Impacts

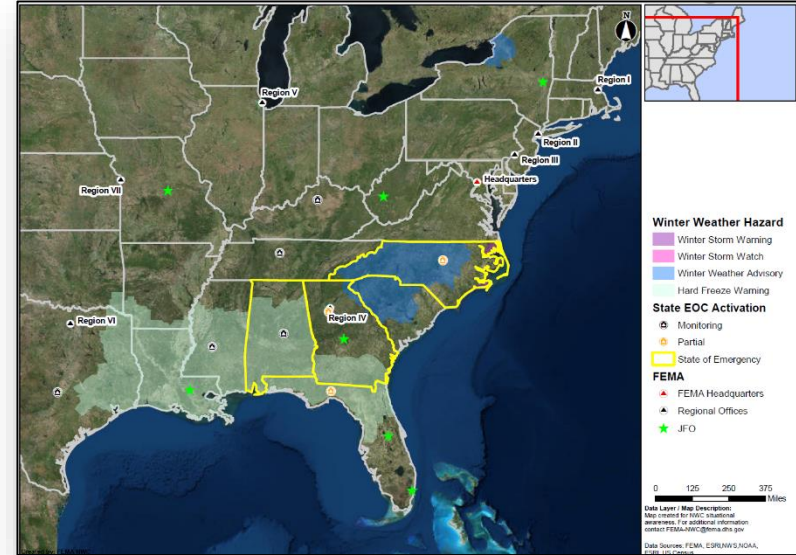
- Localized closures and delays across impacted areas

- States EOCs at Partial Activation: FL, GA, NC
- Shelters:
 - NC and TN: One shelter open in each state with no occupants
 - TX: Five shelters open with 328 occupants

FEMA Response

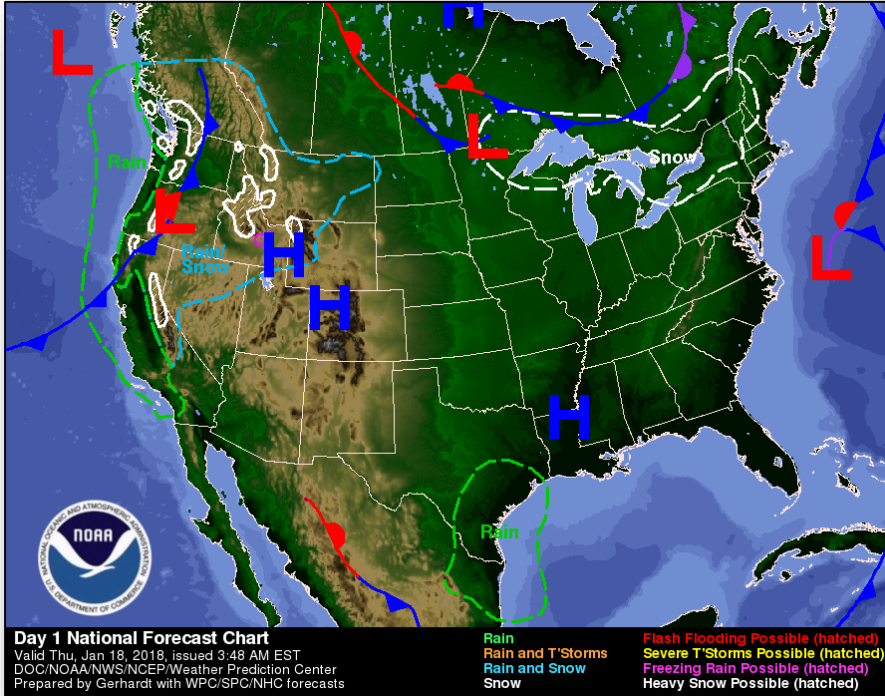
- FEMA NWC, Region IV, and Region VI at Steady State; will continue to monitor

