Significant Events: Tropical Storm Lane, Mendocino Complex Fire

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic – Tropical cyclone activity is not expected next 48 hours
- Eastern Pacific – Tropical Depression Fifteen-E; Disturbance 1: High (90%)
- Central Pacific – Tropical Storm Lane
- Western Pacific – No activity affecting U.S. interests

Significant Weather:

- Severe thunderstorms possible – Northern Plains to Great Lakes
- Flash flooding possible – Northern Plain to Great Lakes
- Elevated/critical fire weather – CA, NV, UT, OR, ID, CO, WY, SD & NE
- Isolated dry thunderstorms – WY & CO
- Red Flag Warnings – CA, NV, UT , WY, SD & NE

Declaration Activity: None

Tropical Storm Lane – Central Pacific

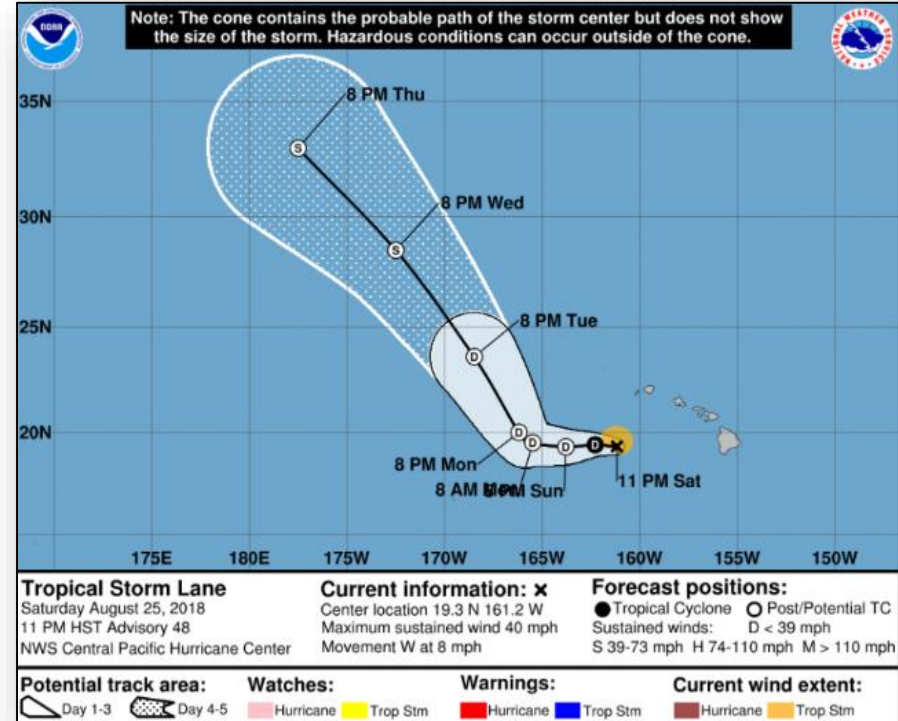


Tropical Storm Lane (Advisory #48 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 255 miles WSW of Honolulu, Hawaii
- Moving W at 8 mph, away from Hawaii
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- Some weakening is forecast during the next 48 hours
- No coastal watches or warnings in effect

Hazards Affecting Land

- Lingering moisture will produce heavy rainfall over portions of the main Hawaiian Islands through today, which could lead to additional flash flooding and landslides
- Flash Flood Watches in effect through Sunday afternoon

