# Significant Activity – July 27-28



Significant Events: None

#### **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic Disturbance 1 Low (near 0%)
- Eastern Pacific Tropical Storm Hilary; Tropical Storm Irwin
- Central Pacific No tropical cyclones expected next five days
- Western Pacific No activity affecting U.S. interests

#### **Significant Weather:**

- Flash Flooding possible Southwest to Central Plains; Southern Appalachians to Mid-Atlantic
- Elevated fire weather MT
- Isolated dry thunderstorms WA, OR, ID, MT, & WY
- Space weather:
  - o Past 24 hours: None observed
  - Next 24 hours: None predicted



### Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

#### Disturbance 1 (as of 2:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 800 miles WSW of Cabo Verde Islands; moving slowly W or WNW
- Slow development is possible over next several days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)





### Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




#### <u>Tropical Storm Irwin</u> (Advisory #24 as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 1,120 miles WSW of southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Moving W at 2 mph; maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Some fluctuations in intensity are possible next couple of days

#### <u>Tropical Storm Hilary</u> (Advisory #28 as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)


- Located 590 miles WSW of southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 8 mph; maximum sustained winds 70 mph
- Weakening is forecast next 48 hours



Based on current advisories and forecasts, none of the storms threaten the U.S.


## Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3






# Precipitation Forecast / Flash Flood Risk










#### Mid-Atlantic River Flood Outlook
