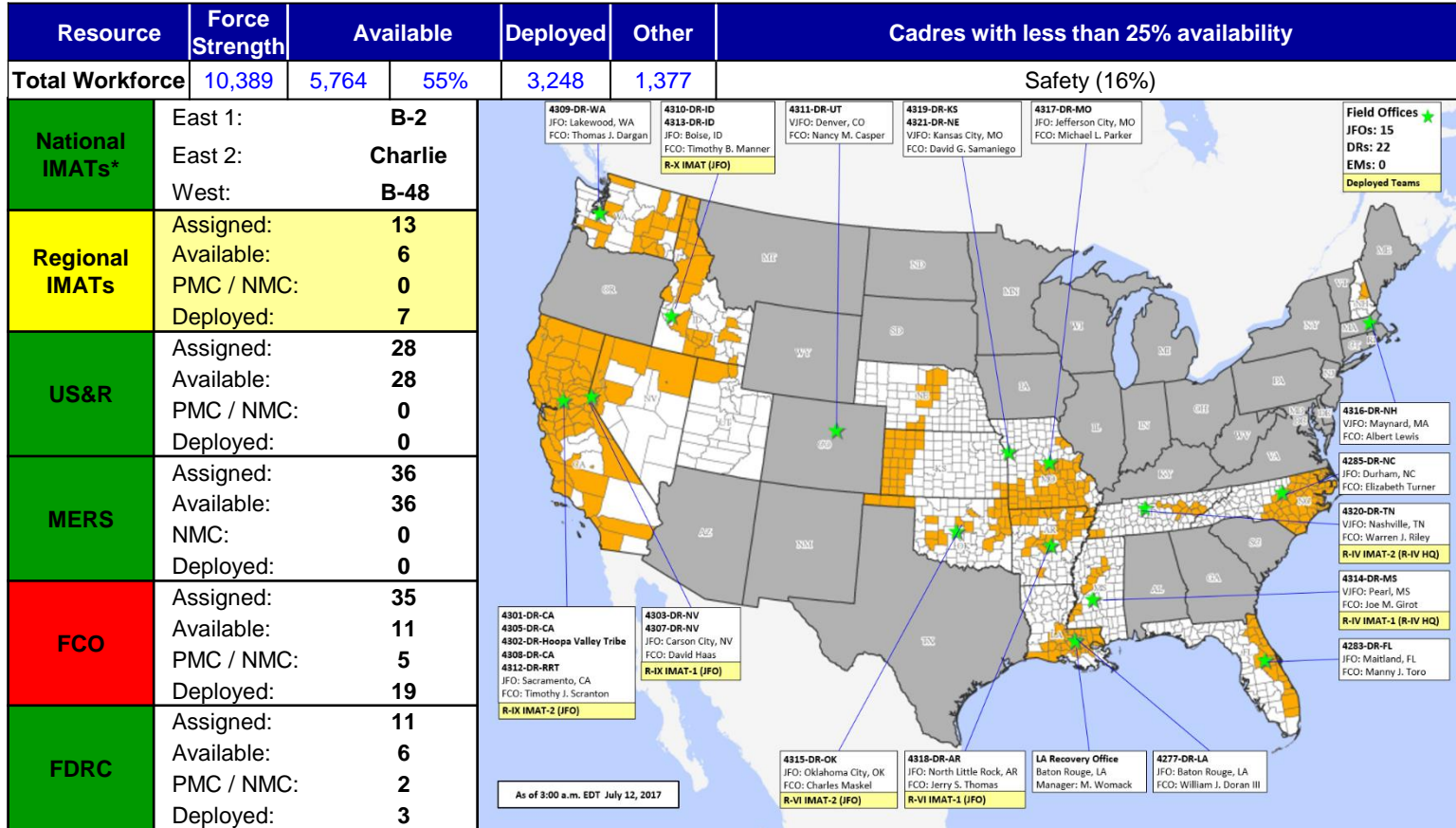
