Tropical Activity: Western Pacific - no activity affecting U.S. interests

Significant Weather:

- Elevated/Critical Fire Weather – Southwest; Southern and Central Plains; Southeast to Mid-Atlantic
- Red Flag Warnings – KS, OK & TX
- Heavy snow & freezing rain –Upper Mississippi Valley to Great Lakes
- Space Weather:
 - Past 24 hours – none observed
 - Next 24 hours – none predicted

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

Declaration Activity:

- Major Disaster Declarations approved – West Virginia and Ohio
- FMAG approved – McClellan Fire, TX

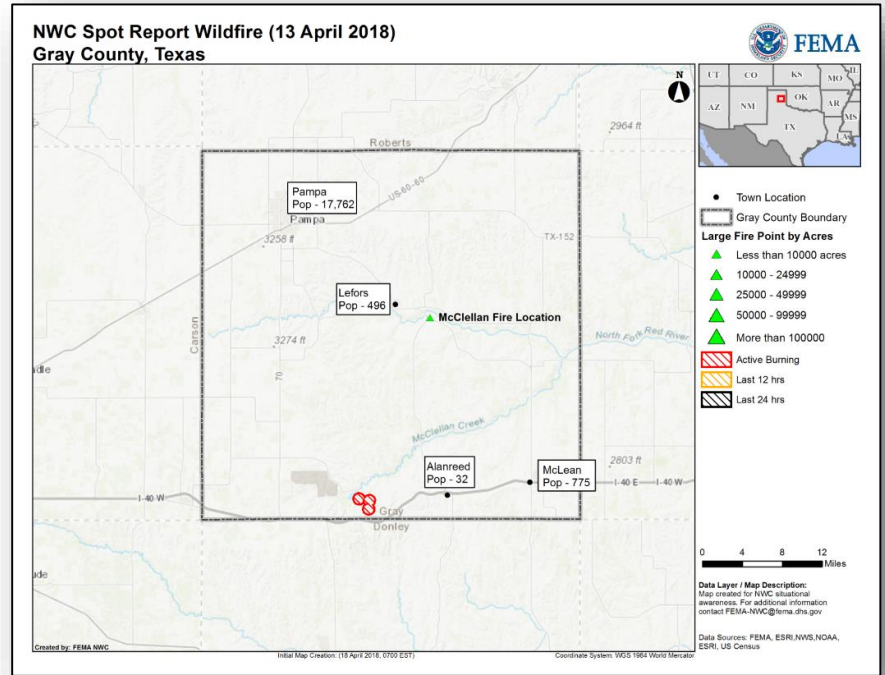

Current Situation

- Fire began April 17, 2018 and is burning in and around McLean (pop. 775)
- Threatening homes, infrastructure, utilities and a watershed
- Mandatory and voluntary evacuations in effect for 1,200 people

- Region VI RWC at Steady State – Monitoring situation
- TX EOC at Normal Operations

