

<u>Tropical Depression Seventeen</u> (Advisory #1 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)


- Located 875 miles WSW of the Azores
- Moving N at 3 mph
- Maximum winds 35 mph
- Expected to be a tropical storm later today
- No threat to land

Post Tropical Cyclone Nate - Final



Situation

Nate is now a tropical depression and is moving rapidly inland after making landfall Saturday evening, currently located about 70 miles ENE of Nashville TN Moving NNE at 20 mph with 35 mph winds.

Impacts

- · Power has been restored to most customers along the Gulf Coast
- · Shelter populations are declining; some shelters have closed
- Roadway flooding continues to subside and debris removal remains on-going across the affected areas
- · Ports have re-opened in LA, MS, AL, FL
- · All affected airports have re-opened
- Water: LA: boil water advisory issued for Plaquemines Parish

Response:

• Emergency Declarations approved for the states of Louisiana (FEMA-3392-EM-LA), Mississippi (FEMA-3393-EM-MS), Alabama (FEMA-3394-EM-AL), and Florida (FEMA-3395-EM-FL); Amendment No. 1 to FEMA-3392-EM-LA adds 2 parishes for Louisiana

FEMA Headquarters:

 Region V IMAT demobilizing from MS and returning to home station on Tuesday

FEMA Region IV:

- RRCC deactivated; RWC returned to Steady State
- IMAT 1 deployed to FL (Irma)
- IMAT 2: deployed to GA EOC (Irma)
- IMAT Type III deployed to AL (Region V staff released, Region IV staff remaining); Region IV staff remain deployed
- LNOs deployed to AL, GA, MS & TN (Hurricane Nate) additional LNO deployed to Seminole Tribe of FL (Irma); FL LNO released (Nate)
- AL EOC at Full Activation
- MS EOC at Partial Activation
- FL, KY & TN EOCs at Monitoring

FEMA Region VI

- · RRCC deactivated
- Region VI IMAT-1 returning to home station; Region VI LNO demobilized
- LA EOC remains at Full Activation

Hurricane Update – Caribbean



Current Situation

Life safety and life sustainment efforts in PR and the USVI are ongoing.

Population Impacts:

- Shelters: 114 open with 6,813 occupants in PR; 5 open with 347 occupants in USVI
- Disaster Assistance Registrations: 347k in PR; 8k in USVI

Communications:

- PR: 18.3% of cell towers operational
- USVI: 43% of cell towers operational (St. Thomas: 48.5%; St. John: no cell sites operational; St. Croix: 43.1%)

Power:

- Restoration: PR: 11.7% with electricity; power grid is down in San Juan; due to transmission line failure; conducting damage assessments and repair plan; USVI: 14.4% St. Thomas; 0% St. John; 12% St. Croix on power grid
- Generators: PR: completed 219 of 344 requested generator preinstallation inspections; 48 installed; 193 are on hand; 365 en route; USVI: 44 generators installed, 5 de-installed, 59 available on island

Health and Medical:


- PR: 65 out of 67 hospitals open; 36 hospitals connected to power grid,
 28 on generator power; 1 without power
- USVI: St. Croix: Charles Harwood Hospital and Governor Juan Luis Hospital partially open despite damage; served 18 patients in last 24 hours


FEMA Response









Precipitation Forecast & Flash Flood Risk












Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3











Fire Weather Outlook










6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability






Declaration Approval