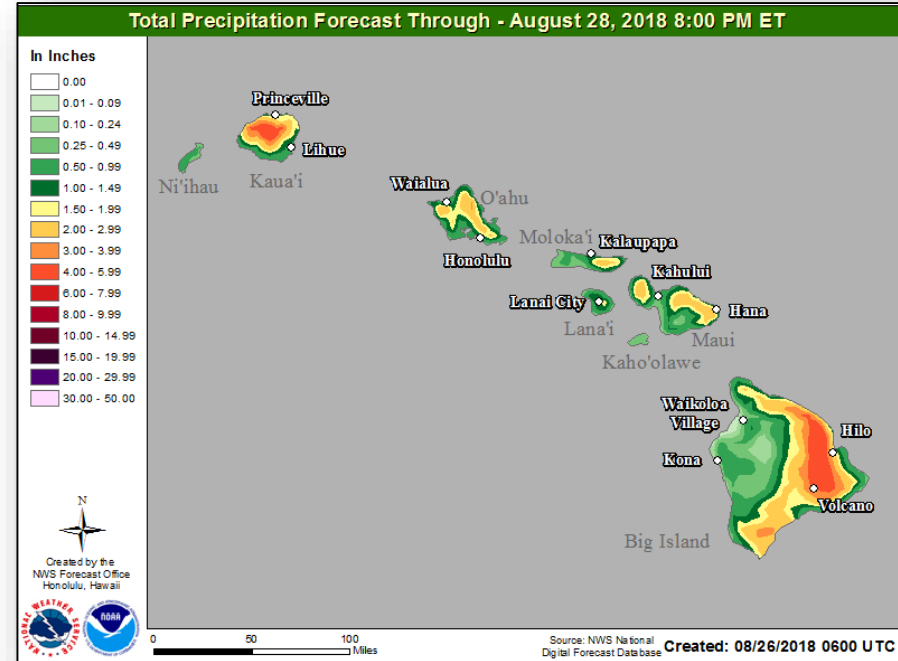
Impacts

- Shelters / Occupants: 3 (-31) / 85 (-1,017) (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 6:45 am EDT August 26)
- Closures
 - State government offices beginning to return to normal operations
 - Federal buildings will re-open on August 27
 - Schools will re-open on August 27 except for 4 Maui schools
- Transportation
 - All state routes in Hawaii County are open; minor road flooding and debris obstructions reported across the state
 - Bus service at limited schedules across all islands, resuming normal operations

Response

State / Local

- HI EOC at **Partial Activation** (Kilauea lava flow and Tropical Storm Lane)
- County EOC Activations
 - Hawaii County – Full Activation
 - City and County of Honolulu (Oahu) – Partial Activation
 - Maui – Normal Operations
 - Kauai County – Monitoring
- Commodities pre-staged across all the islands with sufficient food available

