Monday, August 27, 2018 8:30 a.m. EDT

#### Tropical Depression Lane – FINAL



<u>*Current Situation:*</u> Tropical Depression Lane continues to weaken and move away from the main Hawaiian Islands. Recovery efforts ongoing.

#### Impacts

- Negligible power outages
- Sporadic road closures remain due to flooding, landslides, and debris; airports and ports at normal operations
- · State / Federal offices and local schools expected to return to normal operations today
- Shelters have closed (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 4:48 am EDT August 27)

#### State Response

- HI EOC at Partial Activation
- Hawaii County EOC at Full Activation; City and County of Honolulu EOCs at Partial Activation; Kauai County EOC at Monitoring; Maui County EOC at Normal Operations


#### Federal Response

#### FEMA Region IX

- RWC at Enhanced Watch (24/7)
- IMAT-1 deployed to HI ; LNOs deployed to all county EOCs

#### <u>FEMA HQ</u>

- NWC Enhanced Watch deactivated; returned to Steady State
- Region VII IMAT deployed to Oakland, CA
- Bothell and Denver MERS deployed to Hawaii
- ISBs established in Maui, Kona, and Kauai; ISB Teams Bravo and Charlie will begin demobilizing; Team Alpha remaining in Hawaii
- US&R Federal Search and Rescue Coordination Group, White IST, and 3 Task Forces deployed to Hawaii
- USACE staff and Power Planning and Response Teams deployed to Hawaii




### Tropical Depression Lane – Central Pacific



Tropical Depression Lane (Advisory #52 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 470 miles WSW of Honolulu, Hawaii
- Moving W at 9 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- · Expected to become an post-tropical remnant low today
- Lane may develop into a gale force extratropical low as it passes over portions of the northwestern Hawaiian Islands on Tuesday and Wednesday
- No coastal watches or warnings in effect




### Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

### Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific





Tropical Storm Miriam (Advisory #5 as of 5:00 am. EDT)

- · Located 1,405 miles WSW of southern tip of Baja California
- Moving W at 15 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 60 mph
- Expected to become a hurricane by tonight or early Tuesday
- Tropical storm force winds extend 45 miles

#### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 450 miles SSW of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 10 mph
- · Tropical depression is likely to form within the next day or two
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (80%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (90%)






### Tropical Outlook – Western Pacific




Tropical Depression 25W (Advisory #1as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 475 miles N of Pohnpei, Federated State of Micronesia (FSM)
- Moving NW at 15 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 30 mph
- Forecast to intensify over the next few days, possibly becoming a tropical storm on Tuesday
- · Not an imminent threat to the main Mariana Islands
- Closest Point of Approach (CPA) to Tinian (Commonwealth of Northern Mariana Islands) is 306 miles at 5:00 pm EDT on August 30




#### National Weather Forecast






#### Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall Forecast




