#### **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic No tropical cyclones expected next 48 hours
- Eastern Pacific Tropical Storm Greg; Tropical Depression Nine-E; Disturbance 1 High (90%)
- Central Pacific Tropical Depression Fernanda
- Western Pacific No activity affecting U.S. interests

#### **Significant Weather:**

- Severe thunderstorms possible Upper Mississippi Valley to Great Lakes, Ohio Valley and Mid-Atlantic
- Flash flooding possible Southwest to Central/Southern Rockies
- Elevated Fire Weather MT, ND & SD; Isolated dry thunderstorms NV
- Space Weather:
  - o Past 24 hours: None observed
  - Next 24 hours: None predicted

#### <u>Tropical Storm Greg:</u> (Advisory #20 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)


- Located 1,010 miles WSW of the southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Moving W at 13 mph; maximum sustained winds 50 mph

#### <u>Tropical Depression Nine-E:</u> (Advisory #4 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 550 miles SSE of Acapulco, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 13 mph; maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Forecast to become a tropical storm

#### Disturbance 1: (as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 600 miles SSW of the southern tip of the Baja California peninsula, Mexico
- Moving W to WNW at 10 mph
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (90%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (90%)






#### <u>Tropical Depression Fernanda</u>: (Advisory #42 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)


- Located 635 miles E of Hilo, HI; Moving WNW at 8 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph; forecast to become a remnant low today or tonight
- High Surf Advisory in effect for east-facing shores
- Potential for nuisance flooding in low lying coastal areas
- HI EOC remains at normal operations
- Region IX RWC remains at Steady State




### Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3






### Precipitation Forecast / Flash Flood Risk








