

Flu Season Activity




- Graph shows outpatient visits for influenza-likeillness (ILI) – a good indicator for overall flu activity in the US





Winter Precipitation Outlook






Forecast Snowfall




Forecast Ice Accumulation


Precipitation Forecast























6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability


