Significant Events: Wildfires

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic – Tropical cyclone activity not expected during next 48 hours
- Eastern Pacific – Disturbance 1 – Medium (50%); Disturbance 2 – Low (30%)
- Central Pacific – Tropical cyclone activity not expected during next 48 hours
- Western Pacific – No activity affecting U.S. interests

Significant Weather:

- Severe thunderstorms possible – Southern High Plains and from ARKLATEX region to the Upper Ohio Valley
- Flash flooding possible – ARKLATEX region and coastal Carolinas
- Red Flag Warnings – WA, CA, OR, and ID

Declaration Activity:

- Emergency Declaration approved – CA
- FMAGs approved – CA, ID, WA, and TX

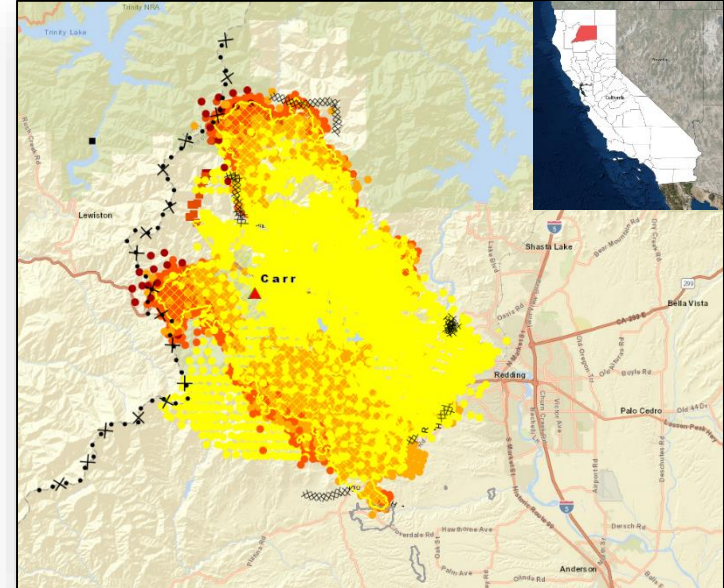

Current Situation

- Fire continues to spread in a northerly and southern direction. Shifting winds in timber fuels combined with steep drainages below control lines are contributing to spot fires crossing lines
- Fatalities / Injuries: 6 confirmed / 0
- Acres burned: **95,368 (+6,174)**; Containment: **17% (+12)**
- Structures / Homes:
 - Threatened: 4,978 homes, 22 multiple residences, 12 nonresidential commercial
 - Damaged: 175 structures (**143 (+14)** homes)
 - Destroyed: 874 structures (**657 (+142)** homes)
- Evacuations: Mandatory for approximately 39k people
- Hospitals:
 - One hospital fully evacuated
 - One hospital partially evacuated (neo-natal patients)
 - Eight intermediate care facilities fully evacuated
- Shelters / Occupants: **5 open / 437 (-360)** occupants (*ARC Midnight Shelter Count*)
- Infrastructure:
 - Power outages: 3k customers*; Gas outages: 250 customers
 - Power grid is stable with excess capacity
 - **Shasta, Keswick, and Trinity power plants have resumed operations; Trinity power plant is currently the sole source of electricity for the county until the grid is checked and normal distribution resumes**



(*as of 4:45 am EDT. Customer outage data is provided by the Department of Energy's EAGLE-I system. Comprehensive National coverage of all electrical service providers is not available.)

