<u>Situation</u>: The Thomas Fire continues to burn across multiple counties.

Impacts

- Shelters: 2 open / 426 (+143) occupants (ARC Shelter Count as of 5:39 a.m. EST)
- A boil water advisory remains in effect for both counties

State/Local Response

- Governor declared a State of Emergency; CA National Guard deployed
- EOCs: CA Full Activation; NV Partial Activation; UT Monitoring


FEMA Response

- Emergency Disaster Declaration approved on December 8, 2017
- Region IX RWC at Steady State; RRCC not activated
- Region IX IMAT-1 & 2 deployed to CA EOC
- Region IX LNO & Bothell MERS deployed to Southern Regional EOC
- Defense Coordinating Element activated
- IA Joint PDAs for four counties began December 15, 2017



National Weather Forecast










Precipitation Forecast






Fire Weather Outlook






6-10 Day Outlooks





6-10 Day Temperature Probability





6-10 Day Precipitation Probability


