

Tropical Storm Bud (Advisory #23A as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- 60 miles NNE of La Paz, Mexico
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph; moving N at 13 mph
- Forecast to weaken into a tropical depression later today and to dissipate on Saturday


Tropical Depression Four-E (Advisory #3A as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)


- Located 105 miles S of Acapulco, Mexico
- Storm is stationary; maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Expected to become a tropical storm before it reaches the coast of southern Mexico
- No threat to U.S. interests



Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific









National Weather Forecast






Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall Forecast









Fire Weather Outlook