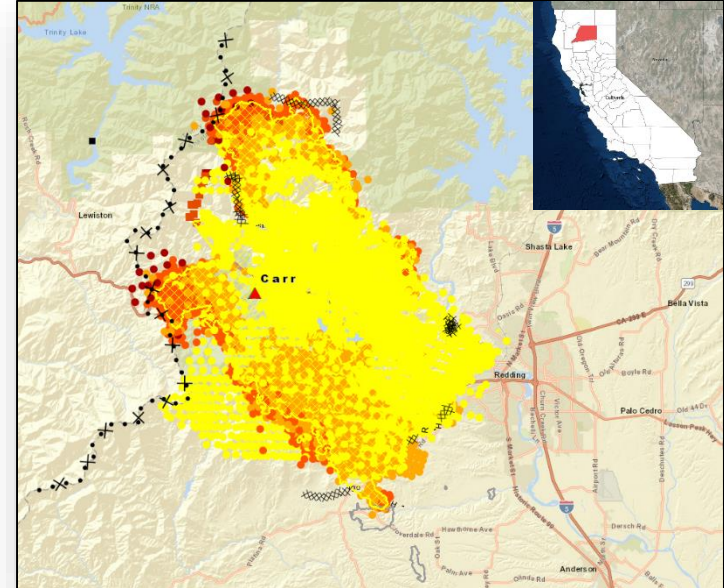


State / Local Response

- CA EOC at Full Activation; Southern REOC at Partial Activation (day shift only)
- The Governor declared a State of Emergency for six counties

FEMA Response

- Emergency Declaration FEMA-3398-EM-CA was approved on July 28, 2018
- FMAG FEMA-5259-FM-CA was approved on July 23, 2018
- Region IX:
 - RWC at Steady State, continues to monitor
 - IMAT-2 deployed to CA EOC (supported by ESFs 1, 3, 4, 6, 7, 8, 12, & DCO)
 - LNOs deployed to CA EOC and Shasta County EOC
- Staging Area established at Redding Municipal Airport
 - ISB Team and Cache deployed
 - Commodities prepositioned: Cots, blankets, meals, and water
- NWC: Enhanced Watch rostered through tonight



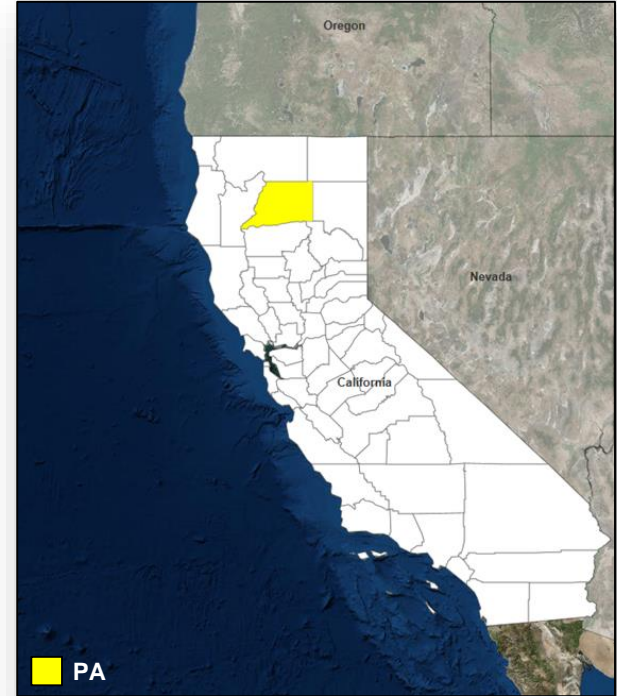

FEMA-3398-EM-CA

- The President approved an Emergency Declaration for the State of California on July 28, 2018
- As a result of a wildfire beginning July 23, 2018, and continuing
- Provides Emergency protective measures (Category B), limited to direct Federal Assistance under the Public Assistance program at 75% federal funding, for Shasta County
- The FCO is William Roche

Current Situation

- Fire began July 29, 2018 and is burning on State and private land in and around the community of Kingsland (pop. 6k)
- Threatening 200 homes (could increase to 1,000 dependent on winds)
- Also threatening resorts, wineries, utilities, state parks, bridges, & numerous churches
- Evacuations:
 - Mandatory evacuations for 600 people
 - Voluntary evacuations for 800 (Camp Longhorn)

Response

- TX EOC at Normal Operations
- FEMA Region VI at Steady State, continues to monitor

