# Significant Activity – April 17-18



Significant Events: Wildfires

Tropical Activity: Western Pacific - no activity affecting U.S. interests

#### Significant Weather:

- Elevated/Critical Fire Weather Southwest; Southern and Central Plains; Southeast to Mid-Atlantic
- Red Flag Warnings KS, OK & TX
- Heavy snow & freezing rain Upper Mississippi Valley to Great Lakes
- Space Weather:
  - Past 24 hours none observed
  - Next 24 hours none predicted

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

#### Declaration Activity:

- Major Disaster Declarations approved West Virginia and Ohio
- FMAG approved McClellan Fire, TX



- TX EOC at Normal Operations










# **Declaration Approved**


