
- Severe thunderstorms possible Lower Mississippi Valley

- Space Weather Past 24 hours: none; Next 24 hours: minor geomagnetic storms reaching G1 level are expected




Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3






Hazards Outlook – Mar 12-16






Fire Weather Outlook












 - Hazard Mitigation statewide