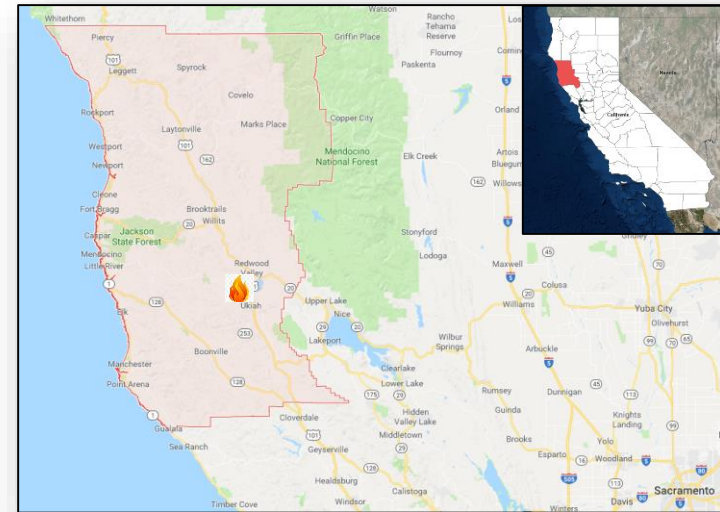

Current Situation

- Fire began July 29, 2018 and is burning on State and private land in and around the community of Upper Lake (pop. 3k)
- Threatening 1,450 homes (1,305 primary residences, 145 secondary residences)
- Also threatening 20 buildings, infrastructure, utilities, & watershed
- Mandatory evacuations for approximately 11,900 people
- 6 shelters open with 557 occupants (*ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 5:56 a.m. EDT*)

Response

- CA EOC at Full Activation; Southern REOC at Partial Activation (day shift only)
- Governor previously declared a State of Emergency for six counties
- FEMA Region IX at Steady State, continues to monitor

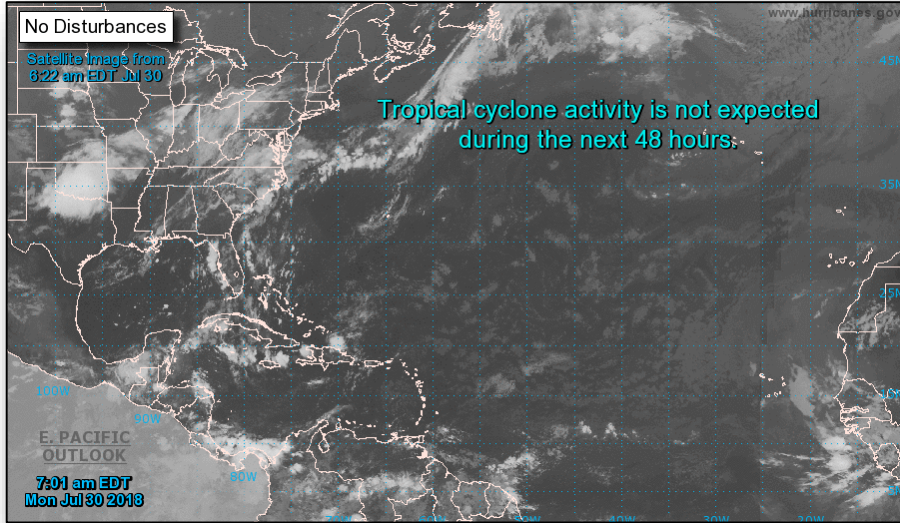

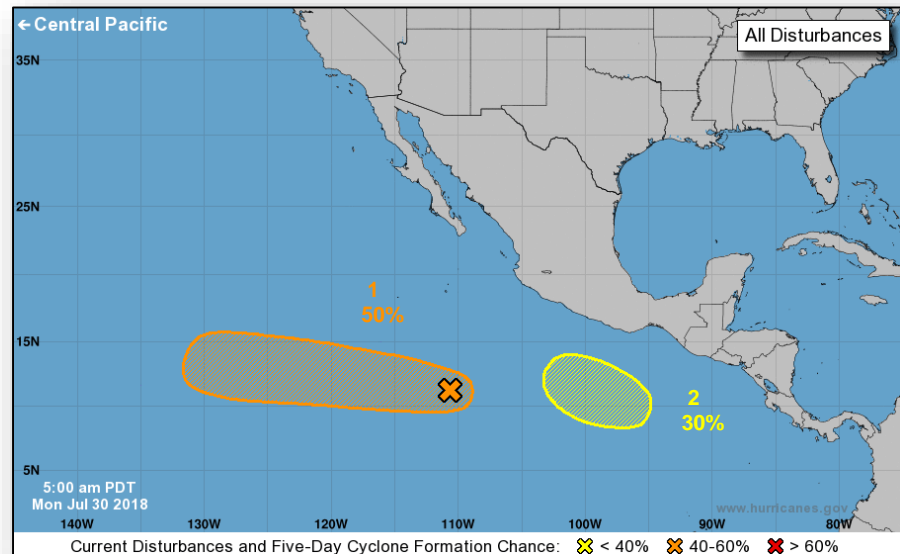


Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Several hundred miles SW of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 10-15 mph
- Marginally favorable for development
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (50%)
- No threat to U.S. interests

