Earthquake Activity: No significant activity



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Tropical wave recently moved over the Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving west at 10-15 mph
- Some development is possible next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)

<u>Tropical Storm Irwin</u> (Advisory #28 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)


- Located 1,125 miles WSW of Baja California, Mexico

- Located 715 miles west of Baja California, Mexico
- · Forecast to become a remnant low this weekend


Disturbance 1 (as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific










Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3









Precipitation Forecast / Flash Flood Risk








