Current Situation

A third coastal storm in two weeks will deliver heavy wet snow, gusty winds, and minor coastal flooding from the Mid-Atlantic to New England

<u>Impacts</u>


- Widespread flight cancellations
- Amtrak temporarily suspended NE corridor service between Boston and New York
- Widespread school closures in New England

- MA, VT, & RI EOCs at Partial Activation
- NJ EOC at Monitoring

FEMA Preparations / Response

- FEMA Region I, II and III RWCs continue to monitor
- FEMA Region I at Enhanced Watch
- FEMA Region I deployed LNO to RI EOC
- NWC continues to monitor
- No reported unmet needs and no requests for FEMA assistance




Winter Precipitation Outlook






Forecast Snowfall




Forecast Ice Accumulation

Precipitation Forecast










Significant River Flood Outlook






This weeks PA Highlights

- \$42.8 Million was obligated to Recreational or Other for New York.




NPSC Call Forecasting and Actual Calls Over the Past 4 Weeks 2/11/2018 through 3/10/2018