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

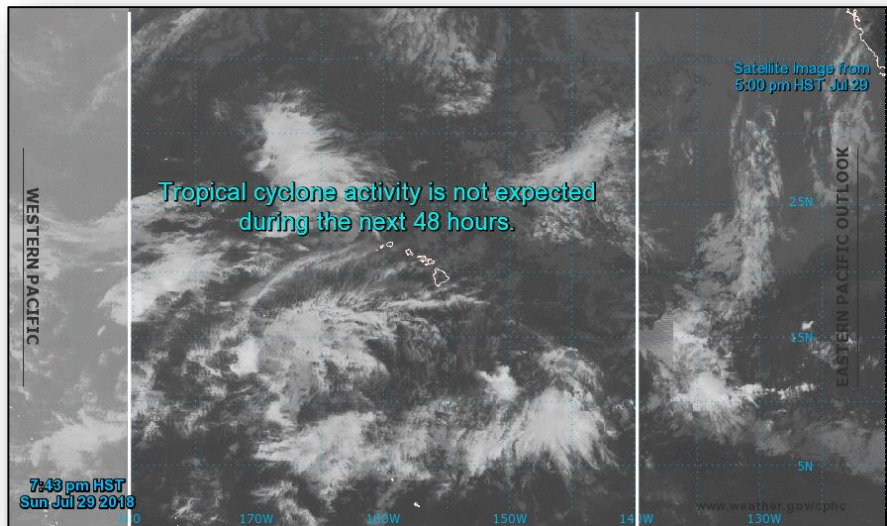
- Located several hundred miles S of Gulf of Tehuantepec
- Moving WNW off the coast of Mexico
- Gradual development possible
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)
- No threat to U.S. interests



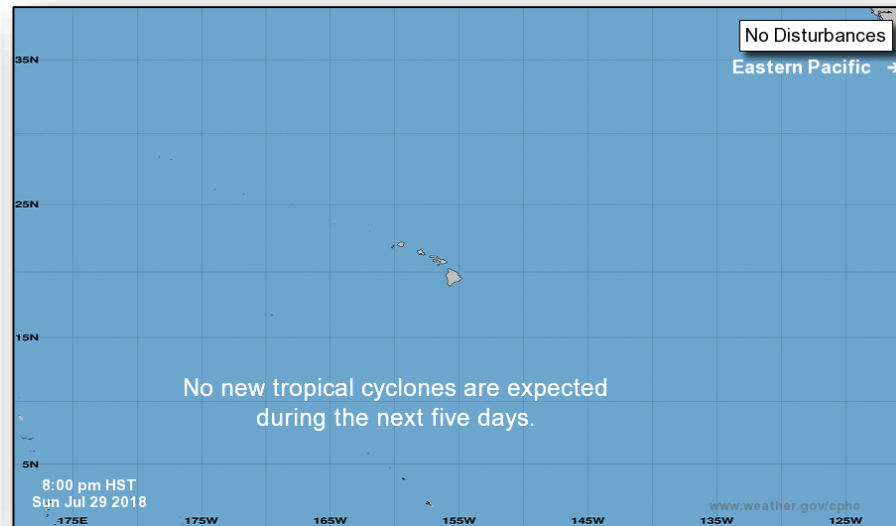
Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific