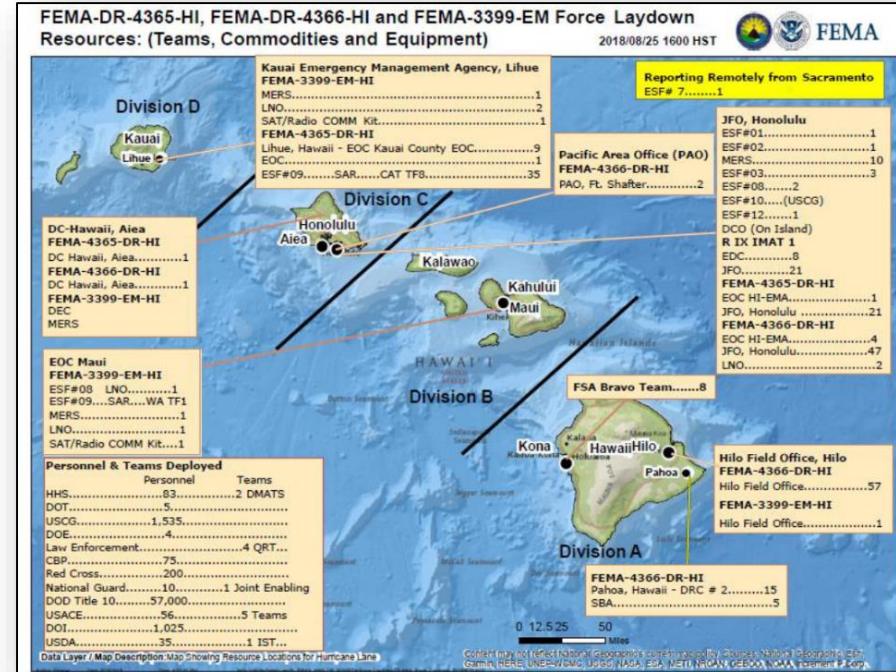

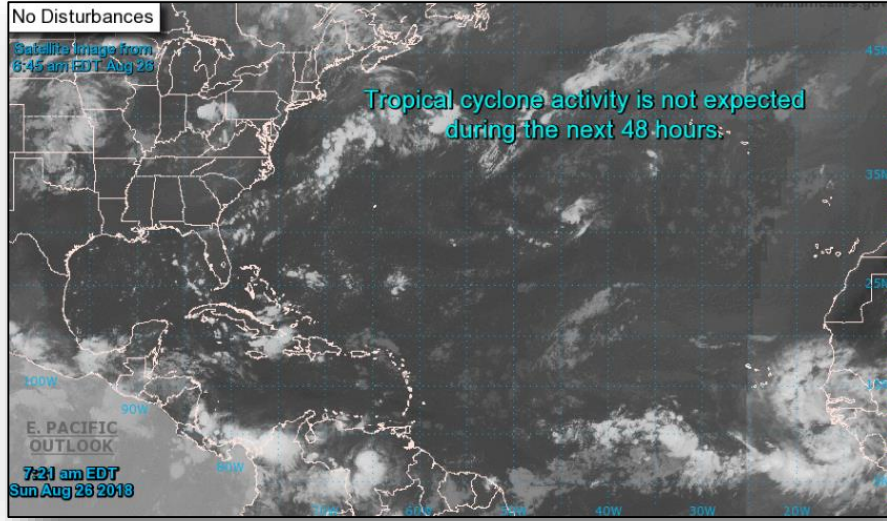
- Federal Search and Rescue Coordination Group deployed to Honolulu

- Six US&R Mission Ready Packages – Water Operations are on Alert

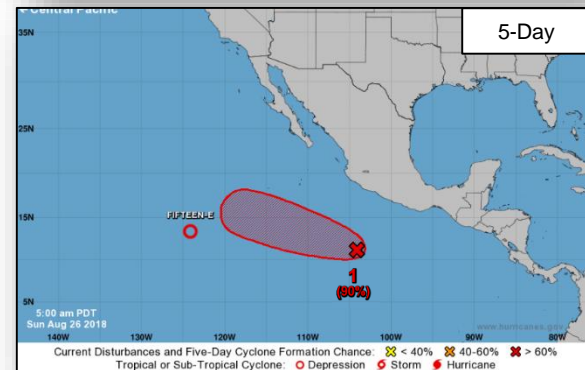
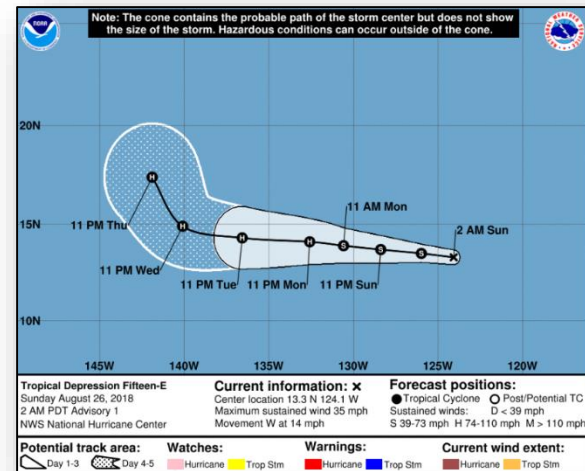


Tropical Depression Fifteen-E (Advisory #1 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

