A Nor'easter is spreading a wintery mix and heavy snow to the northern Mid-Atlantic and Northeast. Heavy Snow is expected, with accumulations of over a foot for portions of the Northeast. Travel will be difficult, if not impossible, especially this evening.

#### **Impacts**


 Widespread minor to moderate coastal flooding expected during high tide tomorrow from Cape May, NJ to Montauk Point, NY

- MD & NJ EOCs at Monitoring




- FEMA Region III LNOs deployed to PA EOC

### Winter Precipitation Outlook








Forecast Snowfall

Forecast Ice Accumulation


