Significant Activity – August 27-28



Significant Events: Tropical Storm Harvey

#### **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic Tropical Storm Harvey; Potential Tropical Cyclone Ten High (90%); Disturbance 1 High (70%)
- Eastern Pacific Disturbance 1 High (80%)
- Central Pacific No tropical cyclones expected next 48 hours
- Western Pacific No activity affecting U.S. interests

#### Significant Weather:

- Severe thunderstorms possible TX & LA
- Flash flooding possible Southern Plains to Lower Mississippi Valley and coastal Carolinas
- · Isolated dry thunderstorms Northern Intermountain to Northern Plains and Central Great Basin
- Space weather:
  - o Past 24 hours: None
  - Next 24 hours: None



## Tropical Outlook – Atlantic





Tropical Storm Harvey (Advisory #32A, as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 25 miles NE of Port O'Connor, TX
- Moving SE at 3 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph; tropical storm force winds extend 175 miles
- Expected to move off the middle TX coast this morning, and remain just offshore through Tuesday

Potential Tropical Cyclone TEN (Advisory #3A, as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)


- Located 135 miles SSW of Charleston, SC
- Remaining stationary
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Some strengthening is possible; expected to become a tropical storm by Tuesday morning and post-tropical by Tuesday night
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (90%)
- Formation chance through next 5 days: High (90%)

### Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- · Located just offshore coast of western Africa
- Forecast to move W at 15-20 mph
- · Tropical depression could form in a few days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (30%)
- Formation chance through next 5 days: High (70%)



### Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located several hundred miles S of southern tip of Baja California Peninsula, Mexico
- Moving N or NW
- Likely to become a tropical cyclone in 2-3 days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (50%)
- Formation chance through next 5 days: High (80%)






#### Harvey Rainfall Forecast – Days 1-5






### **Precipitation Forecast**




#### **Situation**

Torrential rain causing catastrophic and life-threatening flooding continues over southeastern TX. Additional rain accumulations of 15 - 25 inches expected through the end of the week over the upper TX coast into southwestern LA.

#### Analysis of Impacts

- Tropical storm conditions persist along portions of Gulf coast
- Stronger thunderstorms associated with rain bands to the east of Harvey will pose a tornado threat today and tonight across upper TX coastal plain eastward along the coast into southern LA
- River flooding expected from Houston to Corpus Christi and San Antonio/Austin, TX; greatest threats near San Bernard, Colorado, Navidad and Guadalupe basins
- Estimated 12 million people under Flash Flood Emergency in three counties and the city of Houston
- Power outages: 271k customers without power in TX (As of 8:00 am EDT. Customer outage data is provided by the Department of Energy's EAGLE-I system. Comprehensive National coverage of all electrical service providers is not available.)
- ARC shelters/occupants: 41 / 3,055 in TX and 1 / 20 in LA (ARC Midnight Shelter Count)



### Tropical Cyclone Harvey

- RRCC: Level I (24/7); RWC: Steady State
- Region VI IMAT-1: Deployed to LA EOC
- Region VI IMAT-2: Deployed to TX EOC
- LNOs deployed to TX and LA

#### <u>Texas</u>

- EOC at Full Activation
- Governor declared a State of Disaster for 50 counties
- Mandatory/voluntary evacuations in effect for 8 counties and several independent communities

#### <u>Louisiana</u>

- EOC at Partial Activation with ESFs 1, 3, 6, 7, 8, and DoD
- Governor declared a State of Emergency for all parishes in LA on August 24
- Mandatory/voluntary evacuations in affect for 1 Parish











### Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3






### Fire Weather Outlook






### 6-10 Day Outlooks





6-10 Day Temperature Probability





6-10 Day Precipitation Probability



- FCO is Timothy B. Manner





#### FEMA-4334-DR-IA


- Major Disaster Declaration approved August 27, 2017 for state of Iowa


### **Disaster Amendments**