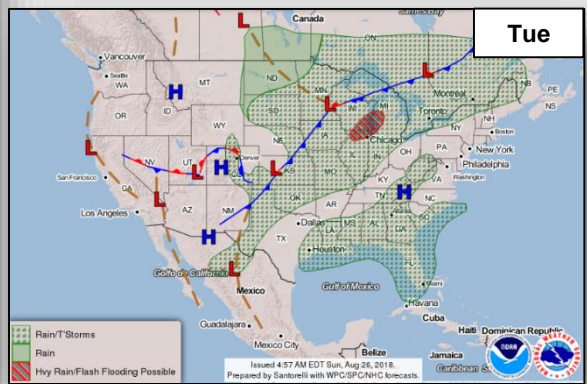
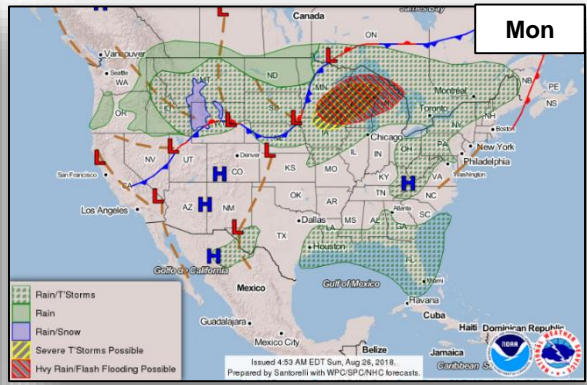
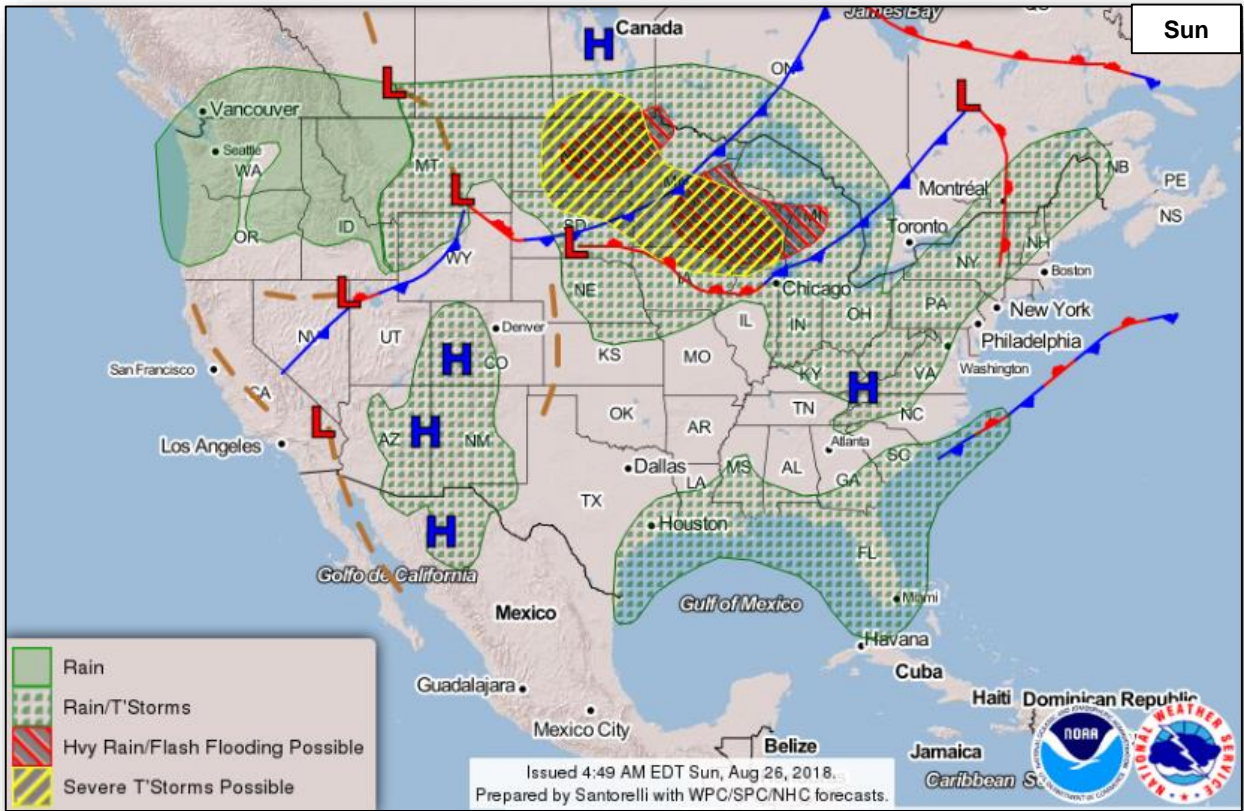
- Located 1,140 miles WSW of southern tip of Baja California peninsula, Mexico
- Moving W at 14 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Strengthening is forecast next 72 hours; expected to become a tropical storm later today and reach hurricane strength by Tuesday

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 500 miles S of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving W to WNW at 10 mph
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (60%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (90%)



