

Current Situation

- Fire began July 5, 2018, and is burning in and around the communities of Hornbrook and Hilt (combined population 500)
- Threatening 425 homes (80% are primary homes, 20% are secondary homes), 10 nonresidential commercial properties, and 200 minor structures
- Also threatening BNSF Railroad, infrastructure, utilities and watershed
- Portions of I-5 North and South closed
- Mandatory evacuations in effect for 900 people
- 2 shelters open with 16 occupants statewide (ARC Shelter Count as of 5:05 a.m. EDT)

Response

- Governor declared a State of Emergency for Siskiyou County
- CA EOC remains at Normal Operations
- Region IX RWC at Steady State, but continues to monitor



Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located a few hundred miles SE of North Carolina coast
- Moving slowly NW and stalls or meanders near the coast of North Carolina over the weekend
- Environmental condition expected to be conducive for additional development; tropical depression likely to form over next couple of days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (70%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (80%)



Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

Hurricane Beryl (CAT 1) (Advisory #4 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 1,140 miles ESE of the Lesser Antilles
- Moving W at 14 mph
- On the forecast rack, center will remain east of Lesser Antilles through early Sunday
- Maximum sustained winds 75 mph
- Some additional strengthening is forecast today
- Forecast to weaken by late Saturday and become a tropical storm or degenerate into a strong open trough near Lesser Antilles late Sunday or Monday
- Hurricane force winds extend 10 miles; tropical storm force winds extend 35 miles
- PR and USVI EOCs at Full Activation (Hurricanes Irma & Maria)
- · FEMA Region II RWC at Steady State, but continues to monitor






Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




<u>Tropical Storm Fabio</u> (Advisory #23 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)


- Located 1,225 miles W of the southern tip of Baja California
- Moving WNW at 14 mph; a turn W is expected by end of the weekend
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- Weakening is forecast; expected to degenerate into remnant low later today
- Tropical storm force winds extend 90 miles
- · No coastal watches or warnings in effect
- Swells generated by Fabio are likely to cause life-threatening surf and rip current conditions along portions of coast of southern CA




Super Typhoon Maria (FINAL) (Advisory #15 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)


- Located 292 miles NW of Andersen AFB, Guam

- FEMA Region IX RWC at Steady State but continues to monitor




National Weather Forecast











Forecast Heat Index















Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall Forecast








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