- No unmet needs; no request for FEMA assistance



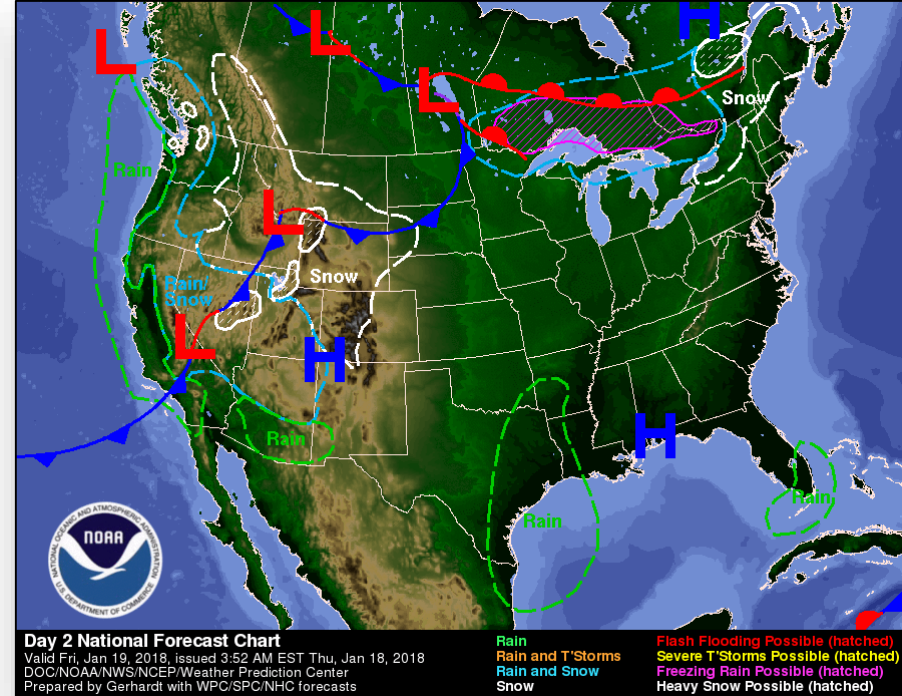
National Weather Forecast

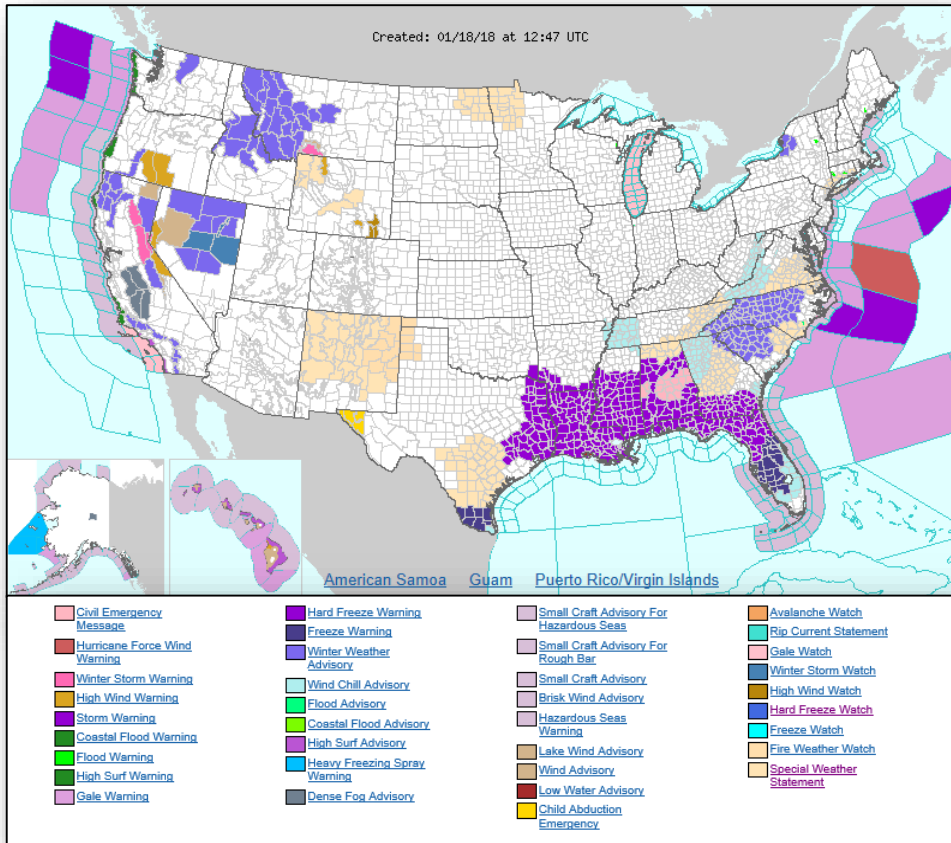