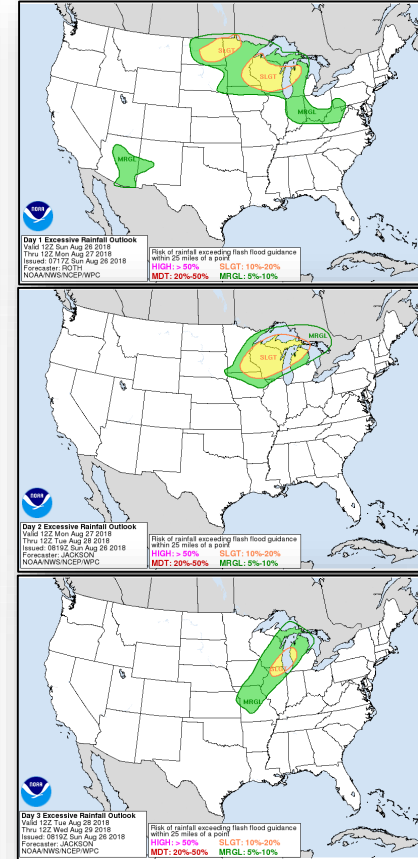
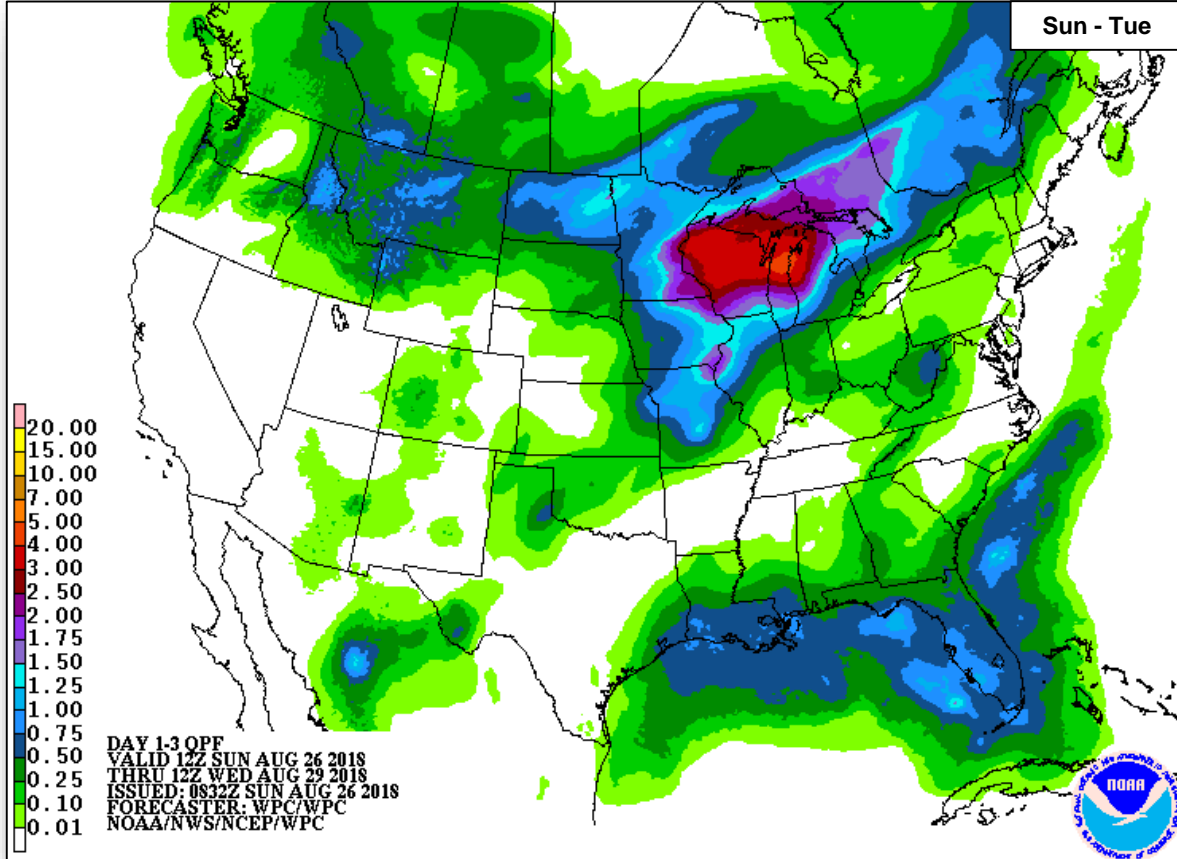
National Weather Forecast



Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall Forecast



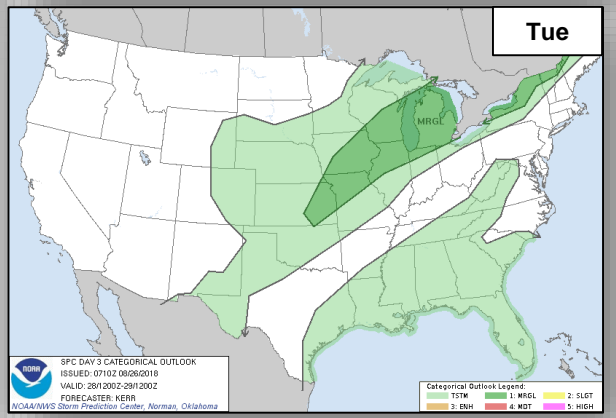
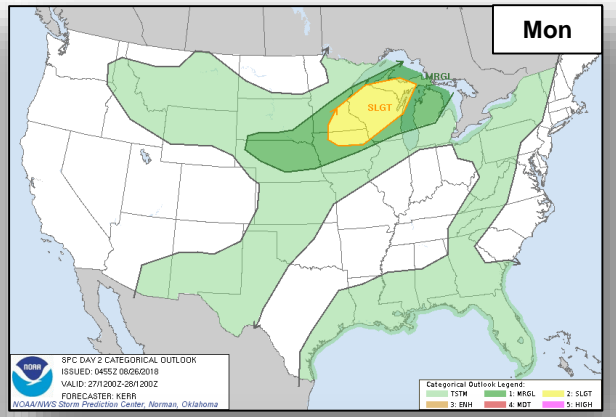
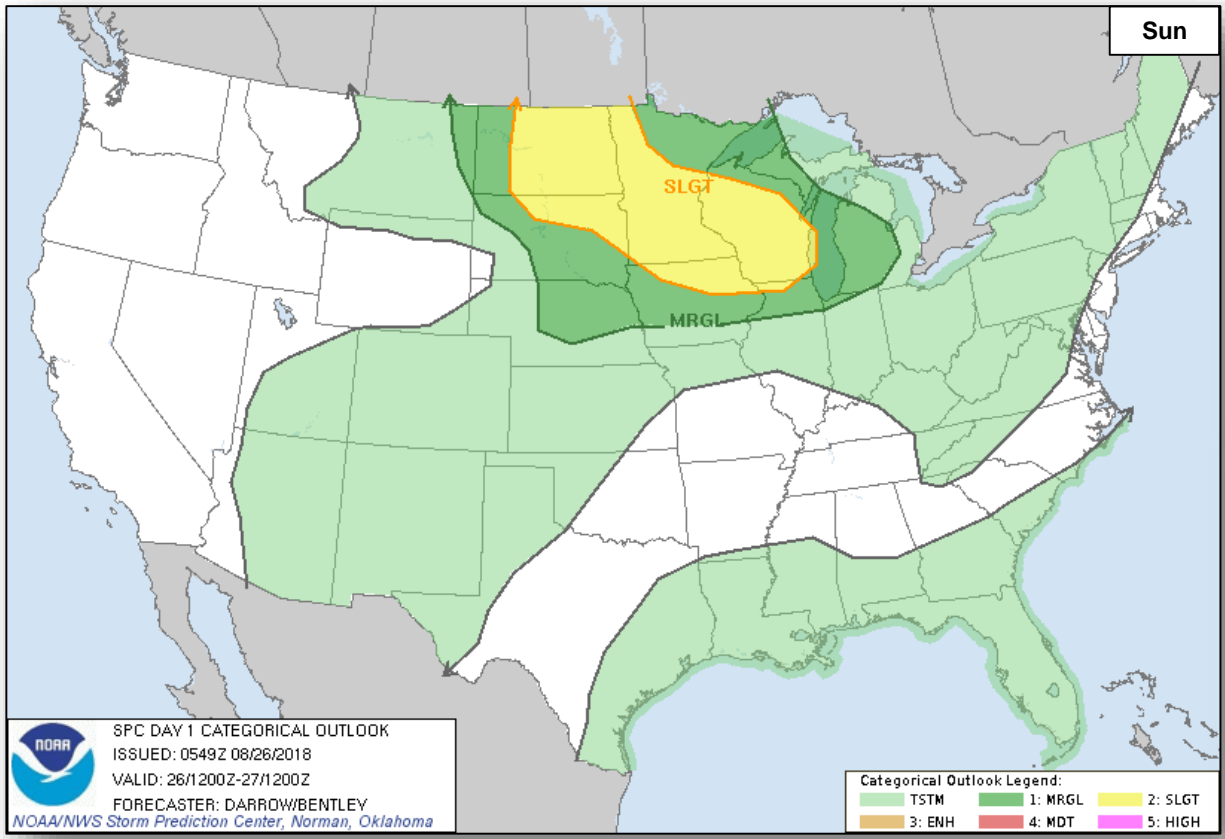