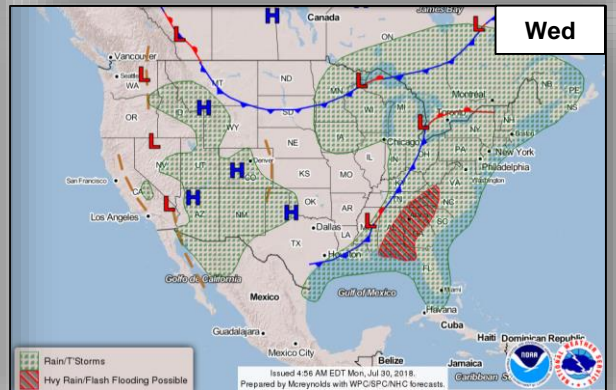
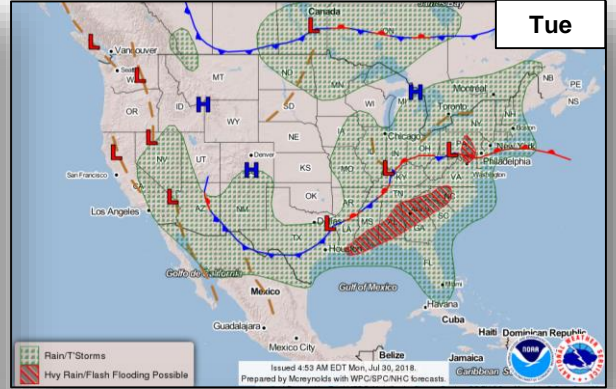
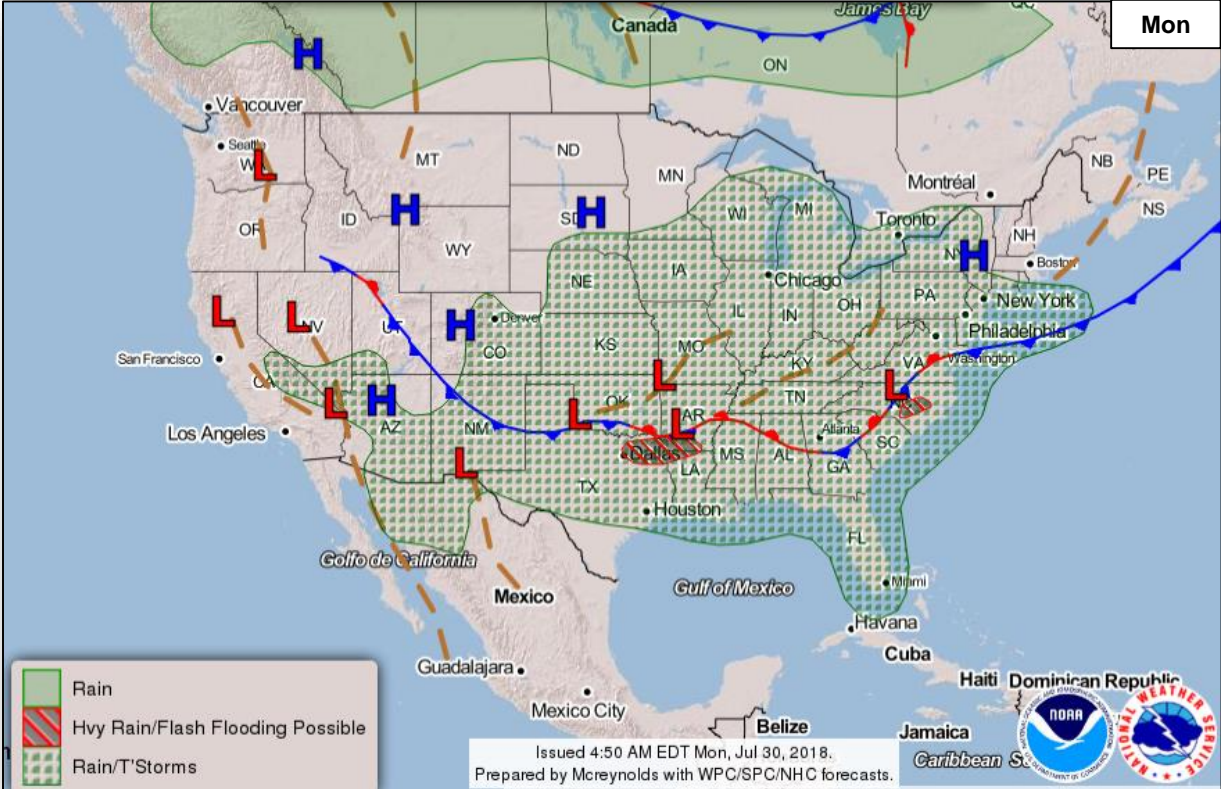