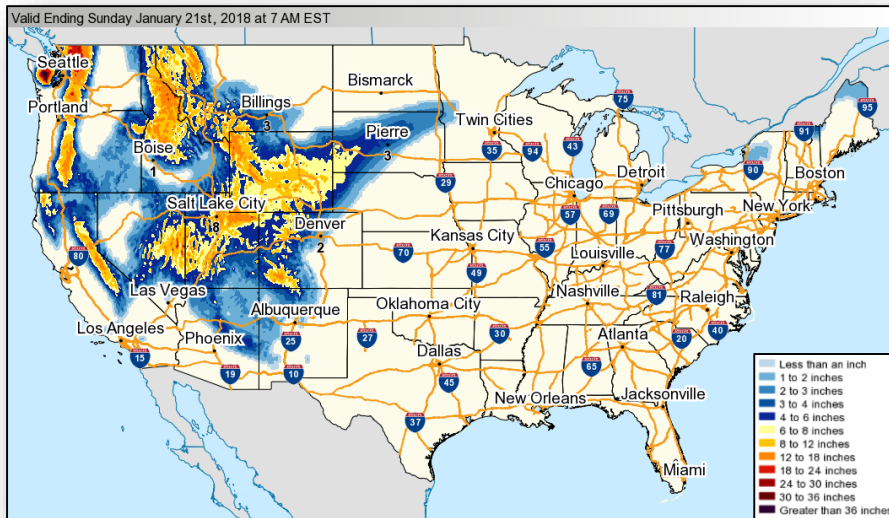
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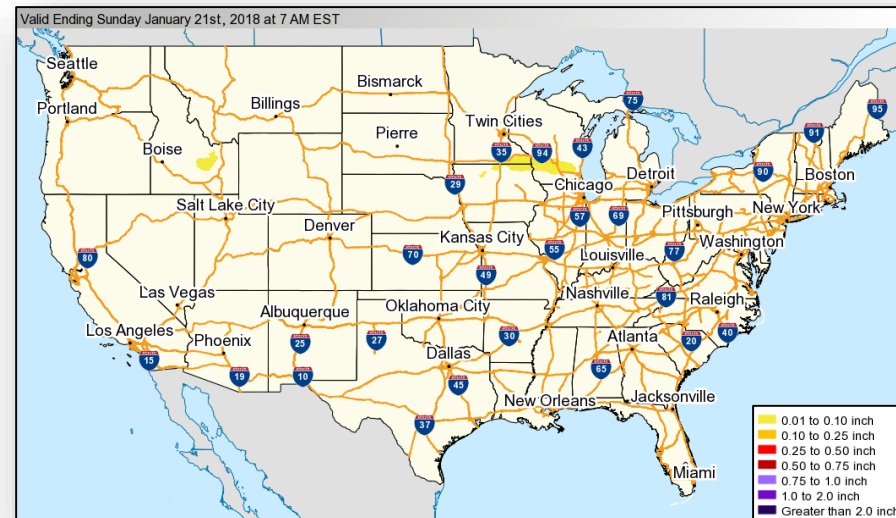
Winter Precipitation Outlook



