Situation

Heavy snow continues over northern ME as the Nor'easter winds down

Impacts


- · One unconfirmed fatality in NY
- · Customers without Power*:
 - Service is improving across all impacted states
 - o MA: 166k; NJ: 123k; CT: 63k; NY: 47k; PA: 19k; ME: 14k
- Shelters / Occupants: MA: 3/31; CT: 2/6; NH: 1/10; NJ: 6/15; VA: 1/7;
 NY: 42/48; PA: 4/37 (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 5:31 a.m. EST)
- Public transportation resuming operations with minor detours and storm schedules in effect for impacted areas
- · Road closures declining as weather permits clearance of snow & debris

State/Local Response

- Governors of MD, NJ, PA, & VA have declared a state of emergency
- NY State, NH, CT, & MA EOCs at Partial Activation
- · NJ EOC at Monitoring
- MD EOC returned to normal operations

FEMA Response


- FEMA Regions I, II, & III continue to monitor

- Currently no unmet needs/specific requests for assistance




Precipitation Forecast
















Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3











Fire Weather Outlook