Severe Weather Outlook



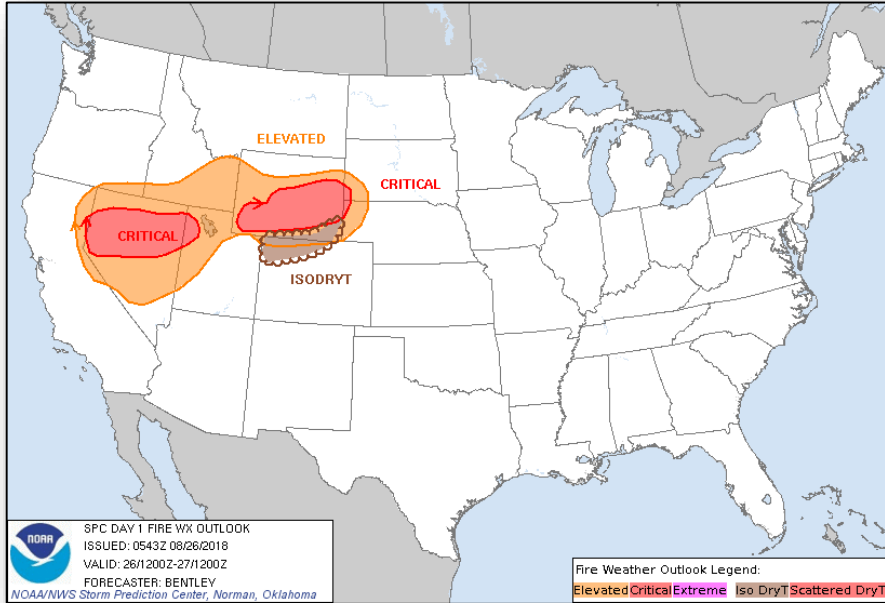

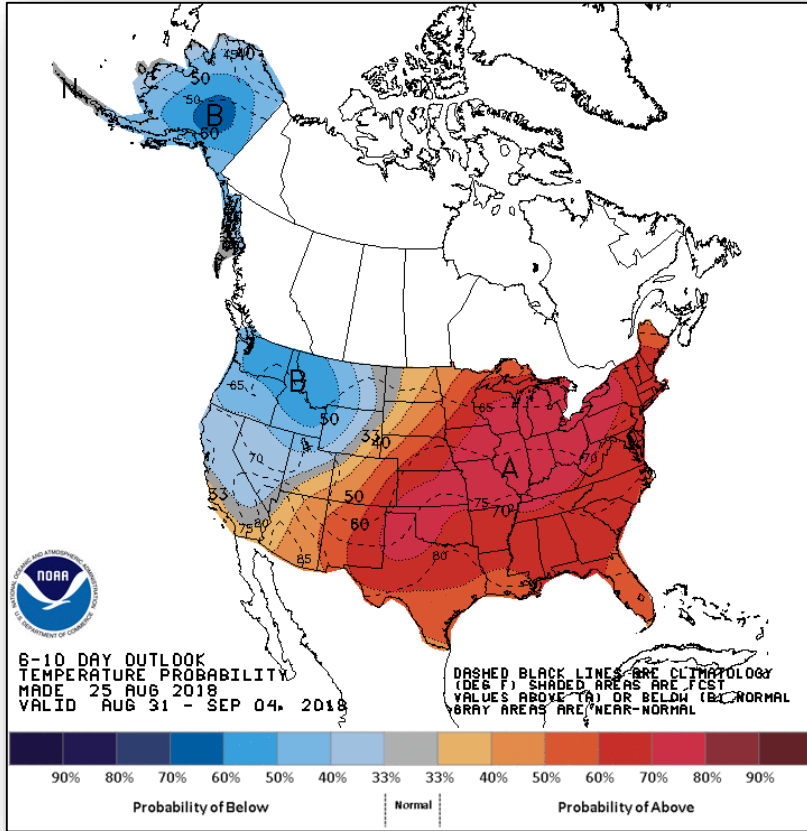

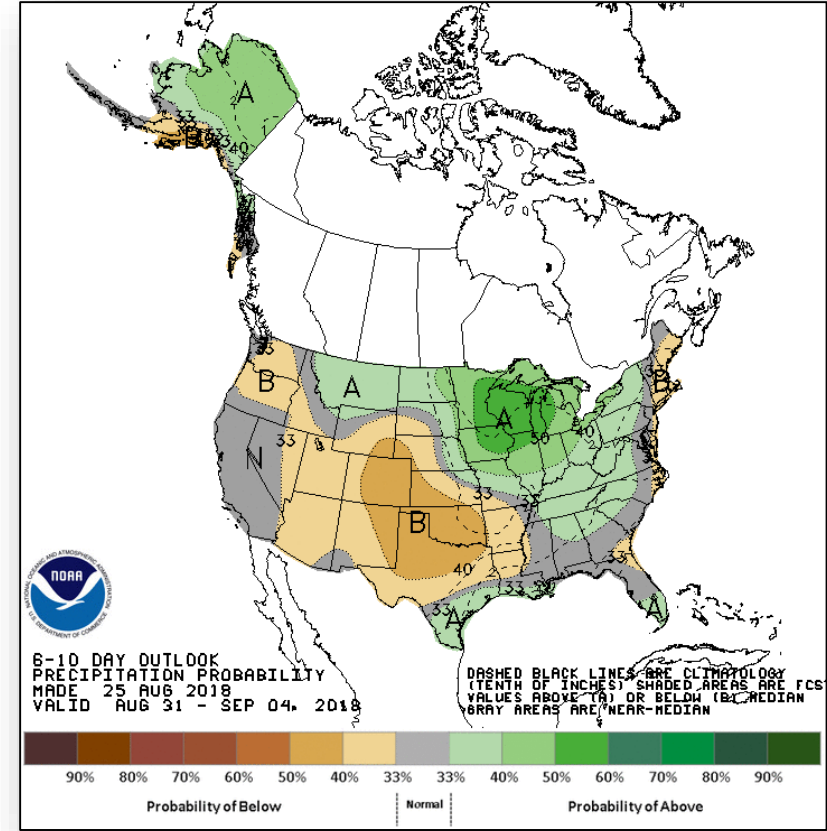

