Significant Activity – Aug 1-2



Significant Events: Wildfires

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic Tropical cyclone activity not expected during next 48 hours
- Eastern Pacific Tropical Storm Hector; Disturbance 1 Low (30%); Disturbance 2 High (80%)
- Central Pacific Tropical cyclone activity not expected during next 48 hours
- Western Pacific No activity affecting U.S. interests

Significant Weather:

- Strong to severe thunderstorms Mid-Atlantic, southern New England, and the Northern Rockies
- Heavy rainfall and flash flooding possible Eastern Gulf Coast to the Northeast
- Elevated/Critical Fire Weather CA, NV, WA, OR, ID, and MT
- Isolated Dry Thunderstorms ID, MT, and WY
- · Red Flag Warnings CA, NV, WA, OR, ID, and MT

Declaration Activity: Major Disaster Declaration request - Iowa

Carr Fire – Shasta County, CA

Current Situation: Acres burned: 121k (+8k); Containment: 35% (+5)

Impacts:

- Structures / Homes:
 - Threatened: 1,624 (-888) homes, 22 multiple residences, 12 commercial
 - Damaged: 255 (+11) structures / 185 (+7) homes
 - Destroyed: 1,546 (+168) structures / 1,058 (+93) homes
- Minimal number of customers without power in Shasta County

Food, Water and Sheltering:


- Shelters / Occupants: 6 (+2) open / 172 (-249) occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Count)
- Evacuations: Mandatory evacuations in effect for about 24k (-10k) people
- Staging Area established at Redding Municipal Airport
 - o ISB Team and Cache deployed
 - $\circ~$ Commodities prepositioned: Cots, blankets, meals, and water

Hazardous Waste:

- Monitoring the Iron Mountain Mine Complex, a Superfund cleanup site, requires constant power to prevent discharge from entering the Sacramento River
- EPA report: Immediate risk to public is low; medium-term risk is low as long as drainage system continues working
- CA confined space firefighting teams working to extinguish a burning pipeline within the Iron Mountain Mine

Health and Medical:

- Fatalities / Injuries: 6 confirmed / 1 (+1)
- · One hospital evacuated; one partially evacuated
- · Eight intermediate care facilities fully evacuated


State / Local Response

- Governor declared a State of Emergency for six counties

FEMA Response

- Emergency Declaration FEMA-3398-EM-CA approved July 28, 2018
- FMAG FEMA-5259-FM-CA approved July 23, 2018
- National Watch Center continues to monitor and report as warranted
- Region IX:
 - o RWC at Steady State, continues to monitor
 - IMAT-2 deployed to CA EOC (supported by ESFs 1, 3, 4, 6, 7, 8, 12, & DCO)
 - $\,\circ\,$ LNOs deployed to CA EOC and Shasta County EOC









Tropical Storm Hector (Advisory #7 as of 2:00 a.m. EDT)


- Located 1,065 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California
- Moving WNW at 12 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 70 mph
- Tropical-storm force winds extend 60 miles
- No threat to the U.S. based on current advisory

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Several hundred miles SSW of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Gradual development possible over the next few days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)


Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Several hundred miles south of the Gulf of Tehuantepec
- Moving WNW off the coast of Mexico
- · Gradual development possible over the weekend
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (80%)



Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific






48 Hour Outlook

5 Day Outlook








Fire Weather Outlook








Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall Forecast



 - Hazard Mitigation statewide