48 Hour Outlook



5 Day Outlook

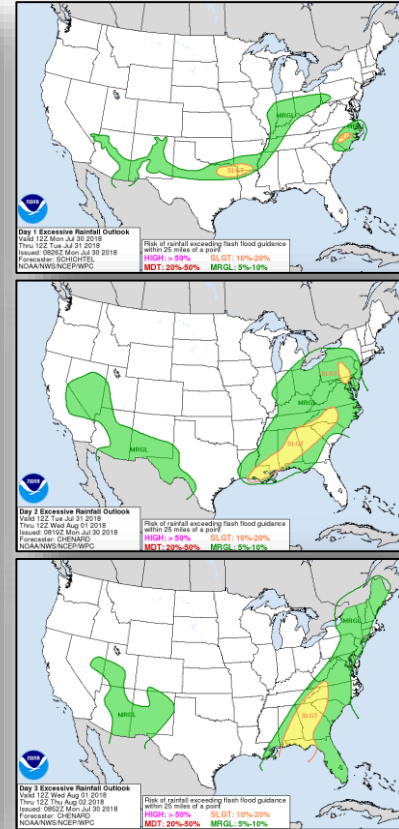
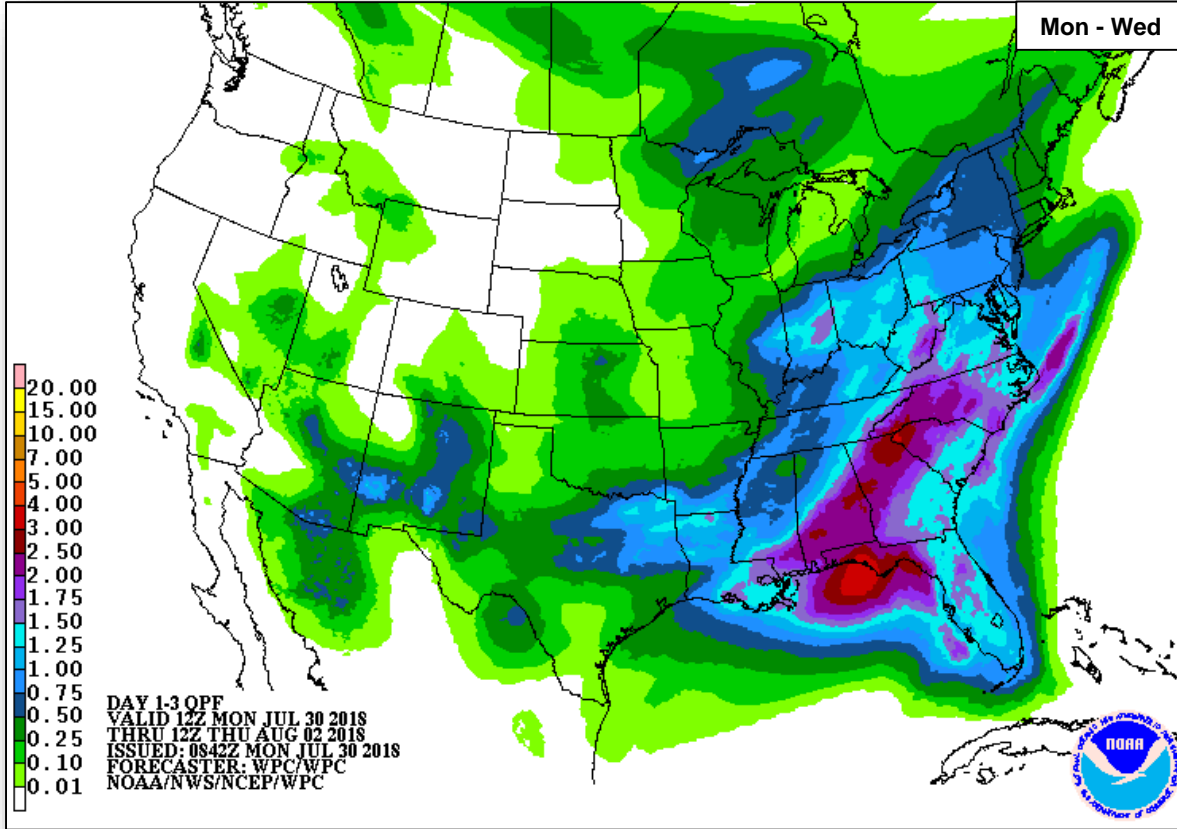
National Weather Forecast

