# Significant Activity – Sep 24-25



Significant Events: Response for Hurricane Maria

#### **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic Hurricane Maria (CAT 1); Hurricane Lee (CAT 1)
- Eastern Pacific Tropical Storm Pilar; Disturbance 1: Low (30%)
- Central Pacific No tropical cyclones expected next 5 days
- Western Pacific No activity affecting U.S. interests

- Elevated Fire Weather Conditions & Red Flag Warnings CA
- Space Weather: Past 24 hours: None; Next 24 hours: None



### Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

#### Hurricane Maria (Advisory #37A as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 335 miles SSE of Cape Hatteras, NC
- Moving N at 7 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 75 mph
- Tropical Storm Warning issued for portions of the NC coast
- · Additional weakening is forecast during the next 48 hours









### Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

#### Hurricane Lee (Advisory #29 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 910 miles E of Bermuda
- Stationary; maximum sustained winds 90 mph
- Little change in strength forecast during the next 48 hours
- No Watches/Warnings in effect







### Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



#### <u>Tropical Storm Pilar</u> (Advisory #7A as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 50 miles SW of Mazatlan, Mexico
- Moving NNW at 8 mph; maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- Gradual weakening is forecast; expected to become a tropical depression later today

#### Disturbance 1 (as of 2:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 100 miles from the border of Guatemala and Mexico
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (30%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

### Hurricane Maria – Caribbean



#### **Current Situation**


Maria has moved well north of PR, however swells continue to affect PR and the USVI; likely to cause life-threatening surf and rip current conditions. Recovery efforts continue.

#### **Impacts**

- · 6 confirmed fatalities
- Shelters: USVI: 6 (-1) with 391 (-184) occupants; PR: 168 (-6) with 11,359 (+567) occupants (ESF 6 as of 4:00 a.m. EDT)
- Power Outages: USVI: 48k; PR: 1.6M (SLB as of 5:00 a.m.)
- Seaports in Puerto Rico and U.S. Virgin Islands opening with restrictions
- Airports:
  - o PR: San Juan Int open for commercial flights through Sept 30th
  - USVI closed except for military and hurricane relief
- Communications: Cell sites out of service PR: 95%; USVI: 77%
- · Hospitals:
  - PR: 3 of 7 have some damage but operating on generators
  - USVI: Power has been restored to Schneider and Juan F. Luis Hospitals
- · Guajataca Dam:
  - Flash Flood Emergency and evacuations remain in effect for the western Quebradillas Municipality (pop. 26k) and eastern Isabela Municipality (pop. 46k) due to a potential failure at the Guajataca Dam
  - Dam failure not imminent; USACE dam safety inspection ongoing
  - Water flow over the emergency spillway is eroding the spillway embankment



### Precipitation Forecast & Flash Flood Risk