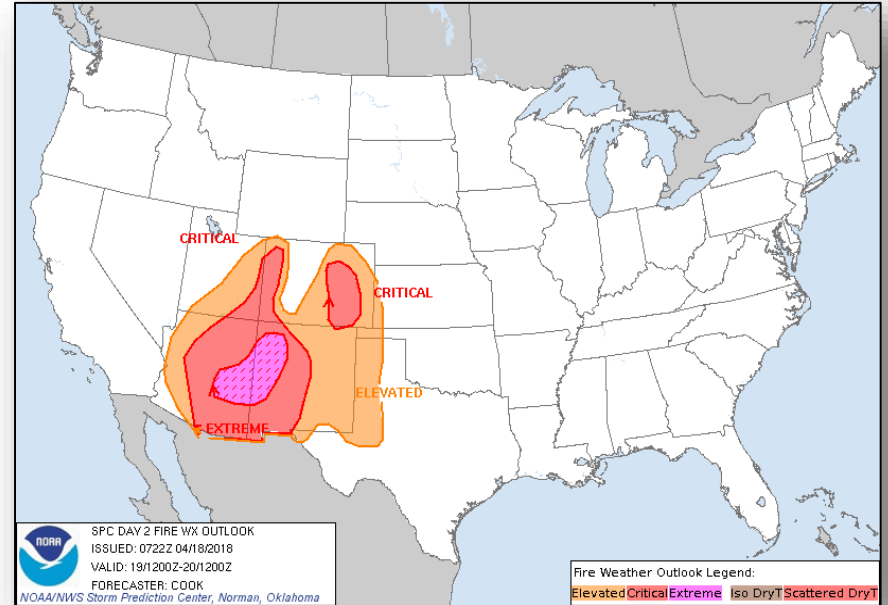

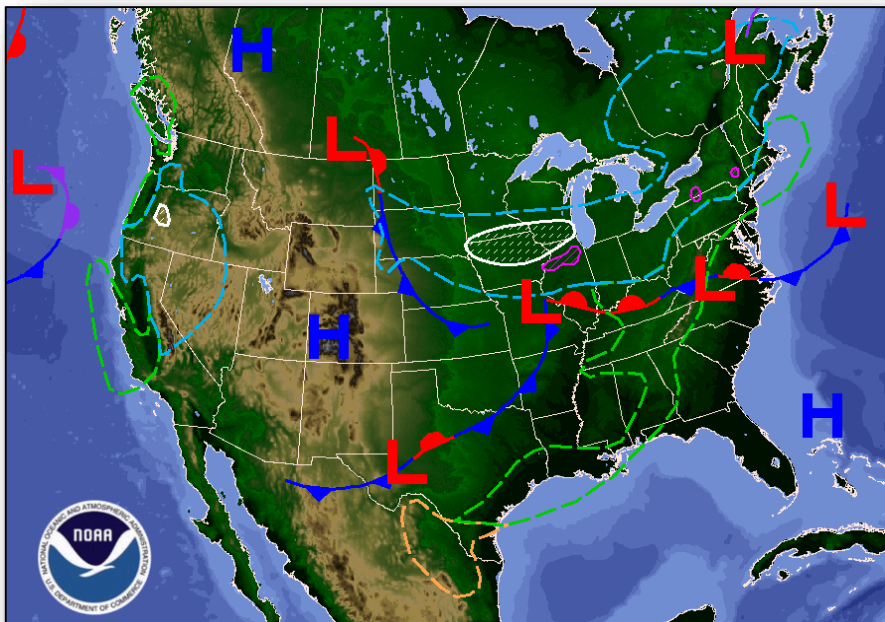

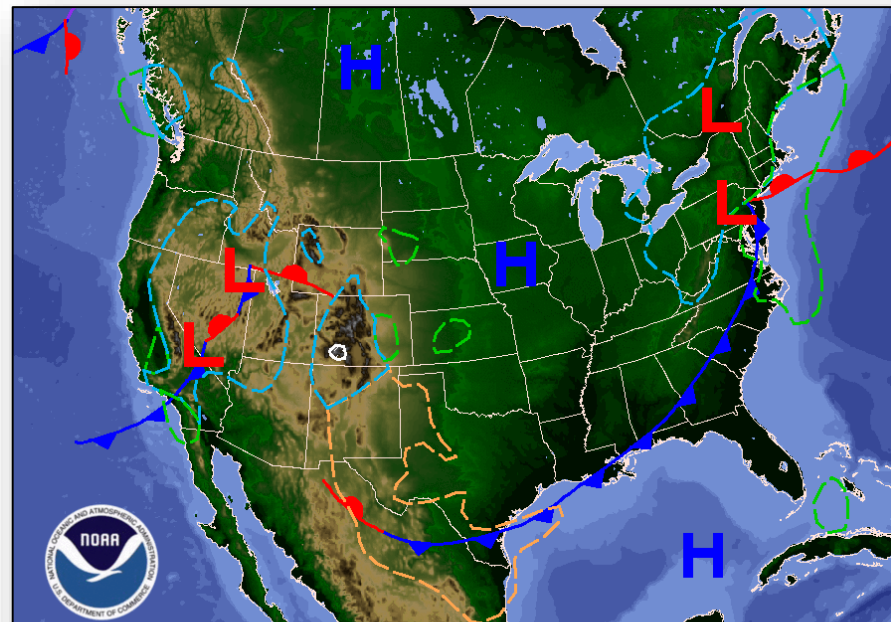


Day 1 National Forecast Chart

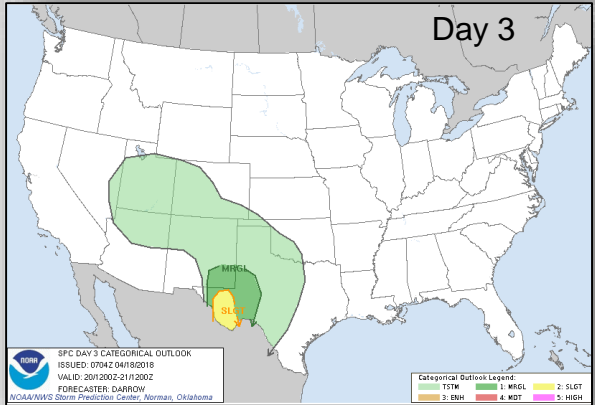
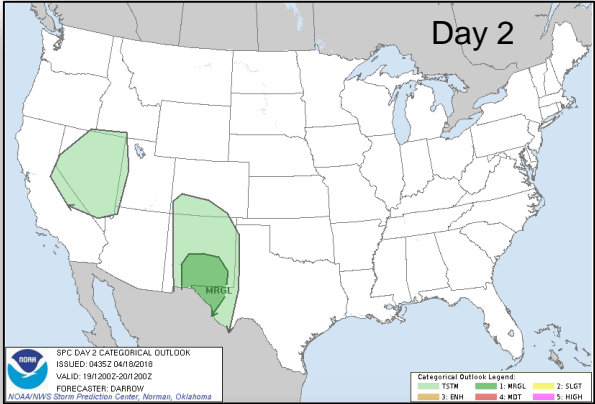
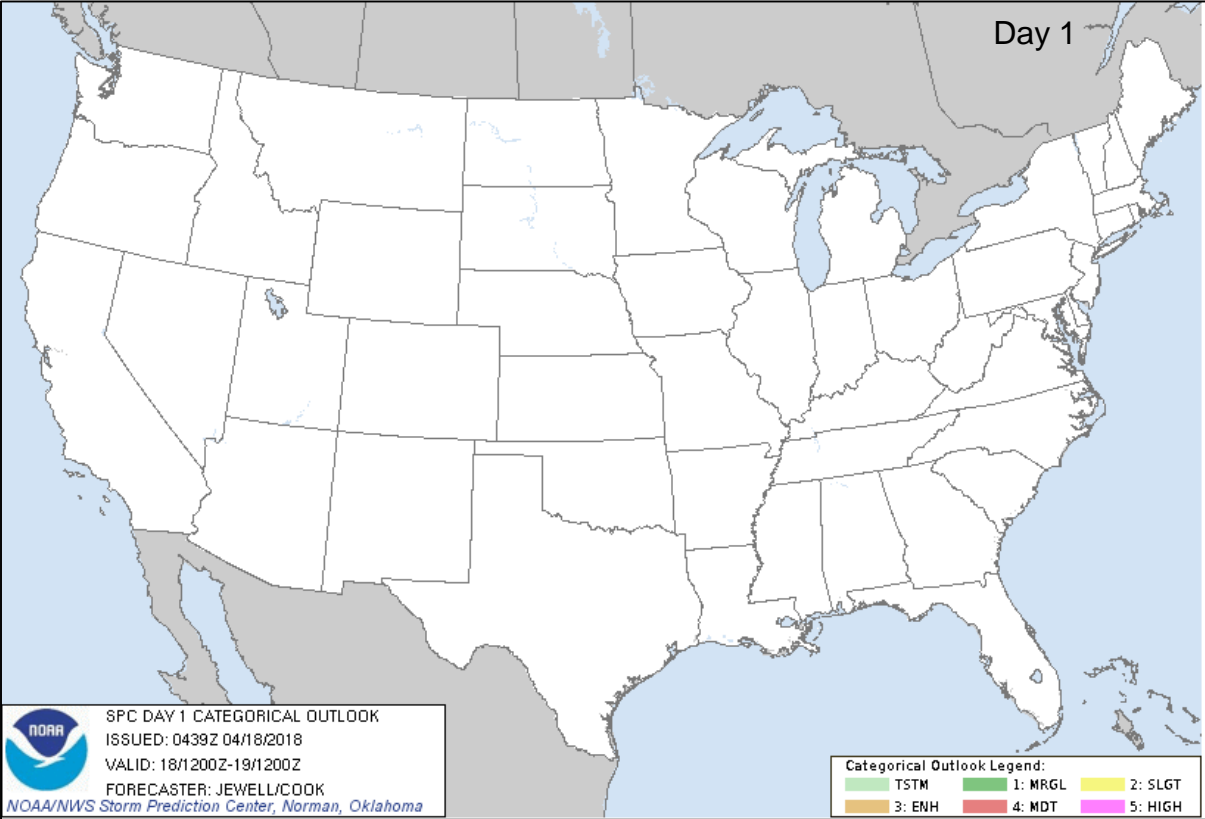

Severe Weather Outlook



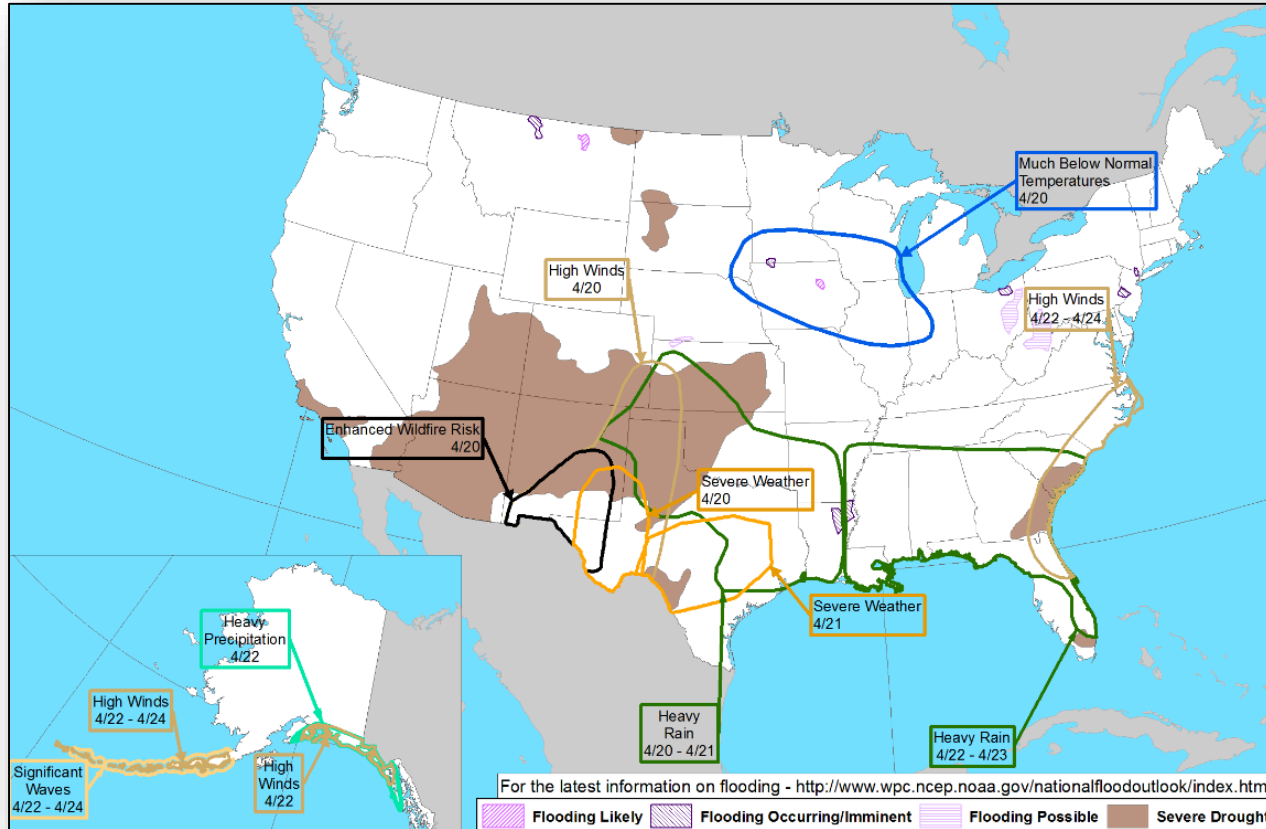