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Forecast Snowfall

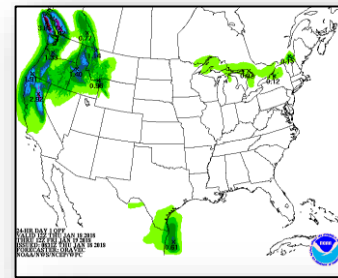
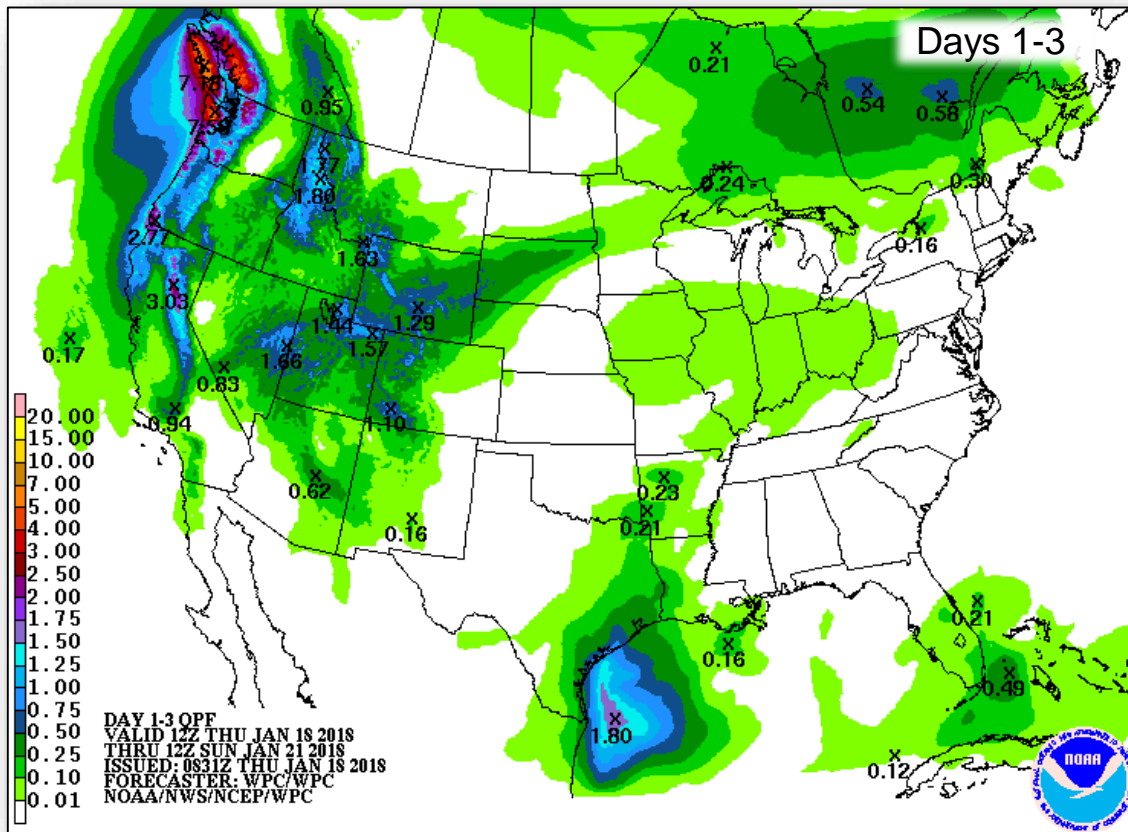


Forecast Ice Accumulation

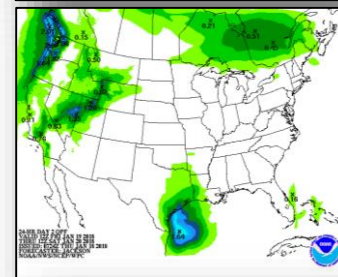
Precipitation Forecast



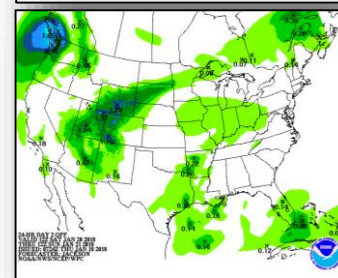