6 - 10 Day Precipitation Probability

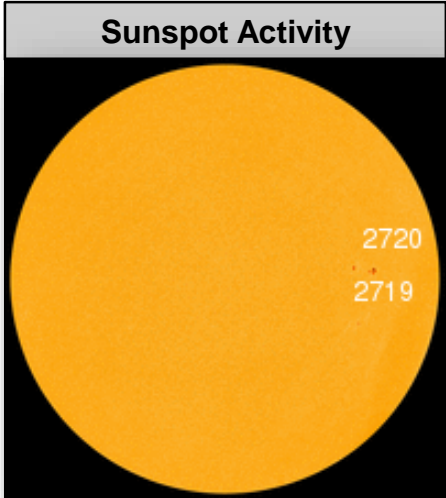
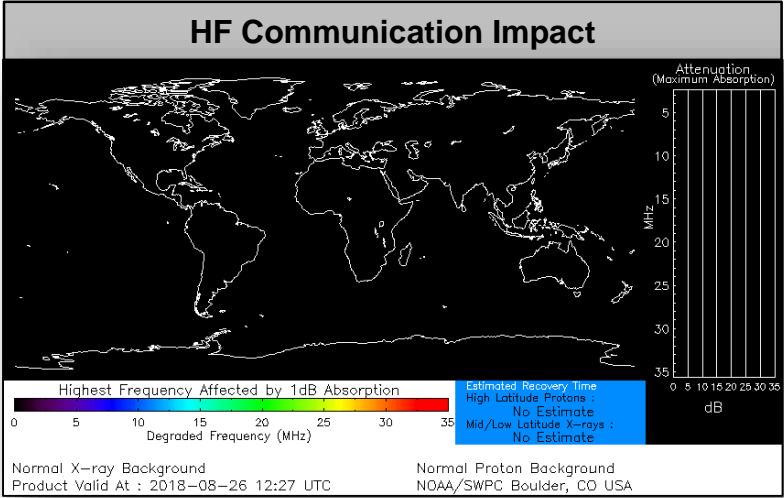