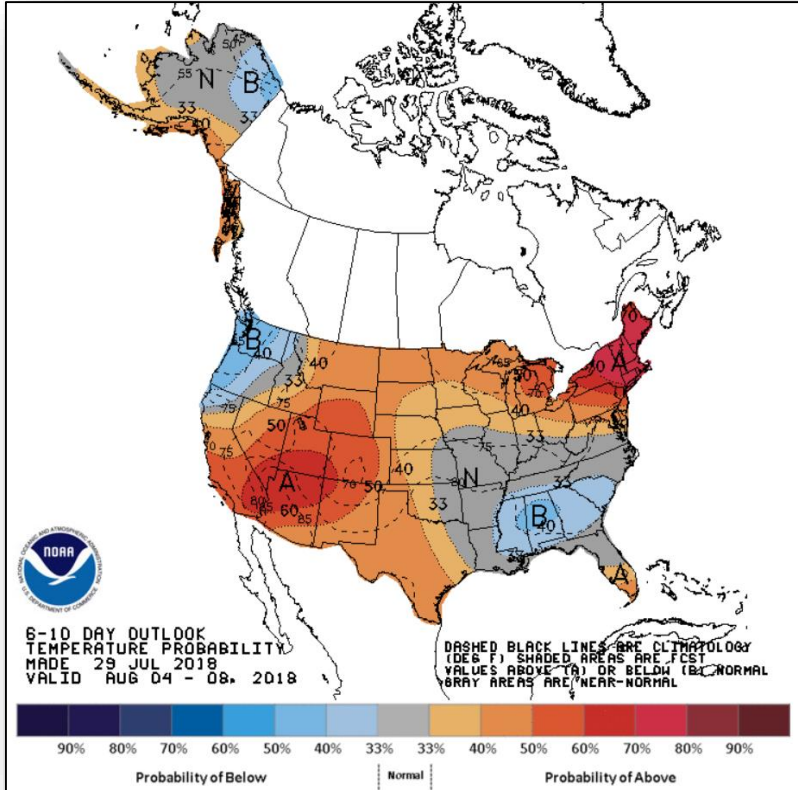

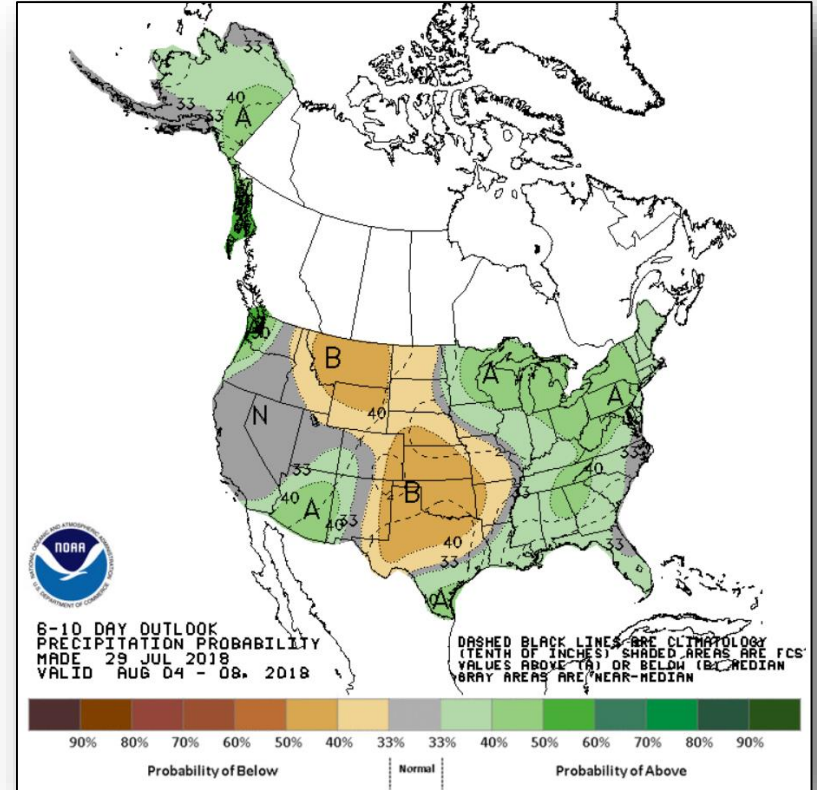
