Declaration Activity: None




#### Northwest:

- Severe storms possible Gulf Coast to Ohio Valley with stripe of heavy snow and spots icing from Upper Mississippi Valley east to interior New England






#### Northwest:

Coastal rain and some rain/snow inland across the mountains

#### Central and East Hazards Only:

- Severe storms possible Gulf Coast to Ohio Valley with stripe of heavy snow and spots of icing from Upper Mississippi Valley east to interior New England
- Small area of Flash Flood Risk across parts of the Ohio Valley





#### Northwest and Northern Rockies:


• Coastal rain and some rain/snow inland across the mountains

#### Northeast Hazards:

• Freezing rain northern Maine

#### East/Southeast:

- Mostly light rain/snow Eastern Great Lakes to interior New England
- Rain and thunderstorms elsewhere






#### Northwest and Rockies:

- Heavy snow and isolated areas of freezing rain possible from interior Northwest across the Northern Rockies
- Coastal rain and some rain/snow inland across the mountains


#### East:

- Light rain and snow across portions of the Great Lakes and Midwest






### Severe Weather Outlook


