Impacts


Localized closures and delays across impacted areas

 - o TX: Five shelters open with 328 occupants




- FEMA NWC, Region IV, and Region VI at Steady State; will continue to monitor

National Weather Forecast







Winter Precipitation Outlook






Forecast Snowfall




Forecast Ice Accumulation

Precipitation Forecast













