Significant Activity – July 29-30



Significant Events: None

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic Disturbance 1 Low (near 0%); Disturbance 2 Low (10%)
- Eastern Pacific Tropical Storm Hilary; Tropical Storm Irwin; Disturbance 1 Low (near 0%)
- Central Pacific No tropical cyclones expected next 48 hours
- Western Pacific No activity affecting U.S. interests

Significant Weather:

- Flash flooding possible AZ, NM, CO, KS, OK, TX, & FL
- Isolated dry thunderstorms ID, MT, & WY
- Elevated fire weather & Red Flag Warnings MT
- Space weather:
 - Past 24 hours: None observed
 - Next 24 hours: None predicted

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

Tropical Outlook – Atlantic




Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located several hundred miles WSW of Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving W at 10-15 mph
- Some development expected over the next several days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Area of low pressure forecast to develop over NE Gulf of Mexico over the next day or so
- Development should be slow to occur
- Expected to produce locally heavy rainfall across portions of NE and central Florida during the next couple of days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)



Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



Current advisories and forecasts indicate no threats the U.S.

Tropical Storm Irwin (Advisory #32 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 1,060 miles WSW of Baja California, Mexico
- Expected to become a remnant low by late Monday

Tropical Storm Hilary (Advisory #36 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 940 miles west of Baja California, Mexico
- Expected to become a remnant low by tonight


Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Expected to form several hundred miles south of the Mexican coast by the middle of the week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (40%)











Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3






Precipitation Forecast / Flash Flood Risk






Fire Weather Outlook






6-10 Day Outlooks





6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability


