

- 1 shelter open with 7 occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 5:30 am EDT)











Severe Weather Outlook









Fire Weather Outlook










Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall Forecast









Long Range Outlooks – May 5-9





Temperature Probability




Precipitation Probability





Declaration Request

Indiana

 - Individual and Public Assistance for 7 counties
